Abstract: FSA administers the Certified Mediation Program (Program) according to Subtitles A and B of the Title V of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1987 (7 U.S.C. 5106). To effectively administer the Program, FSA requires an application for recertification, which includes submission of a letter from the State, a letter from the grantee, SF-424, SF-424A, SF-424B, and SF-425. Approved grantees provide a mid-year report as well as an annual report that includes information on mediation services provided during the preceding Federal fiscal year, assessment of the performance and effectiveness of the State's Program, and any other matters related to the Program as the State elects to include. In addition, approved grantees complete SF-270 to request either advance funding or reimbursement of expenses already paid. The information requested is necessary for FSA to determine the grantee's eligibility and administer the Program effectively.

The burden hours increased due to the number of States participating went from 42 to 44 participating States. The additional burden hours also include States taking more time to complete forms with more efficiency.

For the following estimated total annual burden on respondents, the formula used to calculate the total burden hours is the estimated average time per response multiplied by the estimated total annual responses:

Estimate of Average Time to Respond: Public reporting burden for collecting information under this notice is estimated to average 2.42 hours per response, including the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collections of information.

Type of Respondents: State and county governments, non-profits, private institutions of Higher Education, and Public/State Institutions of Higher Education.

Estimated Number of Respondents: 44.

Estimated Number of Responses per Respondent: 12.

Estimated Total Annual Responses: 528.

Estimated Total Annual Burden on Respondents: 1,276 hours.

The purpose of this notice is to request comments from the public (as well as affected agencies) concerning the information collection request. The comments will help us:

(1) Evaluate whether the proposed collection of information necessary for the proper performance of the functions of the agency, including whether the information will have practical utility.

(2) Evaluate the accuracy of the agency's estimate of burden of the collection of information including the validity of the methodology and assumptions used;

(3) Evaluate the quality, utility and clarity of the information technology; and

(4) Minimize the burden of information collection on those who respond through the use of appropriate automated, electronic, mechanical, or other technological collection techniques or other forms of information technology.

All comments received in response to this notice, including names and addresses where provided, will be made as a matter of public record. Comments will be summarized and included in the submission for Office of Management and Budget approval.
