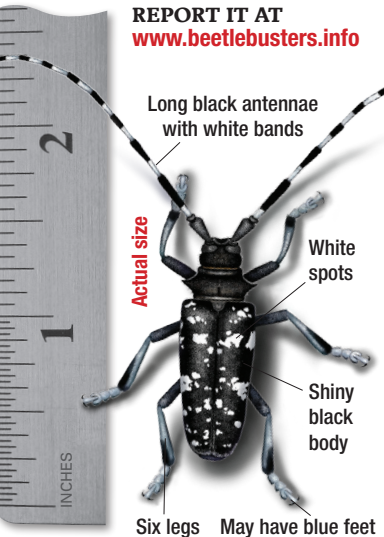


# SEARCH FOR THE ASIAN LONGHORNED BEETLE (also known as ALB)

**Round exit holes**



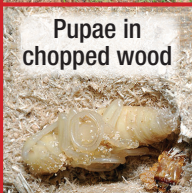
**Egg sites
