**Foreign-Trade Zone (FTZ) 21
Notification of Proposed Production
Activity; Patheon API, Inc.;
(Meloxicam, Xeloda, and Tamiflu);
Florence, South Carolina**

Patheon API, Inc. submitted a notification of proposed production activity to the FTZ Board (the Board) for its facility in Florence, South Carolina within Subzone 21J. The notification conforming to the requirements of the Board's regulations (15 CFR 400.22) was received on April 15, 2026.

Pursuant to 15 CFR 400.14(b), FTZ production activity would be limited to the specific foreign-status material(s)/ component(s) and specific finished product(s) described in the submitted notification (summarized below) and subsequently authorized by the Board. The benefits that may stem from conducting production activity under FTZ procedures are explained in the background section of the Board's website—accessible via www.trade.gov/ftz. The proposed finished products and materials/components would be added to the production authority that the Board previously approved for the operation, as reflected on the Board's website.

The proposed finished products include: Osetamivir Phosphate Shikimic Acid; Capecitabine; and Meloxicam Spray Dried Intermediate (duty free).

The proposed foreign-status materials/components include: Eecetamidoazide Shikimic Acid; Aromatic crystalline acetylfuranoside; Non-aromatic crystalline acetylfuranoside; Sulphobutyl-ether-b cyclodextrin; Flucytosine; and Meloxicam (duty free).

The request indicates that certain materials/components are subject to duties under section 122 of the Trade Act of 1974 (Section 122) or section 301 of the Trade Act of 1974 (section 301), depending on the country of origin. The applicable section 122 and section 301 decisions require subject merchandise to be admitted to FTZs in privileged foreign status (19 CFR 146.41).

Public comment is invited from interested parties. Submissions shall be addressed to the Board's Executive Secretary and sent to: ftz@trade.gov. The closing period for their receipt is June 22, 2026.

**Certain Aluminum Foil From the
Sultanate of Oman: Preliminary
Results of Countervailing Duty
Administrative Review; 2023**

AGENCY: Enforcement and Compliance, International Trade Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce.

SUMMARY: The U.S. Department of Commerce (Commerce) preliminarily determines that countervailable subsidies were provided to Oman Aluminium Rolling Company SPC (OARC), a producer and exporter of certain aluminum foil (aluminum foil) from the Sultanate of Oman (Oman). The period of review (POR) is January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023. Interested parties are invited to comment on these preliminary results.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

Background

On December 18, 2024, based on timely requests for review, in accordance with 19 CFR 351.221(c)(1)(i), we initiated an administrative review of the countervailing duty order on aluminum foil from Oman covering OARC.¹

On December 9, 2024, Commerce tolled the deadline to issue the preliminary results in administrative reviews for which the opportunity to request the review was published in November or December 2024, by 90 days.² The opportunity notice to request

this administrative review was published on November 1, 2024.³ On September 2, 2025, Commerce extended the deadline for issuance of the preliminary results of this review.⁴ Due to the lapse in appropriations and Federal Government shutdown, on November 14, 2025, Commerce tolled all deadlines in administrative proceedings by 47 days,⁵ and, due to a backlog of documents that were electronically filed via Enforcement and Compliance's Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Centralized Electronic Service System (ACCESS) during the Federal Government shutdown, on November 24, 2025, Commerce tolled all deadlines in administrative proceedings by an additional 21 days.⁶ Accordingly, the deadline for these preliminary results is now May 7, 2026.

Scope of the Order

The product covered by the *Order* is aluminum foil from Oman. For a complete description of the scope of the *Order*, see the Preliminary Decision Memorandum.

Methodology

Commerce is conducting this administrative review in accordance with section 751(a)(1)(A) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (the Act). For each of the subsidy programs found countervailable, Commerce
