NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a * price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The L.C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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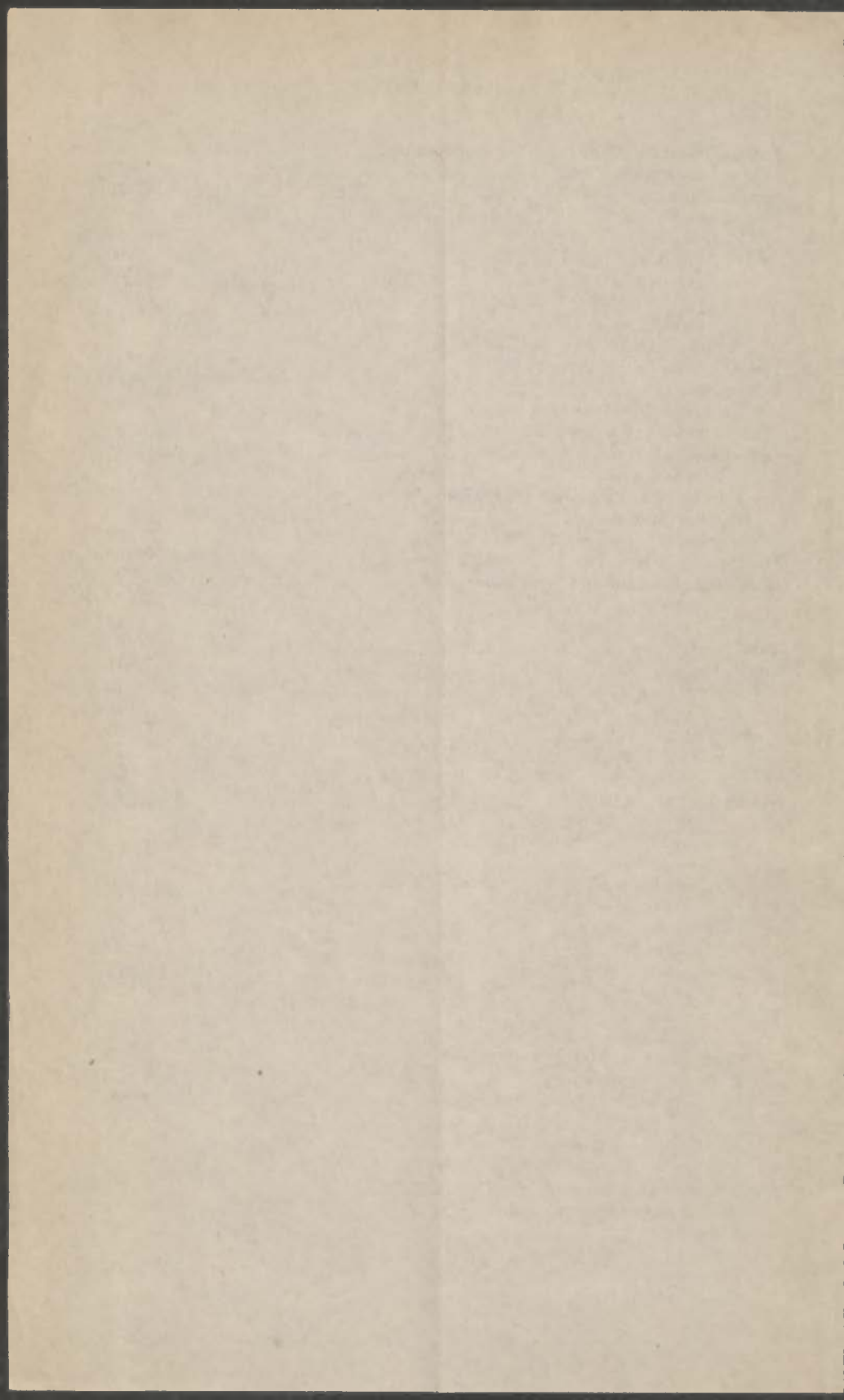
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GENERAL INFORMATION

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Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the Price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

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Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e.g., H. doc. 230, 73-2.

Do not use the L.C. card number in ordering a publication.

HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D.C., by coupons, postal money order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted.

For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his Office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Checklist of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e.g., the number A 1.23/a: So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23^a: So 96⁴ in a library.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L.C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, *not* to the Superintendent of Documents.

MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued later, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The Notes of General Interest, which at one time appeared in the Monthly Catalog, were discontinued after August 1917. There has been considerable demand on the part of the libraries for the continuance of these Notes, and beginning with this issue of the Catalog we will include miscellaneous items, which we believe will be of interest to the libraries.

CLASSIFICATIONS

The scheme of classification used in the Public Documents Library is fully described in the Checklist of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909.

New classifications assigned covering the period January 1, 1910, to October 31, 1913, will be found in Bulletin 15, issued by the Superintendent of Documents, which is a continuation of the classification used in the Checklist. Subsequent to that period all new classifications and changes have been included in the monthly invoices furnished all depository libraries for checking publications received. Copies of the Checklist and Bulletin 15 are available, but complete files of the invoices cannot now be furnished. Any library not a depository that is interested in receiving the depository invoices as published for the purpose of keeping posted as to changes or additions to the classification may be placed on the mailing list upon request.

Bulletin 17, issued by the Superintendent of Documents, is a revised classification for publications of the Interstate Commerce Commission (p. 558-587) of the Checklist. Bulletin 17 is now out of print.

NEW GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND CHANGES IN FORMER ORGANIZATIONS

The name of the Aeronautics Branch of the Department of Commerce was changed to the Bureau of Air Commerce, effective July 1, 1934. Authority for the change is contained in an order signed by Secretary Roper. The name Bureau of Air Commerce more accurately describes the duties and functions of this organization, and is further desirable to prevent confusion between commercial aeronautics as typified by "air commerce" and the aeronautical activities of other branches of the Government.

By Executive order 6726 of May 29, 1934, the President established the Division of Territories and Island Possessions in the Department of the Interior, and transferred thereto the functions of the Bureau of Insular Affairs, War Department, pertaining to the administration of the Government of Puerto Rico. The Executive order was also issued as a congressional document (House document 390, 73d Cong.). This new division will also deal with matters pertaining to Alaska, Hawaii, and the Virgin Islands. These last three have been under the jurisdiction of the Interior Department for some time.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

As a result of Public Act No. 460, Seventy-third Congress, the set of Definitive Writings of George Washington has been placed on sale, the price being \$50 for the set to libraries and \$75 to the general public. Remittance for the entire set is required in advance of delivery of the volumes published to date.

The usual number of copies of Public Act No. 431 was not printed, and as a result there were none made available for general distribution. This public act is the Code of Laws for the Canal Zone, and will not be published in the Session Laws or the Statutes at Large, but there will be printed and bound as directed by the Joint Committee on Printing an indexed edition including explanatory matter, which will be available for sale by the Superintendent of Documents.

The Index to the Reports and Documents of Congress, which has heretofore been issued by the Office of the Superintendent of Documents at the close of each session of Congress, has been discontinued due to certain economy measures. The last printed index covered the period of the Second session of the Seventy-second Congress. However, a Schedule of Volumes and Numerical Lists of all documents and reports issued during the Seventy-third Congress will be printed. This publication will consist of the Schedule of Volumes which has been previously issued preliminary to the Index, and Numerical Lists of reports and documents, similar to those formerly included in the Document Index.

The scales most commonly used are 1:31,680, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding, approximately, to 1/2 mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered differs with the latitude, but the average area is 58, 230, or 920 square miles, respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by 16 1/2 inches, and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17 1/2 inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. A general description of topographic maps and a list of the symbols used are printed on the reverse of each sheet.

About 46 percent of the area of the country, excluding Alaska, has been mapped, every State being represented. Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are completely mapped. Twenty-four of the topographic maps covering areas in New Jersey are out of print, the Survey not reprinting the maps as the stocks become exhausted but referring applicants to the Department of Conservation and Development, at Trenton, which publishes maps on a larger scale. Maps of the regular size are sold by the Geological Survey at 10c. each. Except as otherwise indicated, a discount of 40 percent is allowed on any order which amounts to \$5.00 at the retail price. The discount is allowed on an order for either maps or folios alone, or for maps and folios together.

The individual Blue Eagle cards are not listed separately in the Monthly catalog.

The scale of each type map is 1 inch equals 1 mile. County maps are furnished in the form of blue-line prints made from negatives that are prepared about once a year. STATE DEPARTMENT

NOTE.—With the publication of the first number of the printed Press releases on Oct. 5, 1929, the Department of State inaugurated a new publication program. The daily mimeographed releases are made available to the public weekly in printed form; also, all publications (except laws, Executive orders, proclamations, and treaties) are numbered consecutively in the order in which they are sent to press. Publications of a similar character are brought within well-defined series, and each series publication bears a series number in addition to its publication number. The diplomatic correspondence of the United States is published in the volumes entitled Foreign relations of the United States. Laws, Executive orders, and proclamations are issued in separate series and are numbered within each series in the order in which they are signed. Treaties are issued in a separate series and are numbered in the order in which they are proclaimed. Treaties are also published in the compilation Treaties and other international acts of the United States of America, which contains literal copies of the documents, followed by notes of a textual and procedural character. Indexes to the Press releases are supplied semiannually, as of December 31 and June 30. The Department of State includes in the Press release series, each quarter, a complete list of its publications for the preceding quarter.

The list below frequently includes certain relevant publications issued by other agencies of the Government under requisition of the Department of State and certain relevant congressional documents.

PROCUREMENT DIVISION

NOTE.—Under an order of the Secretary of the Treasury, approved by the President Oct. 9, 1933, and pursuant to the provisions of Executive order 6166 of June 10, 1933, and Executive order 6224 of July 27, 1933, there was established in the Treasury Department a Procurement Division.

The following organizations and their functions were transferred to the Procurement Division: (a) the functions of the General Supply Committee; (b) the Fuel Yards of the Bureau of Mines of the Department of Commerce; (c) the functions of the Office of the Supervising Architect of the Treasury Department; (d) the functions of the Federal Coordinating Service relating to the disposition of seized and surplus property, etc., exercised by (1) the Area Coordinators, (2) the Federal Real Estate Board, (3) the Federal Specifications Board, (4) the Federal Standard Stock Catalog Board, (5) the Federal Traffic Board, and (6) the Interdepartmental Board of Contracts and Adjustments. The establishment of the Procurement Division and the transfer of the functions of the Federal Coordinating Service took effect Oct. 10, 1933, the remaining provisions of the order took effect Oct. 16, 1933. The Procurement Division is divided into 2 branches, the Branch of Public Works and the Branch of Supply.
