Needs and Uses: The United States Military Academy (USMA) is collecting this information to guide qualified candidates through its admissions process and to select the annual incoming class of cadets. This collection is required to determine which candidates will be admitted and is authorized by Title 10, United States Code, Section 4346, which outlines admission requirements, and Army Regulation 210-26.

The information is used by the USMA Department of Admissions to holistically evaluate candidates in a multi-phase process. In the Pre-Candidate phase, an initial Candidate Questionnaire is used to determine if an applicant meets the minimum qualifications. Competitive applicants move to the Candidate phase, where they complete a Candidate Kit, providing comprehensive data including academic records, evaluations, and essays. Finally, accepted candidates submit additional information to facilitate their transition into the Corps of Cadets, covering everything from medical forms to uniform measurements.

The respondents are prospective students applying for admission to West Point. Without this information collection, the USMA Admissions Committee would be unable to effectively evaluate candidates' qualifications, character, and leadership potential, thus hindering its ability to select the most qualified individuals to become commissioned leaders of character.

Needs and Uses: Information must be collected to process and settle claims for personal property that is lost, damaged, or destroyed incident to government service. This collection is necessary to comply with the Military Personnel and Civilian Employees Claims Act (31 United States Code, section 3721), which authorizes payment for loss or damage of personal property incident to service.

The information is collected using DD Form 1842 and DD Form 1844 and is used by Military Claims Office personnel across the Services to adjudicate claims. The data allows

claims examiners to verify claimant eligibility, assess the value of the lost or damaged property, and determine the appropriate reimbursement. The collection is primarily done through service-specific websites, though paper forms are also available.

The respondents are military and civilian personnel, their family members, or their next of kin who have suffered a property loss during official travel or other circumstances related to their service. Without this information collection, the Services would be unable to process claims and reimburse personnel for their property losses as required by law. Respondents are retired/former military, retired/former Federal (GS/NAF) employees, U.S. military Academy students, ROTC Cadets, family members with Power of Attorney, and Next of Kin.
