Yuba County Water Agency; Notice of Revised Procedural Schedule for Environmental Assessment for the Proposed Project Relicense

On November 14, 2023, Yuba County Water Agency (YCWA) filed an application to relicense the 12-megawatt Narrows Hydroelectric Project (Narrows Project) No. 1403. The project is located on the Yuba River, near the City of Marysville, in Nevada County, California. On May 12, 2025, Commission staff issued a notice of intent to prepare an environmental assessment (EA) to evaluate the effects of relicensing the Narrows Project. The notice included an anticipated schedule for issuing the EA in November 2025.

Staff are still evaluating the effects of relicensing the Narrows Project. In order for staff to fully consider all the information filed by YCWA, the procedural schedule for completing the EA is being revised as follows. Further revisions to the schedule may be made as appropriate.

Columbia Gulf Transmission, LLC; Notice of Application and Establishing Intervention Deadline

Take notice that on November 17, 2025, Columbia Gulf Transmission, LLC (Columbia Gulf), 700 Louisiana Street, Suite 1300, Houston, Texas 77002–2700, filed an application under section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA) and Part

157 of the Commission’s regulations requesting authorization for its Maysville Project (Project). The Project consists of the construction of approximately 42 miles of 30-inch-diameter pipeline, one new delivery point, and associated facilities, all located in Rowan, Fleming, and Mason Counties, Kentucky. The Project will provide up to 340,000 dekatherms per day of firm transportation capacity to East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. Columbia Gulf estimates the total cost of the Project to be \$402 million and proposes a monthly initial incremental recourse rate for firm transportation

service; all as more fully set forth in the application which is on file with the Commission and open for public inspection.

Pursuant to section 157.9 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure,¹ within 90 days of this Notice the Commission staff will either: complete its environmental review and place it into the Commission's public record (eLibrary) for this proceeding; or issue a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review. If a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review is issued, it will indicate, among other milestones, the anticipated date for the Commission staff's issuance of the final environmental impact statement (FEIS) or environmental assessment (EA) for this proposal. The filing of an EA in the Commission's public record for this proceeding or the issuance of a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review will serve to notify federal and state agencies of the timing for the completion of all necessary reviews, and the subsequent need to complete all federal authorizations within 90 days of the date of issuance of the Commission staff's FEIS or EA.

Water Quality Certification

Columbia Gulf stated that a water quality certificate under section 401 of the Clean Water Act is required for the project from Kentucky Energy and Environment Cabinet Department of Environmental Protection. When available, Columbia Gulf should submit to the Commission a copy of the request for certification for the Commission authorization, including the date the request was submitted to the certifying agency, and either (1) a copy of the certifying agency's decision or (2) evidence of waiver of water quality certification.

Public Participation

There are three ways to become involved in the Commission's review of this project: you can file comments on the project, you can protest the filing, and you can file a motion to intervene in the proceeding. There is no fee or cost for filing comments or intervening. The deadline for filing a motion to intervene is 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on December 17, 2025. How to file protests, motions to intervene, and comments is explained below.

Comments

Any person wishing to comment on the project may do so. Comments may include statements of support or objections, to the project as a whole or specific aspects of the project. The more specific your comments, the more useful they will be.

Protests

Pursuant to sections 157.10(a)(4)² and 385.211³ of the Commission's regulations under the NGA, any person⁴ may file a protest to the application. Protests must comply with the requirements specified in section 385.2001⁵ of the Commission's regulations. A protest may also serve as a motion to intervene so long as the protestor states it also seeks to be an intervenor.

To ensure that your comments or protests are timely and properly recorded, please submit your comments on or before 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on December 17, 2025.

Persons who comment on the environmental review of this project will be placed on the Commission's environmental mailing list, and will receive notification when the environmental documents (EA or EIS) are issued for this project and will be notified of meetings associated with the Commission's environmental review process.

The Commission considers all comments received about the project in determining the appropriate action to be taken. However, the filing of a comment alone will not serve to make the filer a party to the proceeding. To become a party, you must intervene in the proceeding. For instructions on how to intervene, see below.

Interventions

Any person, which includes individuals, organizations, businesses,

municipalities, and other entities,⁶ has the option to file a motion to intervene in this proceeding. Only intervenors have the right to request rehearing of Commission orders issued in this proceeding and to subsequently challenge the Commission's orders in the U.S. Circuit Courts of Appeal.

To intervene, you must submit a motion to intervene to the Commission in accordance with Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure⁷ and the regulations under the NGA⁸ by the intervention deadline for the project, which is 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on December 17, 2025. As described further in Rule 214, your motion to intervene must state, to the extent known, your position regarding the proceeding, as well as your interest in the proceeding. For an individual, this could include your status as a landowner, ratepayer, resident of an impacted community, or recreationist. You do not need to have property directly impacted by the project in order to intervene. All timely, unopposed⁹ motions to intervene are automatically granted by operation of Rule 214(c)(1).¹⁰ Motions to intervene that are filed after the intervention deadline are untimely, and may be denied. Any late-filed motion to intervene must show good cause for being late and must explain why the time limitation should be waived and provide justification by reference to factors set forth in Rule 214(d) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.¹¹ A person obtaining party status will be placed on the service list maintained by the Secretary of the Commission and will receive copies (paper or electronic) of all documents filed by the applicant and by all other parties.
