Brief Description of Amendment	The amendment is an emergency, one-time change to the surveillance requirement (SR) associated with Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station, Unit 2, Technical Specification (TS) 3.6.1.3, “Primary Containment Isolation Valves (PCIVs).” Specifically, it adds a note to TS SR 3.6.1.3.12 to allow a one-time increase in the maximum allowable leakage rate for one main steam isolation valve. The note also establishes the maximum total allowable leakage rate for all four main steam lines. This one-time change would apply only during operating cycle 21 (Cycle 21).

I. Introduction
