USARSO departure ceremony scheduled for next Friday

FORT CLAYTON—After nearly a century of the U.S. Army presence in Panama, U. S. Army South will transfer operations to Fort Buchannan, Puerto Rico, on July 30th.

The formal departure ceremony will take place at Fort Clayton's Soldier's Field at 11 a.m..

Long history

For many years USARSO served as the U.S. Southern Command's Army component in this hemisphere, with an area of operation encompassing 32 sovereign nations in Latin America and the Caribbean Basin.

The U.S. Army presence in Panama began in 1904 after the signing of the 1903 treaty between the United States and Panama which authorized the United States to build, operate, maintain and defend the Panama Canal.

In 1911, the 10th Infantry was assigned to what was then called the Panama Canal Zone with the mission of maintaining law and order among the canal construction force.

The Panama Canal opened in 1914, the same week that WWI broke out in Europe, and the U.S. Army was given the important task of protecting this economically strategic waterway. The importance of that task was amplified during WWII and throughout Cold War.

On Dec. 4, 1986, the U.S. Army South was activated as a major Army command and served as the headquarters for


FORT CLAYTON — The early morning of July 16 was a special day for the 118th Military Police Company (Airborne).



During a halftime interview, Weatherholt said his team will "try to work the ball more to our big guys down low."


Second-half play did reflect that, as both teams tried to control the tempo of the game. The teams basically traded baskets all the way to the end – the

Claim your medical records now

All personnel assigned to Howard Air Force Base must pick up their dental records by Aug. 6. All active-duty Army personnel assigned to Fort Clayton must pick up their dental records at the Theater Support Brigade in Building 127 on Fort Clayton. 

FORT CLAYTON (Contraband Control Office) – As a reminder, in accordance with the Panama Canal Treaty and U.S. Southern Command regulations, duty-free merchandise, whether new or used, cannot be given, transferred or generally sold to non-privilege holders. Violations to these dispositions may subject violators to prosecution under both military and Panamanian laws. It is sometimes permissible to sell an item, but only if Panamanian taxes are paid. Before such a sale, it is strongly recommended that the seller contact the Contraband Control Section for advice at 288-5814.

Access to installations is allowed for ID card holders & pass holders only. All guests must be signed on by ID card holders.



U.S. Army South donates equipment, educational materials to Panama

Donation given to augment unexploded ordnance awareness.

ANCON — Educational materials and equipment for increasing awareness and identification of unexploded ordnance were recently donated to the Panamanian government by U.S. Army South.

At a brief ceremony, which took place at the former Gorgas Hospital complex on Monday, Col. Robert C. Scharling, USARSO Deputy Chief of Staff for Civil Military Operations, presented the equipment to Dr. Dora W. de Da Costa, national director for the Promotion of Health, Panama Ministry of Health.

This donation concluded a series of activities which included seminars, informative videotapes and slide presentations, all designed to help Panamanian communities with unexploded ordnance awareness.


The familiarization course, a bilateral program which came about from the cooperation of both U.S. and Panamanian officials, addresses the need for community leaders to educate their citizens on the hazards of unexploded ordnance and offer a risk management plan to ensure everyone's safety.

The donated material and equipment included two vehicles, 10 television sets, 10 VCRs, tables for accommodating the television and video equipment, 17,000 coloring books, posters and flyers.

The informative coloring books, printed in the Spanish language with sample drawings and methods of identifying unexploded bombs, projectiles, rockets and grenades, will be distributed to children who are more prone to innocently pick up a curious object.

The donated materials are designed to educate and orient the people of the small towns in areas adjacent to former firing ranges on the danger of unexploded ordnance, and to teach them how to recognize those dangers. The basic steps in the protection against unexploded ordnance are:

- ◆ Identifying the unexploded ordnance.
- ◆ Avoiding any direct contact with the unexploded ordnance (it should not be touched).
- ◆ Isolating the unexploded ordnance by marking the area where it is discovered.
- ◆ Notifying the proper authorities by calling the Panama Police at telephone 104 or the Ministry of Health at telephone 211-1897 or 232-5132.


