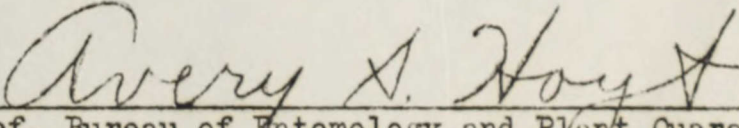
NEW ZEALAND

Import Permit Requirement Waived
for Certain Items

According to the Plant Protection Bulletin of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations for February 1953, Notice No. Ag. 5320 issued by the Acting Director of the Horticulture Division on September 12, 1952, published in Gazette No. 61, authorizes the introduction without a permit of the nursery stock specified below:

- (a) all species of cacti (Cactaceae),
- (b) all species of orchids (Orchidaceae),
- (c) spawn of common field mushrooms (Agaricus campestris), and
- (d) Frangipani cuttings (Plumeria acutifolia and P. rubra).

(Note: The above information supplements nursery stock import permit requirements presented on page 4 and par. 18, page 10 of B.E.P.Q.-581, Revised.)

PLANT QUARANTINE REPORT NO. 10

Import Permit Requirements
for Certain Plants

According to the Plant Protection Bulletin of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations for February 1955, Notice No. 10, 1955 issued by the Acting Director of the International Division on September 12, 1955, published in Gazette No. 61, summarizes the latest decision which a permit of the Ministry of Agriculture is required for the importation of certain plants and plant products.

- (a) all species of cereals (Gramineae),
- (b) all species of crucifers (Cruciferae),
- (c) all species of legumes (Leguminosae),
- (d) all species of dicotyledons (Dicotyledonae),
- (e) all species of monocotyledons (Monocotyledonae),
- (f) all species of gymnosperms (Gymnosperms),
- (g) all species of angiosperms (Angiosperms),
- (h) all species of ferns (Filices),
- (i) all species of mosses (Musci),
- (j) all species of lichens (Lichenes),
- (k) all species of algae (Algae),
- (l) all species of fungi (Fungi),
- (m) all species of bacteria (Bacteria),
- (n) all species of viruses (Virus),
- (o) all species of protozoa (Protozoa),
- (p) all species of helminths (Helminths),
- (q) all species of insects (Insecta),
- (r) all species of arachnids (Arachnida),
- (s) all species of mites (Mites),
- (t) all species of nematodes (Nematoda),
- (u) all species of annelids (Annelida),
- (v) all species of molluscs (Mollusca),
- (w) all species of cnidarians (Cnidaria),
- (x) all species of coelenterates (Coelenterata),
- (y) all species of poriferans (Porifera),
- (z) all species of chordates (Chordata),
- (aa) all species of fish (Pisces),
- (ab) all species of amphibians (Amphibia),
- (ac) all species of reptiles (Reptilia),
- (ad) all species of birds (Aves),
- (ae) all species of mammals (Mammalia).
