SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Under part 211 of title 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), this document provides the public notice that by letter received December 22, 2026, IS Tech petitioned FRA for special approval of an alternative standard for certain provisions of the Federal railroad safety regulations contained at 49 CFR part 238 (Passenger Equipment Safety Standards). FRA assigned the petition Docket Number FRA-2025-1149.

Specifically, IS Tech seeks special approval to use an automatic signal car testing device (ASCTD) in lieu of a manual single car testing device (MSCTD) as an alternate standard for compliance with § 238.311, *Single car test*. Further, IS Tech proposes an annual calibration of the ASCTD instead of calibration every 92 days of the MSCTD.

In its petition, IS Tech states that ASCTDs have been used for “several years as a faster and more accurate alternative” to MSCTDs. IS Tech explains that the subject device has additional hardware, functionalities, and programming for testing of passenger cars but is based on the AAR S-4027 specification for testing of freight cars.

Interested parties are invited to participate in these proceedings by submitting written views, data, or comments. FRA does not anticipate scheduling a public hearing in connection with these proceedings since the facts do not appear to warrant a hearing. If any interested party desires an opportunity for oral comment and a public hearing, they should notify FRA, in writing, before the end of the

comment period and specify the basis for their request.

Communications received by April 30, 2026 will be considered by FRA before final action is taken. Comments received after that date will be considered if practicable.

1. *Title:* Quarterly Dealer Agenda Survey.

Type of Request: Extension without change of a currently approved collection.

Description: The Department of Treasury (Treasury), Office of Debt Management (ODM) conducts the Primary Dealer Meeting Agenda (Agenda), which is a quarterly survey sent to all primary dealers, of which there are currently 23 financial institutions. Primary dealers are trading counter parties of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York (FRBNY) in its implementation of monetary policy. Primary dealers are also expected to have a substantial presence as a market maker for Treasury securities and bid on a pro-rata basis in all Treasury auctions.

The information in the Agenda is a critical factor to inform ODM’s decision to set the securities’ issuance sizes for the upcoming quarter. In effect, the information provides a market view of borrowing needs for the U.S. government. In addition, aggregate statistics are made public through Treasury’s Quarterly Refunding materials.

2. *Title:* Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERA2).

OMB Control Number: 1505-0270.

Type of Request: Extension without change of a currently approved collection.

Description: On March 11, 2021, the President signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (the “Act”), Pub. L.

117–2. Title III, Subtitle B, Section 3201 of the Act provides \$21.55 billion for the U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury) to make payments to States (defined to include the District of Columbia), U.S. Territories (Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, and American Samoa), and certain local governments with more than 200,000 residents (collectively the “eligible grantees”) to provide financial assistance and housing stability services to eligible households, and cover the costs for other affordable rental housing and eviction prevention activities for eligible households. ERA2 grantees are required to submit reports on their utilization of ERA2 award funds electronically via Treasury’s Portal. These information collections permit Treasury to effectively monitor the ERA2 grantees’ compliance with the requirements of the ERA2 award terms. The ERA2 Final Quarterly Reports were due to be submitted by all grantees no later than January 28, 2026. After the official submissions of the ERA2 Final Quarterly Reports, Treasury and others will use the information collection forms for on-going compliance monitoring purposes, such as case-by-case reviews and follow-up with individual grantees, and for standard recordkeeping.

Description: Forms CQ–1 and CQ–2 are part of the Treasury International Capital (TIC) reporting system, which is required by law (22 U.S.C. 286f; 22

U.S.C. 3103; E.O. 10033; 31 CFR 128), and is designed to collect timely information on international portfolio capital movements. Forms CQ–1 and CQ–2 are quarterly reports filed by non-financial enterprises in the U.S. to report their international portfolio transactions with unaffiliated foreign residents. This information is used by the U.S. Government in the formulation of international financial and monetary policies and for the preparation of the U.S. balance of payments accounts and the U.S. international investment position.
