The information collection notice was previously published in the **Federal Register** on September 8, 2025, at 90 FR 43225, allowing for a 60-day public comment period. USCIS received one comment in connection with the 60-day notice.

Overview of This Information Collection

(1) *Type of Information Collection Request:* Extension, Without Change, of a Currently Approved Collection.

(2) *Title of the Form/Collection:* Application for T Nonimmigrant Status.

(3) *Agency form number, if any, and the applicable component of the DHS sponsoring the collection:* I–914; USCIS.

(4) *Affected public who will be asked or required to respond, as well as a brief abstract:* Primary: Individuals or households. Form I–914 is used by victims of a severe form of trafficking in persons and certain eligible family members to request and demonstrate that they qualify for temporary immigration benefits.

(5) *An estimate of the total number of respondents and the amount of time estimated for an average respondent to respond:* The estimated total number of annual respondents for the information collection I–914 is 1,310 and the estimated hour burden per response is 2.63 hours; the estimated total number of annual respondents for the information collection I–914A is 1,120 and the estimated hour burden per response is 1.083 hours; the estimated total number of annual respondents for the information collection I–914B is 918 and the estimated hour burden per response is 1.915 hours; and the estimated total number of respondents for the information collection of biometrics is 2,430 and the estimated hour burden per response is 1.17 hours.

(6) *An estimate of the total public burden (in hours) associated with the collection:* The estimated total annual hour burden associated with this collection is 9,259 hours.

(7) *An estimate of the total public burden (in cost) associated with the collection:* The estimated total annual cost burden associated with this collection of information is \$2,532,300.
