FirstLight: Notice of Pending Jurisdictional Inquiry, and Soliciting Comments, Protests, and Motions To Intervene

On April 4, 2025, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Commission) received a request from the U.S. Department of the Interior (Interior) for an updated jurisdictional determination for the unlicensed Tunnel Hydroelectric Project. The project is located on the Quinebaug River in New London County, Connecticut.

Pursuant to section 23(b)(1) of the Federal Power Act (FPA),¹ a non-federal hydroelectric project must be licensed if it: (a) is located on a navigable water of the United States; (b) occupies lands or reservations of the United States; (c) utilizes surplus water or waterpower from a government dam;² or (d) is located on a stream over which Congress has Commerce Clause jurisdiction, is constructed or modified on or after August 26, 1935, and affects the interests of interstate or foreign commerce.

A stream is navigable under section 3(8) of the FPA³ if: (1) it is currently
