To the Senate and House of Representatives :

In obedience to the laws regulating the public printing, I have the honor to report to you the exact condition and the amount and cost of the public printing, binding, lithographing, and engraving; the amount and cost of all papers purchased for the same; a detailed statement of proposals made and contracts entered into for the purchase of paper and other materials; all payments made during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1880, including those for material and labor for the Congressional Record; the amount of work ordered and done, with a general classification thereof, for each department; the number of persons employed in said establishment, and the time each has been employed; and such further information, touching all matters connected with said printing office, as may be in my possession.

By virtue of sections 3766 to 3772, both inclusive, of the Revised Statutes, the Joint Committee on Printing has the exclusive control of the matter of contracting for paper for the public printing, and of fixing upon standards of paper for the different descriptions of Congressional and executive printing. Statement No. 5 exhibits the exact quantity of each kind of paper purchased during the fiscal year ending on the 30th day of June, 1880, except that used on the Congressional Record, and the cost per ream. The aggregate amount expended was \$435,730.95. There remained on hand, June 30, papers of various kinds, as will be seen by reference to the same statement, amounting in value to \$65,541.25.

The amount expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1880, on account of the public binding was \$455,593.39, the details of which will be found in Statement No. 6. The value of stock on hand at the end of the fiscal year was \$34,798.91.

CONGRESSIONAL PRINTING AND BINDING.

During the second session of the Forty-sixth Congress there were printed for the Senate 1,649 bills and joint resolutions, 216 executive documents, 104 miscellaneous documents, 725 reports of committees, 15 resolutions, and 5 confidential documents. For the House there were printed 3,808 bills and joint resolutions, 90 executive documents, 47 miscellaneous documents, 9 resolutions, and 1,793 reports of committees.

THE CONGRESSIONAL RECORD.

Under the joint resolution of Congress approved June 20, 1874, the Congressional Printer is directed to keep a separate and exact account, in detail, of all expenditures for printing, mailing, and binding the Congressional Record, &c., and publish the amounts thus yearly expended in his next succeeding annual report, and each succeeding report, separately from the other disbursements of his office. This information is given in table No. 7.

The number of bound volumes of the Record for the first session of the Forty-sixth Congress, including the index, is three, comprising 3,050 pages. The number of copies of each volume printed and bound is 7,200, aggregating 21,600 volumes. These have been disposed of as follows:

RECEIPTS FROM SALES OF WASTE PAPER, ETC.

During the fiscal year ending June 30, 1880, there was received from sales of documents, Records, waste paper, &c., the sum of \$155,403 90, which has been deposited in the Treasury.

ENLARGEMENT OF THE BUILDING.

The enormous increase of the public printing and binding is such as to require the enlargement of the building in which the work is done. There is not half room enough to store the printed signatures as the printing progresses.

Fifty thousand copies of the last Annual Report of the Commissioner of Agriculture have been printed; but, for want of storage, the printing of the remaining two hundred and fifty thousand copies has been suspended until the edition of fifty thousand now printed can be bound and delivered. Other public documents are delayed for the same reason.

As an evidence of the increase of the work in this office, the number of blanks printed during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1879, exceeded those printed during the previous year by **30,854,933**, and the blank books by **126,511**; and the increase of blanks printed during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1880, over those printed during 1879, is **25,454,886**, and of blank books **94,195** as shown by the above exhibits. The increase of the work during the first quarter of the present fiscal year, as shown by requisitions from the Executive Departments, exceeds that of the last fiscal year during the same time by twenty-five per centum.

CONGRESSIONAL GLOBE.

The attention of Congress is again most respectfully called to the bound and unbound copies of the Congressional Globe purchased several years ago by Congress. It will be remembered that they were purchased for the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, "*in accordance with the schedule submitted,*" and that, although the number of volumes exceeded the number specified in the schedule, they were found to be odd numbers, there being only two complete sets, and entirely worthless, except for waste paper unless additional volumes are printed to make complete sets.

At the last session of Congress the Senate adopted a resolution calling on the Public Printer for an "estimated cost of reproducing a sufficient number of volumes to make complete sets of one thousand and of two thousand, of the whole number."

The following information was furnished in compliance with the resolution:

The estimate of the cost of reprinting and binding a sufficient number of volumes to make one and two thousand complete sets (108 volumes complete a set) was carefully made by Mr. Oyster, the foreman of the Record room, and is herewith submitted.
