In June 1944 the Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine issued a list of 174 articles on DDT (1-trichloro-2,2-bis(p-chlorophenyl)ethane) published from the time of its original synthesis in 1874 through April 30, 1944, and a digest to accompany this list appeared in December (E-631). This second list of publications on DDT is designed to bring the bibliography of this subject up to date, and also to call attention to a few older publications that were overlooked at the time of compiling the first list.

This second list includes 418 titles published not later than December 31, 1944. In all cases where no year of publication is given it is understood to be 1944.
