

voucher form is used to disburse education award funds from the Trust, the forbearance request form allows a member to obtain forbearance on their loan while they are serving in an AmeriCorps program, and the interest form allows AmeriCorps to pay the interest accrued during a member's national service if their loans were in forbearance during that time.

- *Comment:* Integrate MyAmeriCorps with the Federal Student Aid (FSA) and NSLDS. *Response:* AmeriCorps already uses the current information collection to facilitate payments to the FSA network. The NSLDS does not contain information AmeriCorps needs on state-issued student loans.

- *Comment:* The forms handle personal financial information and AmeriCorps has not disclosed the security architecture for handling this data. *Response:* The information collection is covered by the System of Records Notice CNCS-04-CPO-MMF-Member Management Files (MMF) at 85 FR 3896.

- *Comment:* Small businesses employers that hire AmeriCorps alumni face indirect impacts, in that delays in obtaining [members'] education awards affects [employers'] ability to reduce employer tuition assistance obligations. *Response:* AmeriCorps has not identified any correlation between small business employers that hire AmeriCorps alumni and this information collection, nor with the subset of employers that offer tuition assistance.

- *Comment:* Both individuals and loan servicers must maintain records under this information collection. *Response:* The records are maintained in the MyAmeriCorps portal.

The remaining comments were substantively redundant or beyond the scope of this information collection.

Form is used to repay qualified student loans and to pay for the cost of attending eligible post-secondary educational institutions and approved School-to-Work programs. Prior to making the payments, AmeriCorps will review information from the forms and compare it to information taken from the AmeriCorps members' education award account(s) to ensure that the payments meet the requirements of the law. This information collection is not required to be considered for obtaining grant funding support. The currently approved information collection is due to expire on March 31, 2026.

2. *Title of Collection:* Forbearance Request of National Service Form.

Type of Review: Renewal.

Respondents/Affected Public:

Individuals (AmeriCorps members and alumni who wish to request forbearance on qualified student loans) and businesses (qualified student loan servicers).

Abstract: The National Service Trust AmeriCorps Forbearance Request for National Service Form is used to certify that AmeriCorps members are eligible for forbearance based on their enrollment in a national service position. AmeriCorps members use the form, or its electronic equivalent, to request forbearance for their loan. This information collection is not required to be considered for obtaining grant funding support. The currently approved information collection is due to expire on March 31, 2026.

3. *Title of Collection:* Interest Accrual Form.

Type of Review: Renewal.

Respondents/Affected Public:

Individuals (AmeriCorps members and alumni who wish to request forbearance on qualified student loans) and businesses (qualified student loan servicers).

Total Estimated Number of Annual Responses: 320.

Abstract: The National Service Trust Interest Payment Form is used by AmeriCorps members to request payment of accrued interest on qualified student loans and to authorize the

release of loan information to the National Service Trust. Schools and lenders verify eligibility for the payments and both parties verify certain legal requirements. AmeriCorps uses the information from the form to ensure that the accrued interest payment is allowable under law. AmeriCorps seeks to renew the currently approved information collection, which is due to expire on March 31, 2026.

AmeriCorps seeks to renew these current information collections, which will be used in the same manner as the existing approved information collections. AmeriCorps also seeks to continue using the current information collections until the renewals are approved by OMB.

Type of Request: Extension of a currently approved collection.

Needs and Uses: DFARS subparts 227.71 and 227.72 prescribe the use of solicitation provisions and contract clauses containing information collection requirements that are associated with rights in technical data and computer software. DoD needs this information to implement 10 U.S.C. 3771-3775, Rights in technical data, and 10 U.S.C. 3781-3786, Validation of proprietary data restrictions. DoD uses the information to recognize and protect contractor rights in technical data and computer software that are associated with privately funded developments; and to ensure that technical data delivered under a contract are complete and accurate and satisfy contract requirements. DoD has revised the estimated burden due to use of more current data and correction of mathematical errors.

DoD uses the following DFARS provisions and clauses in solicitations and contracts to require offerors and contractors to identify and mark data or software requiring protection from unauthorized use, release, or disclosure in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 3771-3775:

252.227-7013, Rights in Technical Data—Other Than Commercial Products and Commercial Services.

252.227-7014, Rights in Other Than Commercial Computer Software and Other Than Commercial Computer Software Documentation.

252.227-7017, Identification and Assertion of Use, Release, or Disclosure Restrictions.

252.227-7018, Rights in Other Than Commercial Technical Data and Computer Software—Small Business Innovation Research Program and Small Business Technology Transfer Program.

In accordance with 10 U.S.C. 3771(b)(4), DoD may disclose limited rights data to persons outside the Government, or allow those persons to use data with use, release, or disclosure restrictions, if the recipient agrees not to further release, disclose, or use the data. Therefore, the clause at DFARS 252.227-7013, Rights in Technical Data—Other Than Commercial Products and Commercial Services, requires the contractor to identify and mark data or software that it provides with limited rights.

In accordance with 10 U.S.C. 3781(b), contractors and subcontractors at any tier must be prepared to furnish written justification for any asserted restriction on the Government's rights to use or release data. The following DFARS clauses require contractors and subcontractors to maintain adequate records and procedures to justify any asserted restrictions:

252.227-7019, Validation of Asserted Restrictions—Computer Software.

252.227-7037, Validation of Asserted Restrictions on Technical Data.

In accordance with 10 U.S.C. 3771(b)(2), DoD must protect the rights of contractors that have developed items, components, or processes exclusively at private expense. Therefore, the clause at DFARS

252.227-7025, Limitations on the Use or Disclosure of Government-Furnished Information Marked with Restrictive Legends, requires a contractor or subcontractor to submit a use and nondisclosure agreement when it obtains data from the Government to which the Government has less than unlimited rights. In addition, DFARS 227.7103-7, Use and nondisclosure agreement, requires intended recipients of technical data or computer software delivered to the Government with restrictions on use, modification, reproduction, release, performance, display, or disclosure, to sign the use and nondisclosure agreement at 227.7103-7(c) prior to release or disclosure of the data, unless the recipient is a Government contractor that requires access to a third party's data or software for the performance of a Government contract that contains the clause at 252.227-7025, Limitations on Use or Disclosure of Government-Furnished Information Marked with Restrictive Legends. According to 10

U.S.C. 3771(b)(4), DoD may disclose limited rights data to persons outside the Government, or allow those persons to use limited rights data, if the recipient agrees not to further use, release, or disclose the data.

The provision at DFARS 252.227-7028, Technical Data or Computer Software Previously Delivered to the Government, requires an offeror to identify any technical data or computer software that it previously delivered, or will deliver, under any Government contract. DoD needs this information to avoid paying for rights in technical data or computer software that the Government already owns.
