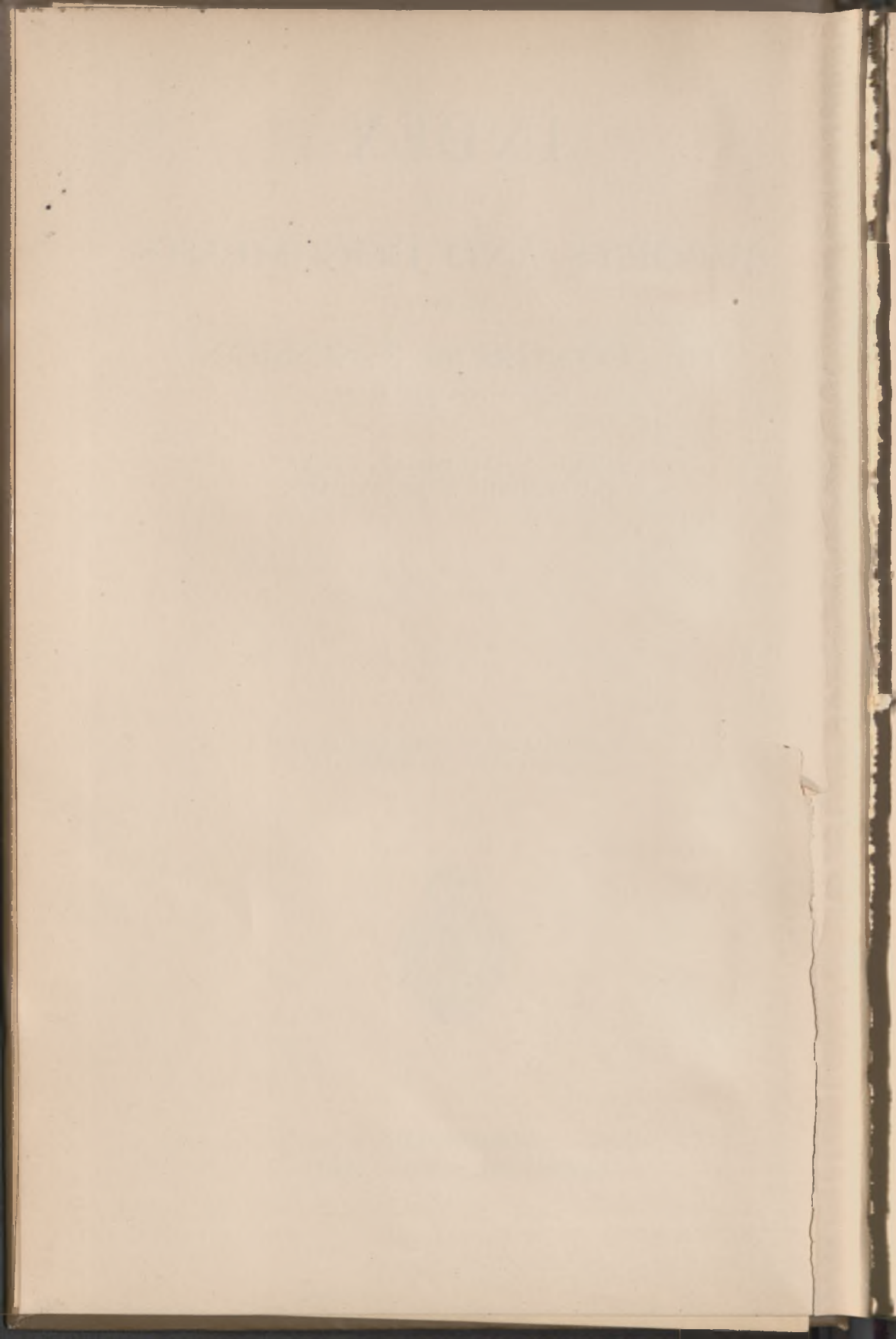
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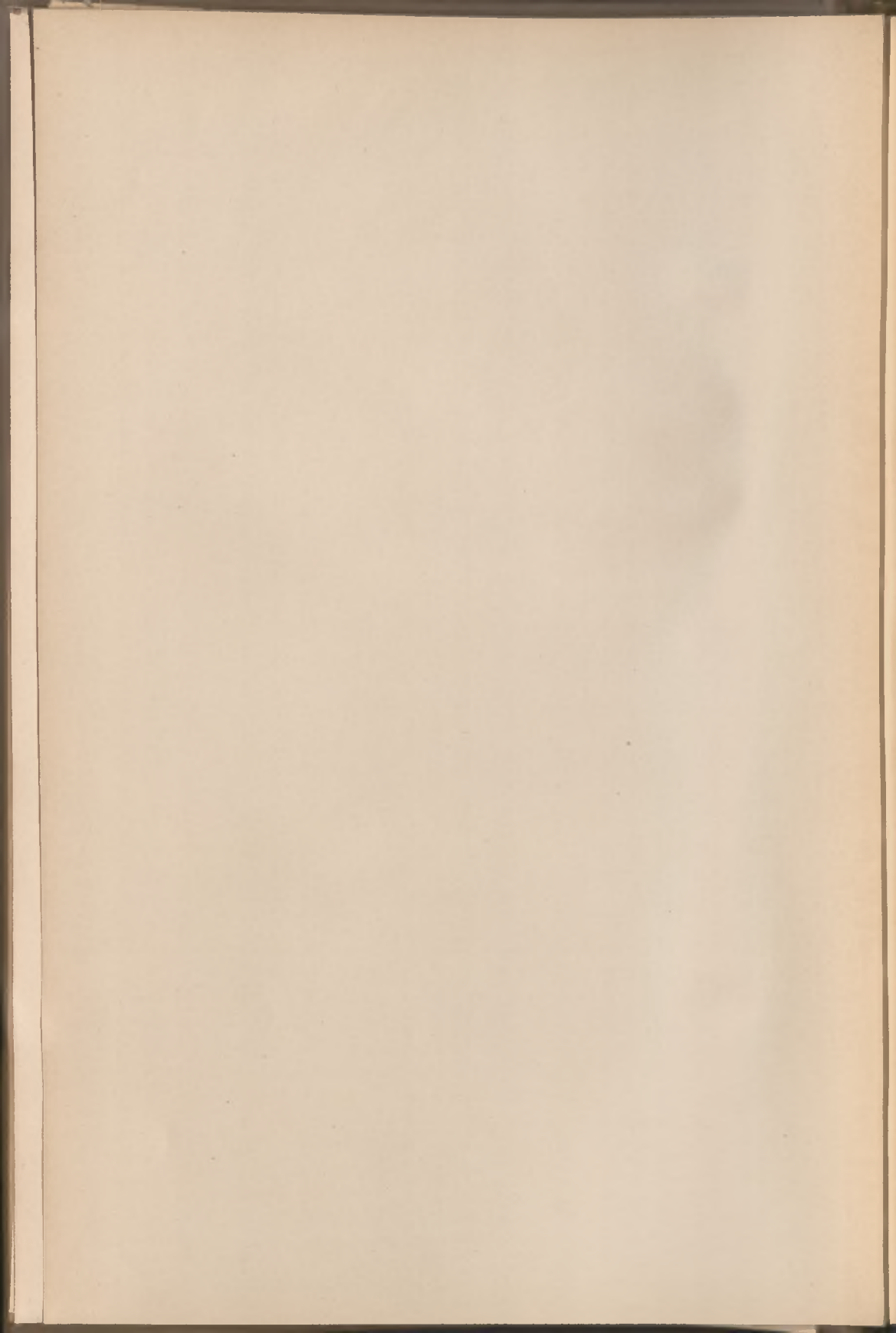
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## PREFACE

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The "consolidated index of Congressional documents" for the second session of the Sixtieth Congress, herewith presented, is the fifteenth in the series prepared in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents in compliance with the requirements of section 62 of the printing law of Jan. 12, 1895. It follows the same general plan as the preceding numbers with the exception of having the serial numbers added to the numerical lists.

Heretofore, while committee reports in both houses have been numbered for the whole Congress, no matter how many sessions may have been held, the Senate and House documents have begun a new set of numbers with each session, having thus at least two series for each Congress, frequently three series, and occasionally a fourth series issued by the Senate at a special session. By operation of law (34 Stat. L., 1014), this duplication of document numbers in the same Congress has now been done away with. Beginning with the Sixtieth Congress the documents, as well as the reports, are numbered through the Congress. The first Senate document issued for the second session of the Sixtieth Congress is number 538 and the first House document is number 988. Under the old plan each of these would have been numbered 1.

For a full explanation of the law relative to the printing and binding of the Congressional documents, consult the preface of the Index to the reports and documents of the 60th Congress, 1st session.

Serial number 5378 is assigned to the Senate Journal and number 5379 to the House Journal. House report 1806, part 2, being a duplicate in text of Senate report 701, part 2, is not included in the set of bound volumes.

The documents included in this index number 1773, divided as follows: Senate reports, 418; House reports, 534; Senate documents, 234; House documents, 587. The Senate reports will be bound in 4 volumes (of which 2 are lettered), the House reports in 4 (of which 3 are lettered), the Senate documents in 23, and the House documents in 151, making a total of 182 volumes for the session.

The following change in the schedule of volumes of the first session of the Sixtieth Congress should be noted: Precedents, decisions on



points of order, with phraseology, in United States Senate, 1789-1909, by Henry H. Gilfry, listed as Senate document 537 of the first session of the Sixtieth Congress, has been issued as Senate document 129 of the first session of the Sixty-first Congress. It was listed as the last Senate document of the first session of the Sixtieth Congress, and as it had been estimated that it would make about 50 pages it was scheduled to be bound in volume 33 of the Senate documents. When issued, however, it appeared as a volume of 581 pages of the first session of the Sixty-first Congress. Therefore the last Senate document of the first session of the Sixtieth Congress will be number 536 and number 537 will be a blank.

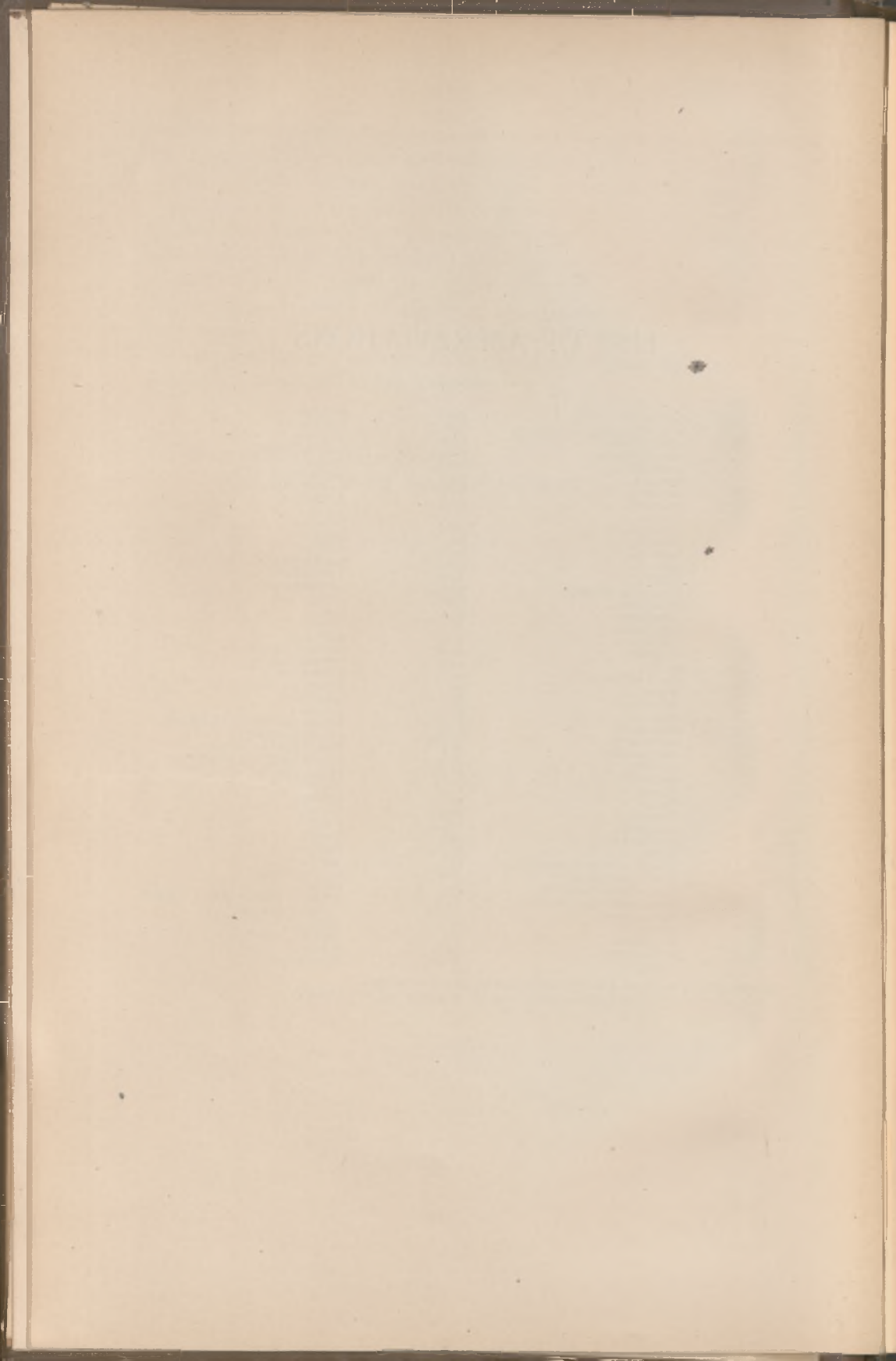

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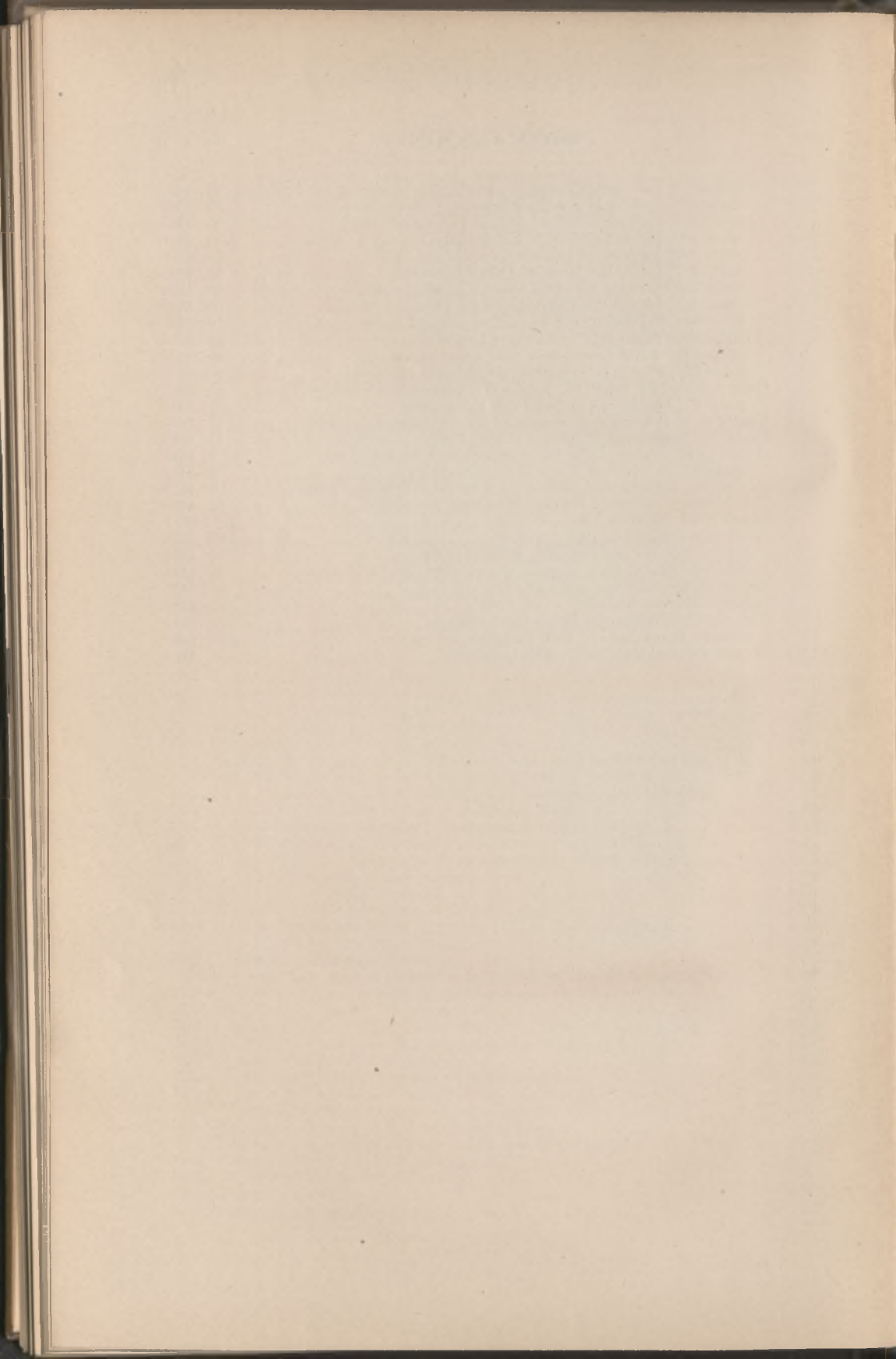
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
