To the Senate and House of Representatives:

In obedience to the provisions of statute, it is my duty to present to Congress a detailed statement of the transactions of this office for the fiscal year which closed June 30, 1894. The statistical information embodied in the accompanying tables, carefully compiled from the records of the office, covers a period of over ten months of the administration of my predecessor in office, and of less than two months of my own charge of the public printing.

In addition to this interesting exhibit of the practical operations of the work of public printing, binding, lithographing, etc., the law requires that I shall report such further information touching the condition of the office as may be in my possession. I feel it to be especially my duty at the present time to call the attention of Congress to the new and serious aspect which the question of providing safe and more commodious accommodations for this office has assumed.

The following report of the result of an examination into the condition of the buildings occupied for public printing—which has already been transmitted to the Joint Committee on Printing of Congress—was made to Brig. Gen. Thomas L. Casey, Chief Engineer of the United

States Army, by Col. John M. Wilson, of the Engineer Corps, who was detailed for the purpose under authority of the act making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1895, approved August 18, 1894. To this report I invite especial attention:

GENERAL: In compliance with the instructions contained in the letter of the 20th instant from the office of the Chief of Engineers (file mark 7438) directing me to have prepared and to submit a detailed project and estimate of cost of repairing the Government Printing Office, providing fire escapes, and putting said building in a safe and secure condition, I have the honor to report as follows:

The Government Printing Office, located at the southwest corner of H and North Capitol streets, was originally purchased in 1861, and now consists of what is known as the H street and North Capitol street sections, which are not fireproof, and the southwest and south center sections, which are believed to be fireproof.

The original H street section, which was about 243 feet by 61½ feet in area and four stories high, was built as a private printing office in 1856, and purchased by the United States in 1861; a four-story addition, about 60 feet by 76, was erected at the west end of the structure in 1865; and in 1871 a four-story addition, of the same general style of construction, about 93 feet by 61 feet, was erected immediately south of the H street section, and fronting on North Capitol street.

In 1879 a fireproof building about 53 feet by 87 feet, four stories high, with an L about 60 feet by 60 feet, was erected south of the western portion of the H street section.

In 1880-81 a lot on H street just west of the H street section was purchased and a stable erected, and in 1881 a second fireproof four-story extension, about 59 feet by 94 feet, was erected just west of North Capitol street section.

In 1885 a brick storehouse, 16 feet 10 inches by 100 feet, and three stories high above area, was built south of main building and connected with it by a bridge over an alley. A one-story plumbing and paint shop, 16 feet 10 inches by 65 feet 9 inches, was erected on the same lot at the same time.

All of these additions were constructed under the supervision of the Architect of the Capitol.

In 1888-89 an additional story was constructed upon the south center fireproof section, which had been erected in 1881.

During the past ten days careful and critical investigations of all these buildings have been made both by myself and my assistant, Lieut. John S. Sewell, Corps of Engineers; walls have been inspected, excavations adjacent to foundations of walls and piers made, and the latter critically examined; floors torn up, and beams and girders inspected at various points, and with the information now at my command I have the honor to recommend that the following work, in the order named, be undertaken:

First. To strengthen and repair the entire H street section.

Second. To place an additional fireproof story on the southwest section.

Third. To erect a new five-story fireproof building upon the area between the southwest section and the south center section.

For the repairs and strengthening of the H street section detailed estimates are submitted; for the other work only estimates in bulk are submitted. But if the general project is approved and the structures can be built under the law, detailed plans, drawings, and estimates will be prepared and submitted for further action while the work upon the H street section is in progress.

(1) TO STRENGTHEN AND REPAIR THE H STREET SECTION.

This section is a four-story brick structure fronting on H street; its length is 303 feet 6 inches; its depth for 60 feet from the west end is 76 feet, while the remainder of the section is about 60 feet deep, the east wall being on North Capitol street.

The walls of the building are 18 inches thick to the fourth floor, and 13 inches thick from there to the top. The floors are of timber, supported by 3-inch by 13-inch joists in the third and fourth stories, and 3-inch by 14-inch joists in the second story.

There is no basement; the first floor is laid directly on a brick pavement, which rests on the ground.

The floor joists run north and south along the north and south sides of the building, their ends resting upon the walls.

As originally constructed, two lines of girders and columns extended from east to west through the building, and these carried the middle span of the joists and the inner ends of the two outer spans.

The columns of the first and second stories are 6-inch cast iron, with about three-quarter-inch shells; in the third story the columns are rectangular Georgia pine posts, with a section of 10 inches by 10 inches.

The girders in all the stories are 10-inch by 14-inch pine.

The iron columns in the first story rest upon brick piers, which extend down to hard earth about 4 feet 4 inches below the floor.

The chief engineer of the building states that these piers have a base about 4 feet square. The only one of these examined by Lieutenant Sewell had a part of its foundation cut away to make room for a large printing press, and was not as large as the others are stated to be.

The original construction above described made the clear spans of the floor joists about 19 feet, with a total strength in the second floor of about 150 pounds per square foot, and in the third and fourth floors of about 110 pounds per square foot for quiescent loads.

As the work of the printing office increased the upper floors became considerably overloaded and the first floor filled with machinery.

The main line of shatting and pulleys was suspended from the middle of the middle span of joists in the second floor, and under the increased loads and heavy vibrations the condition of the building became so alarming that three additional rows of girders and columns were put in, dividing each span of joists into two nearly equal spans.

The new posts were of white oak in the first story and Georgia pine above, all being 8 inches square.

The girders were 8-inch by 10-inch Georgia pine in all the stories. Some inclined struts were also placed just inside the north wall to lessen the danger to this wall from the vibrations.

The foundations under the first floor for this extra shoring are brick piers resting on concrete, the depth being about 3 feet and the piers about 3 feet square.

The foundations of the outer walls of the building consist of a well-built rubble wall resting on solid earth at a depth of from 4 feet to 6 feet and a width at bottom of from 2 feet 4 inches to 2 feet 10 inches.

The original building appears to have been well designed and well constructed throughout, except that the walls are too light for such a large structure, even without the vibrations transmitted to them from the machinery, and wooden lintels were used over all the windows. The shrinkage of these lintels probably caused the numerous cracks which appear over the windows.

The original structure was taxed far beyond a safe and reasonable limit, both as to space and weight.

In its present condition it is still greatly overcrowded and overweighted.

It will not be possible to render it perfectly safe without tearing it down and reconstructing it, but it can be made practically secure against collapse, and somewhat safer for the occupants in case of fire.

In making the computations of its original strength as given in the foregoing, Lieutenant Sewell allowed a fiber stress of 1,200 pounds per square inch for the timbers. In computing its present strength, in view of the vibration to which the building is subjected and the excessive loads that have been piled upon the floors, he reduced the allowable stress by 20 per cent.

Under these conditions, with the free spans of the joist reduced as at present to a little less than 10 feet, the strength of the various parts of the building is as follows:

First. The 3-inch by 12-inch joists in the third and fourth floors, if properly supported, will sustain a load of 345 pounds per square foot.

Second. The 3-inch by 14-inch joists in the second floor, if properly supported, will sustain a load of 470 pounds per square foot.

Third. The 10-inch by 14-inch girders, properly supported, will sustain a load of 209 pounds per square foot.

Fourth. The 8-inch by 10-inch girders, which have shrunk slightly and are now 8-inch by 9½-inch, properly supported, will sustain a weight of 77 pounds per square foot.

Fifth. The cast-iron columns in the first story will sustain a weight of 546 pounds per square foot, to be distributed between the three floors above, or 182 pounds per square foot for each floor.

Sixth. The square wooden columns in the first story will sustain a weight of 256 pounds per square foot, to be distributed among the three floors above, or 85⅓ pounds per square foot for each floor. The foundations of all the columns, except those which have been tampered with in erecting steam presses, are of about the same strength as the columns.

Seventh. With allowable stresses reduced 20 per cent from 1,200 pounds per square inch, the strength of the floors without the shoring would be, for the third and fourth floors, 86¼ pounds per square foot, and for the second floor 117½ pounds per square foot.

Under existing conditions the weakest points of each floor are over 8-inch by 9½-inch girders at the middle points of the joist. The best that can be expected here is a strength equal to the sum of the strengths of the joists and girders, the strength of the joist being calculated for a 19-foot span. This would give a strength of 163¼ pounds per square foot for the third and fourth floors, and 194½ pounds per square foot for the second floor.

To obtain these strengths would require an adjustment of joists to girders too close to be obtained practically. The actual strengths then

lie somewhere between the strengths of the joists alone and the amounts above given.

Some of the shoring was put into the building in such a way as to be of little advantage, and the shrinkage of the 8-inch by 10-inch girders has deprived the joists in many places of support from the shoring.

I am informed that before the additional shoring was erected the changes in loads on second floor continually threw the shafting in the first story out of line. This should have been expected. The shoring has lessened the trouble, but not entirely overcome it.

The walls of the building show the effect of the heavy vibrations transmitted to them before the shoring was put in, and they still feel this vibration very much.

Near the smokestacks, in a high wind, additional vibration is transmitted to the walls, and when the printing presses are running continual vibrations in the walls can be distinctly felt.

So long as the present large force of employees and the immense amount of machinery and materials are permitted to remain in this structure the following conditions should exist:

First. The strength of the second floor should be made at least 200 pounds to the square foot, with no weak spots anywhere; at the same time a rigid support should be afforded to the shafting in the first story. The second floor is the composing room, and carries a very heavy weight of type, forms, etc. The first story is the press room. It is unnecessary to state the absolute importance of maintaining the shafting in line.

Second. The strength of the third and fourth floors, used for the bindery, with considerable machinery, should be not less than 150 pounds per square foot.

Third. The walls should be strengthened so as to be perfectly secure.

Fourth. Additional lines of communication between stories should be added, for use in case of fire.

With these facts before me, the following project is submitted for strengthening and repairing the H street building:

First. To remove the timber shoring from the first story and replace it with cast-iron columns and steel beams; the columns to rest on brick piers with concrete foundations; the beams to be bolted to columns and anchored in the east and west walls; the columns to have brackets and lugs at top for beams and brackets lower down for a rigid support for shafting; a single line of deep beams from 10 to 12 inches to be used rather than a double line of shallow ones; the timber shoring in the upper stories should be overhauled and adjusted where necessary.

Second. Add 13 inches to the thickness of the walls as far up as the third floor, and 9 inches from there to the top; substitute cast iron for wooden lintels over the windows, and tear out and rebuild cracked portions of walls; bolt the new walls to be built inside to the old ones with iron bolts and anchors, one for every 10 or 12 square feet of surface.

Third. Erect new stairways for fire escapes connecting the second, third, and fourth floors, and construct another direct exit from the second floor to street.

It is believed that the foregoing project would accomplish the end desired. Should it be approved, many careful measurements and examinations will be necessary as soon as funds are available, in order to properly develop details, as the present arrangements of printing presses and machinery must be considered.

The following approximate estimate of cost is submitted:

First. To strengthen floors:

(2) TO PLACE AN ADDITIONAL FIREPROOF STORY ON THE SOUTH-WEST SECTION.

The area occupied by the L-shaped fireproof building is 8,252 square feet. If a story about 12 feet high be added to this, the gain in cubic feet will be 99,024 feet. It is believed that this can be constructed for about 15 cents per cubic foot, or about \$14,850.

(3) TO ERECT A NEW FIREPROOF BUILDING UPON THE AREA BETWEEN THE SOUTHWEST SECTION AND THE SOUTH CENTER SECTION.

The available space is 60 feet by 23 feet, or 1,380 square feet; if built up to a height of five stories, say about 66 feet, the total cubic contents of the structure would be 91,080 cubic feet.

It is believed that this can be done for about 15 cents per cubic foot, or about \$13,650.

The total estimated cost of the work projected is, therefore, as follows:

While I fully believe it was intended by the law that fireproof additions could be made to the building, I have not as yet had detailed estimates of their cost made, but give bulk estimates for which I think the work can be done.

If the general plan outlined is approved, plans of the new structures and detailed estimates will be prepared as soon as funds are available for

employing draftsmen, etc., and will be submitted to the Chief of Engineers for his action.

I am indebted to Lieut. John S. Sewell, Corps of Engineers, for valuable assistance in the investigation of the condition of the Government Printing Office and in the preparation of this report.

The conclusions arrived at in the above report respecting the safety of portions of the structure now composing the Government Printing Office are such as to justify me in asking that Congress take immediate steps to prevent the imminent danger to life and public property so clearly indicated. The facts regarding the insecurity of the H street wing of the office are not new, but they are now presented for the first time by such eminent scientific engineering authority as to leave no reasonable doubt as to their accuracy or the pressing nature of the crisis to be met. The conviction that this wing is unsafe has been growing for a long time. The watchful eyes of experienced subordinates in the office detected many faults years ago, and the most cursory examination into the history of its construction and use and into its present overcrowded condition would lead inevitably to the conclusion that it is no longer fit for the uses of the Government.

It is but just that I should here recall that the attention of Congress has been invited to this subject in the most earnest manner by two of my predecessors, by myself during a previous term of office, and again by me in the month of June last.

I am fully convinced that the H street wing has been more than once in danger of collapse during the past from overweighting, and that no human foresight or anxiety can wholly prevent the recurrence of such danger under present conditions. In my judgment, the time has arrived for taking up the work of reconstructing this office, and a failure on my part to report fully to Congress the serious aspect of the matter would, in my opinion, be a serious, if not criminal, neglect of duty.

I will frankly say that, after reading Colonel Wilson's report confirming the worst fears as to the stability of the H street wing, I would have abandoned that portion of the building and removed the divisions located there to more secure quarters had the means and additional working space been at my disposal. I have used every precaution in my power to relieve the dangerous portions of the building from weight and stress and to render them as safe as possible, and I am unable to do more without the authority of Congress. I appeal earnestly for such legislation as will permit the removal of the danger at the earliest possible day and relieve the apprehensions of the many hundreds of

employees of the office, who, though fully appreciating their peril, still remain at their posts of public duty.

In addition to the question of humanity involved, an immediate enlargement both of working and storage space is required to secure the economical and prompt execution of the public printing. This demand can best be met by the erection, adjoining this office, of an annex building, with sufficient space to relieve the overcrowded and dangerous floors of the present building.

The Government in the past has lost much more than the cost of a new printing office in the delay and increased expense of the public printing because of the cramped and insufficient accommodations. The growth of the public printing has been constant, while the facilities of the office have kept pace neither with that growth nor with the peculiar necessities of the Government. It must be remembered, too, that this office is always liable to sudden and imperative demands for work which tax to the utmost its capacity and the ability of those charged with its execution. The new printing bill passed by Congress at its present session creates, if it becomes a law, conditions which will add largely to the work of the office and make necessary a very large addition to its present working and storage space, which can only be met for some time by the rental of inconvenient buildings and floors in the city. For several years past the execution of the most necessary work of the Government has been carried forward by a process of selection imposed upon the Public Printer by conditions he could not escape, and leading to frequent complaints from the various Departments of the Government regarding delayed work. This condition has reached a point at last when it must be said that the office can not with any degree of promptitude meet the largely increased demands created by Congress without a radical step being taken in the direction of increasing its accommodations.

I am much gratified to recognize the efforts of the Joint Committee on Printing to relieve in a degree the embarrassments under which the office labors, by providing for the erection of a fifth story on the southwest wing of the office and the building of floors upon the area between the southwest and south center wings. These additions, now being constructed under direction of the Chief Engineer of the Army, will, when completed, give considerable additional space to the office, and will be immediately utilized in relieving some of the overcrowded and dangerous parts of the office; but they will not affect the deficiencies and dangers herein referred to, or meet any increased demands.

The Government Printing Office is in a peculiar respect the ward of Congress. It was created by it with an enlightened recognition of the interest taken by a free people in the work of national legislation, and then its benefits were gradually extended to all branches of the Government to meet the public demand for knowledge in respect to matters concerning the country's progress.

So great has been its usefulness and the recognition of its utility by Congress that the tendency has constantly been for the work to outrun the facilities of the office. Nevertheless, Congress and the people may well be proud of an institution which is so peculiarly national in its character, and which has received recognition by nearly all civilized nations on account of the excellence of its work.

No doubt action by Congress for the erection of a new printing office would have been taken long ere this but for conflicting opinions regarding the best location and facilities. Any contention as to the future location of the office should not, however, be allowed to affect action for immediate relief in the present serious emergency, for whether the office is permanently retained in its present location or not, the need of an annex building is pressing and vital. The expense involved in the construction of such a building will not be wasted under any circumstances; the Government will soon need the building for storage purposes alone, and it could be constructed with a view to such use whenever larger plans for the accommodation of the office are carried out.

I trust that Congress will act with the generosity which it has always shown toward the office, and with the promptness that the situation demands.
