The National Bureau of Standards' was established by an act of Congress on March 3, 1901. The Bureau's overall goal is to strengthen and advance the Nation's science and technology and facilitate their effective application for public benefit. To this end, the Bureau conducts research and provides: (1) a basis for the Nation's physical measurement system, (2) scientific and technological services for industry and government, (3) a technical basis for equity in trade, and (4) technical services to promote public safety. The Bureau's technical work is performed by the National Measurement Laboratory, the National Engineering Laboratory, and the Institute for Computer Sciences and Technology.

THE NATIONAL MEASUREMENT LABORATORY provides the national system of physical and chemical and materials measurement; coordinates the system with measurement systems of other nations and furnishes essential services leading to accurate and uniform physical and chemical measurement throughout the Nation's scientific community, industry, and commerce; conducts materials research leading to improved methods of measurement, standards, and data on the properties of materials needed by industry, commerce, educational institutions, and Government; provides advisory and research services to other Government agencies; develops, produces, and distributes Standard Reference Materials; and provides calibration services. It may also be useful to manufacturers, engineers, purchasing agents, and others.

INTRODUCTION

Background

International standards and implementing actions, the importance of which have only recently been recognized, are intended to affect the flow of goods among nations. In the late 1960's, a multi-national working group of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT)* began to draft an agreement regarding the use of standards and certification systems in international trade. This effort was transferred to the Tokyo Round of the Multilateral Trade Negotiations (MTN) in 1975. These negotiations led to the Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade, which entered into force on January 1, 1980. Title IV of the U.S. Trade Agreements Act of 1979 implemented the United States' responsibilities under this Agreement.

The Agreement encourages signatories to participate in international standards organizations with a view towards harmonizing individual countries' technical regulations. The Trade Agreements Act (TAA) of 1979 assigns to the Department of Commerce the responsibility of assuring that U.S. participation in such organizations is adequate to represent U.S. interests.

The National Bureau of Standards has developed this directory as part of its responsibilities under the TAA. It seeks to identify organizations involved in standards development, certification, laboratory accreditation, and related activities, and which have identified themselves through their organizational titles as being international or regional in character or which have been thus referred to in other international and regional organizational directories. Another purpose is to identify those organizations which are open to U.S. participation and, for each such, whether or not the U.S. is represented.

Organizations such as the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, the American Society for Testing and Materials, the British Standards Institution, the Canadian Standards Association, and Deutsches Institut fur Normung produce standards which may be used in many parts of the world, but have designated themselves by title as national organizations; they have not been listed herein. However, further information on organizations located in the U.S. is contained in a companion volume to this directory, SP 417 United States Standardization Activities. That volume, last issued in 1975, is to be updated for publication later this year.

The information in this directory was obtained from responses to a questionnaire which was sent to more than 700 organizations listed in NBS files or in available international and regional organizational directories as likely loci for standards-related activities. Follow-up letters were sent to organizations which did not respond to the initial inquiry. Approximately 450 organizations supplied information on their activities; 272 of these organizations are concerned with standards-related activities. NBS would appreciate receiving information on other organizations which should be included in any updated or expanded version of this directory.

The information in this directory should be useful to government agencies engaged in setting standards or in other trade-related fields, and may also be of interest to voluntary standards writers, manufacturing firms, exporters, and others concerned with international trade.

OIML is an intergovernmental (treaty) organization created in 1955 to harmonize and coordinate on an international level the administrative and technical regulations of measurements and measuring instruments issued in various countries and thereby facilitate free commerce between countries, not only of measuring instruments but of all commodities and services which involve measurements.
