*To the Senate and House of Representatives:*

In obedience to the laws regulating the public printing, I have the honor to report to you the condition and the amount and cost of the public printing, binding, lithographing, and engraving; the amount and cost of all papers purchased for the same; a statement of the contracts entered into for the purchase of paper; all payments made during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1881, including those for material and labor for the Congressional Record; the amount of work ordered and done, with a general classification thereof, for each department; the number of persons employed in the Government Printing Office, and the time each has been employed and the amount each has received, and other information touching matters connected with said printing office.

By virtue of sections 3766 to 3772, both inclusive, of the Revised Statutes, the Joint Committee on Printing has the exclusive control of the matter of contracting for paper for the public printing, and of fixing upon standards of paper for the different descriptions of Congressional and executive printing. The aggregate amount paid for this character of work was \$219,984.98, as will appear by reference to Statement No. 8.

THE PUBLIC BINDING.

The amount expended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1881, on account of the public binding was \$539,430.91, the details of which will



be found in Statement No. 6. The value of stock on hand at the end of the fiscal year was \$43,145.96.

#### CONGRESSIONAL PRINTING AND BINDING.

During the third session of the Forty-sixth Congress there were ordered printed for the Senate 940 bills and joint resolutions, 63 executive documents, 48 miscellaneous documents, 210 reports of committees, 18 resolutions, and 6 confidential documents. For the House there were ordered printed 1,069 bills and joint resolutions, 99 executive documents, 17 miscellaneous documents, 41 resolutions, and 400 reports of committees.

During the first special session of the Senate of the Forty-seventh Congress there were ordered printed for the Senate 5 executive documents, 23 miscellaneous documents, and 1 report from committee.

THE CONGRESSIONAL RECORD.

Under the joint resolution of Congress approved June 20, 1874, the Congressional Printer is directed to keep a separate and exact account, in detail, of all expenditures for printing, mailing, and binding the Congressional Record, &c., and publish the amounts thus yearly expended in his next succeeding annual report, and each succeeding report, separately from the other disbursements of his office. This information is given in Table No. 7.

The number of bound volumes of the Record for the third session of the Forty-sixth Congress, including the index, is four, comprising 3,310 pages.
