Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 61st Congress, 2d session, is to be understood.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for. Only one copy can be sold to the same person, excepting Members of Congress, or to libraries or schools.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals, **nor can they be forwarded in advance of payment.**

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions and, unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

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Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which several hundred thousand are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that most of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

Lists on various subjects will be issued from time to time for free distribution. No general price-list of public documents is at present available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indexes. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

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Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and $\frac{1}{2}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress. Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

CUMULATIVE INDEX

Beginning with July, 1909, the Index to the Monthly catalogue is issued separately each quarter and cumulates for half-yearly periods. That is, the September number of the Index indexes the Monthly catalogue for July, August, and September, the December number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for July to December, the March number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for January to March, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1910. HOW TO REMIT

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NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Biological Survey Bureau Circular 71, issued April 11, 1910, contains maps or diagrams, and very brief descriptions, of seven bird and mammal reservations in Alaska which were established by President Roosevelt during the closing days of his administration. One of them, the Fire Island reservation, is the breeding ground of the Alaskan moose and some of the reserved islands in Bering Sea are rookeries of sea lions, and all of the reservations are breeding grounds for seabirds or ducks and geese. The Alaska game law, which is a part of the new Federal criminal code, provides penalties of fine or imprisonment, or both, for interference with or disturbance of birds or beasts on these reservations.

House report 1000, 61st Congress, 2d session, entered in this catalogue under Library Committee, House, favors the passage of a bill to establish a commission of nine persons "of the highest standing for scholarship and judgment in the field of United States history", whose duty it shall be to pass upon the merit of historical compilations or narratives which the Government is asked to publish. The report refers for further information and elucidation to Senate document 714, 60th Congress, 2d session, which is a report on national historical publications made under the auspices of the Keep Commission, by an assistant committee of nine historical writers and teachers, including Charles Francis Adams, Admiral Mahan, and Worthington C. Ford. This reviews the existing documentary historical publications of the Government, points out the gaps in the record that should be filled, and discusses the general subject in an illuminating way. Beyond question the plan of having the work of publishing historical material supervised by historians has merit and Congressional authorization for it is to be desired.

The Bureau of American Republics has outdone itself in issuing the May number of its Bulletin as a dedication number, celebrating the dedication of its new building. The ceremonies occurred April 26 and the new Bulletin was received at the Public Documents Office April 29. It is most profusely, elaborately, and beautifully illustrated, really a work of art.

The Manufactures Bureau has completed an international commercial directory and the Secretary of Commerce and Labor has asked Congress for an appropriation of \$6,500 to pay for printing it. When printed it will be sold by the Superintendent of Documents.

The Annual report of the governor of the district of Alaska for 1909 carries a large folded map of the district and a nine-page list of Government publications relating thereto. The governor reports that the white population remains stationary at about 33,000, and

the Indian population at about 35,000. He does not expect much increase until there has been more railroad building. The price of this report, in paper covers, is 20c.

Pheasant raising in the United States is the subject of Farmers' bulletin 390, issued during April. It has illustrations of several varieties of pheasants, a history of pheasant-raising in Europe and America, description of methods, a chapter on diseases of pheasants, etc. This and the other Farmers' bulletins, of which there are now about 400, are sold by the Superintendent of Documents at the uniform price of 5c. each, except no. 270, which is 10c.

New Alaskan publications, besides the Annual report of the governor, elsewhere spoken of, are the Report of the Alaska Road Commission and the Report of the Fisheries Bureau on the Alaska fishery industry for 1909. This latter report discredits the popular belief that the Alaskan salmon are near extermination by showing that the catch of 1908 was the largest on record and that of 1909 nearly as great.

It is not to be inferred, because the Agriculture Department has issued a popular cook-book, that it is not frequently scientific. Among its issues for April is Animal Industry Bureau Bulletin 120, entitled *The intracellular enzymes of Penicillium and Aspergillus*, with special reference to those of *Penicillium Camemberti*. The bulletin includes also a five-page bibliography. Another April issue is Plant Industry Bureau Bulletin 173, *Seasonal nitrification as influenced by crops and tillage*.

Investigators who are in search of foreign food prices will find extensive and authentic material in a new publication of the Navy Department, under the title *Statement giving prices paid by vessels of Navy for subsistence supplies purchased at foreign ports during the calendar years 1900 to 1909*.

Fisheries Bureau Bulletin, vol. 28, for the year 1908, will contain and be mainly made up of the proceedings and papers of the Fourth International Fishery Congress, held in Washington, Sept. 1908. The papers are now in course of publication as "separates", or pamphlets, containing each one paper. The date of issue of the complete bulletin has not yet been announced.

A new document which has a very interesting look is Senate document 447, 61st Congress, 2d session, presented by Senator Hale, and entered in this catalogue under Senate. It has the title *How we built the Union Pacific Railway* and other railway papers and addresses, and the author is Gen. Grenville M. Dodge, who was chief engineer of the Union Pacific, 1866-1900. The pamphlet is generously illustrated and the narrative is full of incident.

Habit-forming agents, their indiscriminate sale and use a menace to the public welfare, is the title of Farmers' bulletin 393, just issued by the Chemistry Bureau. It is a timely warning against the general use of cure-alls, soft drinks, etc., many of which, it says, contain cocaine, chloroform, morphine, and other poisons.

Another attractive new number in that wonderfully varied series of Farmers' bulletins is 389, *Bread and bread making*, by Helen W.

Atwater, and issued by the Experiment Stations Office. It supersedes Farmers' bulletin 112, published ten years ago. It is a pamphlet that will do a world of good if widely circulated and well lived up to.

International classification of causes of sickness and death, as revised by the international commission at the session of Paris, July 1 to 3, 1909, for use Jan. 1, 1910, to Dec. 31, 1919, is the title of a new publication of the Census Bureau, which must be of much interest to the great and increasing number of scientifically trained persons who are giving time and study to health problems.

Bulletin 176 of the Plant Industry Bureau is the 20th inventory of the importations of plants and seeds from foreign countries by the Agriculture Department. The numbers of the importations listed in this inventory are 25718-26047. There is an introduction pointing out the importations of special merit and an index of common as well as of scientific names.

The honor of being printed in the largest edition ever ordered of a public document of the United States seemed about to fall to Farmers' bulletin 391, Economical use of meats in the home, when the House passed a joint resolution providing for printing a million copies. However, when it got to the Senate it was amended by substituting 300,000. To this the House disagreed, but after conference the two branches agreed on half a million and this edition was ordered, 100,000 to go to the Senate for distribution and 400,000 to the House, giving Senators, Representatives, and the principal officers of the two houses just about 1,000 copies each. The cost of printing this pamphlet of 45 pages without cover in such a very large edition will be but little over a cent a copy.

The House Committee on Agriculture has presented a report favoring a bill having for its purpose the conservation of navigable rivers.

Librarians will probably be interested to know that the Printing Committee has introduced in the Senate a bill (S. 7661) to abolish the "members' reserve," and supported it with a strong report (Senate report no. 568). This "reserve" is an edition of 500 copies of all Congressional documents printed and held in reserve for two years to be bound on the order of Senators and Representatives in such style as they might prefer within a fixed limit of cost. Previous to the passage of the general printing law of 1895 Members were allotted also a complete set of documents bound in full sheep. This set was cut off by the law of 1895, and a few years ago the present reserve was cut down from 500 to 300. Even as reduced only a small part of this "reserve" is ordered out for binding. Any Senator or Representative may get from the "up number" the single copy which he is entitled to have bound for his personal use. For these and other reasons the "members' reserve" has become obsolete, and if the bill to abolish it should become a law and the whole rather costly edition disappear it would hardly be missed.

One large volume of hearings held before the Select Committee of the Senate relative to wages and prices of commodities has been

printed and three large volumes of Investigation of the Department of the Interior and of the Forestry Service. Neither investigation is completed.

There is a new tariff compilation, 1789 to 1909, of 1040 pages issued by the Printing Joint Committee. This includes the Payne-Aldrich tariff law as well as all the preceding ones, with all amendments, etc. It is sold by the Superintendent of Documents in cloth binding at \$1.50. Its document designation is 61st Congress, 2d session, H. doc. 671.

Tariff series 24, Manufactures Bureau, is Consular regulations of foreign countries. It contains information as to procedure, fees, etc., necessary for American exporters.

There will be great doings in South America this year. The United States has sent commissioners, in naval vessels, to Buenos Aires and to Santiago. For details, portraits of commissioners, etc., see Bulletin of the International Bureau of the American Republics for April, 1910.

Tide tables for 1911 has been issued by the Coast and Geodetic Survey.

Among the April publications is Drill regulations for machine-gun platoons, infantry, Army. Paper, 15c.

The new (3d) edition of the Engineer field manual (Professional papers 29, Corps of Engineers, U. S. A.) is at last ready for delivery, in full leather, pocketbook style, identical with the copies supplied to the regular Army. Price, \$1.00.

Forms of procedure for courts and boards in the Navy and Marine Corps, just issued by the Navy Department, is sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 60c. in cloth.

There is a new print of the publication entitled The isthmian canal, by H. H. Rousseau, a member of the Isthmian Canal Commission. In paper covers, 5c.

The 3d and last edition of the Official Congressional directory for the 61st Congress, 2d session, is published in green cloth, price 60c. First editions of the Directory are always bound in red cloth, 2d editions in blue, 3d editions in green. Two editions are issued at each short session of Congress, three editions at each long session.

THE NEW YEARBOOK

The Yearbook of the Department of Agriculture for 1909 is now on sale by the Superintendent of Documents at \$1.00 a copy.

Each new number of this famous manual of the art and the science of agriculture in all its multiform branches seems more interesting and valuable than any of its predecessors. How the scientific farmers, naturalists, chemists, and pathologists of the Department contrive to find so much of novelty and utility year after year is an inquiry to which there is no answer, but which must arouse the wonder and admiration of all who attempt to fathom it. Perhaps the paper in the present number which has the most freshness and present-day interest is the one which has been given the place of honor in the compilation, immediately following the Secre-

tary's annual report. Its title is *The farmers' cooperative demonstration work*, and it is written by Mr. S. A. Knapp, who is the special agent in charge of that interesting and novel work. It describes the methods by which "object lessons" in all branches of successful farming are brought to the very doors of the farmer. This work now extends into twelve States, employs 375 traveling agents, and has thousands of demonstration farms. Through boys' corn clubs, field schools, and cooperation with superintendents of education and others, many thousands of farmers and farm boys have scientific farming made so easy for them that no excuse is left for failing to become experts. The means by which ambition and competition have been aroused among farm boys, and the fine results that have followed, make a noteworthy chapter in American agricultural history. This paper, like nearly all the papers in the book, is reinforced by pictures which really illustrate. Those illustrating the paper called *Promising new fruits* are in colors, and there is also a remarkable, many-colored, natural-size picture of a surprising ear of corn.

GALLATIN ON ROADS AND CANALS

Albert Gallatin was Secretary of the Treasury under Presidents Jefferson and Madison, and held the record for continuous length of service in the Cabinet till James Wilson, Secretary of Agriculture under Presidents McKinley, Roosevelt, and Taft, eclipsed it. April 4, 1808, Secretary Gallatin, responding to a Senate resolution of March 2, 1807, sent to George Clinton, President of the Senate, a report on roads and canals which has ever since been rated as a classic. It was ordered printed April 12, 1808, and was ordered reprinted April 19, 1910, the new issue being denominated Senate document 499, 61st Congress, 2d session. It is described on the title page as "Reprint from State Paper No. 250, Tenth Congress, First Session." This implies that there was a numbered series of documents known as State papers issued in the 10th Congress and that Gallatin's report was no. 250 in that series. This is inaccurate. There was no numbering of Congressional documents till the 13th Congress, and a complete numbering system for all the documents of both branches was not adopted till the 15th Congress. The number 250 is derived from Class 10, Miscellaneous, vol. 1, of Gales and Seaton's American State papers, this volume having been issued in 1834. This whole series is in 38 volumes, the compilation having been nominally made jointly by the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House, but really by Gen. William Hickey, who was for a generation chief clerk in the office of the Secretary of the Senate, and was in his day a noted compiler and expert in public documents.

New sets of numbers were created for the use of the Gales and Seaton compilation. There is a set for each of the ten classes in which the documents are arranged, namely, Class 1, Foreign relations, 6 vols.; Class 2, Indian affairs, 2 vols.; Class 3, Finance, 5 vols.; Class 4, Commerce and navigation, 2 vols.; Class 5, Military affairs, 7 vols.; Class 6, Naval affairs, 4 vols.; Class 7, Postoffice

Department, 1 vol.; Class 8, Public lands, 8 vols.; Class 9, Claims, 1 vol.; Class 10, Miscellaneous, 2 vols. The documents are arranged in chronological order and numbered, beginning with the first document in vol. 1 of each class and running in consecutive order through all the volumes of that class. For the first 12 Congresses, in which the documents were not numbered when published, the numbers given to the reprints mattered little one way or the other, but reprints from later Congresses, which had been originally printed in one or the other of the Congressional numbered series, are reprinted under the new numbers only, the original numbers being dropped and no mention made of them.

Gallatin's report on roads and canals is reprinted in vol. 1 of Class 10 as no. 250. As given there it includes numerous accompanying papers, one of them being by B. H. Latrobe, architect of the Capitol, and another by Robert Fulton, inventor of the steamboat; also several maps. These do not appear in the latest reprint.

In these days of great projects Mr. Gallatin's plans and estimates of a hundred years ago seem modest indeed. He estimated the total revenues of the Government for the years 1809-1815 at \$14,000,000 annually, and the expenditures at \$8,500,000. From the surplus he thought that in times of peace \$2,000,000 a year might be applied to internal improvements.

MONTHLY WEATHER REVIEW

An important change in the method of publication of the Monthly weather review is announced. The annual summary number will not be issued for 1909 nor following years. The tabular matter heretofore issued in the summary numbers will be published in part in the quarto edition of the Annual report of the chief of the Weather Bureau. The title-page and index for vol. 37 (1909) will be separately printed and sent to all subscribers to whom the Dec. 1909 Review has been sent.

THE YANKEE DOODLE BOOK

Apparently speculation has been attempted in this popular Government publication. The New York Nation of April 28, 1910, has this reference to it:

Herbert Putnam, librarian of Congress, desires us to make known the fact that the "Report on the Star-Spangled Banner, Hall Columbia, America, Yankee Doodle, by O. G. T. Sonneck, chief of the division of music, which has been offered for sale by certain private concerns for \$1.25, can be obtained of the superintendent of documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, at 85 cents a copy."

This handsome illustrated report, embodying the results of long research, is a cheap book, even at \$1.25, but that is no reason why a purchaser should pay 40c. more than the price at which it is sold by the Superintendent of Documents.

RESULTS OF MEDICAL RESEARCH AWAITING PUBLICATION

The Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service has had returned to it for lack of funds to pay for printing the manuscripts of six treatises which it had transmitted to the Treasury Department for publication. These all relate to serious and timely matters affecting the public health, the titles being as follows: Hookworm disease, its nature, treatment, and prevention; The microscopic anatomy of ticks, etc.; Transactions of the Seventh Annual Conference of State Health authorities with the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service; General observations on the bionomics of rodent and human fleas; Studies upon leprosy; Soil pollution and its relation to hookworm disease and typhoid fever.

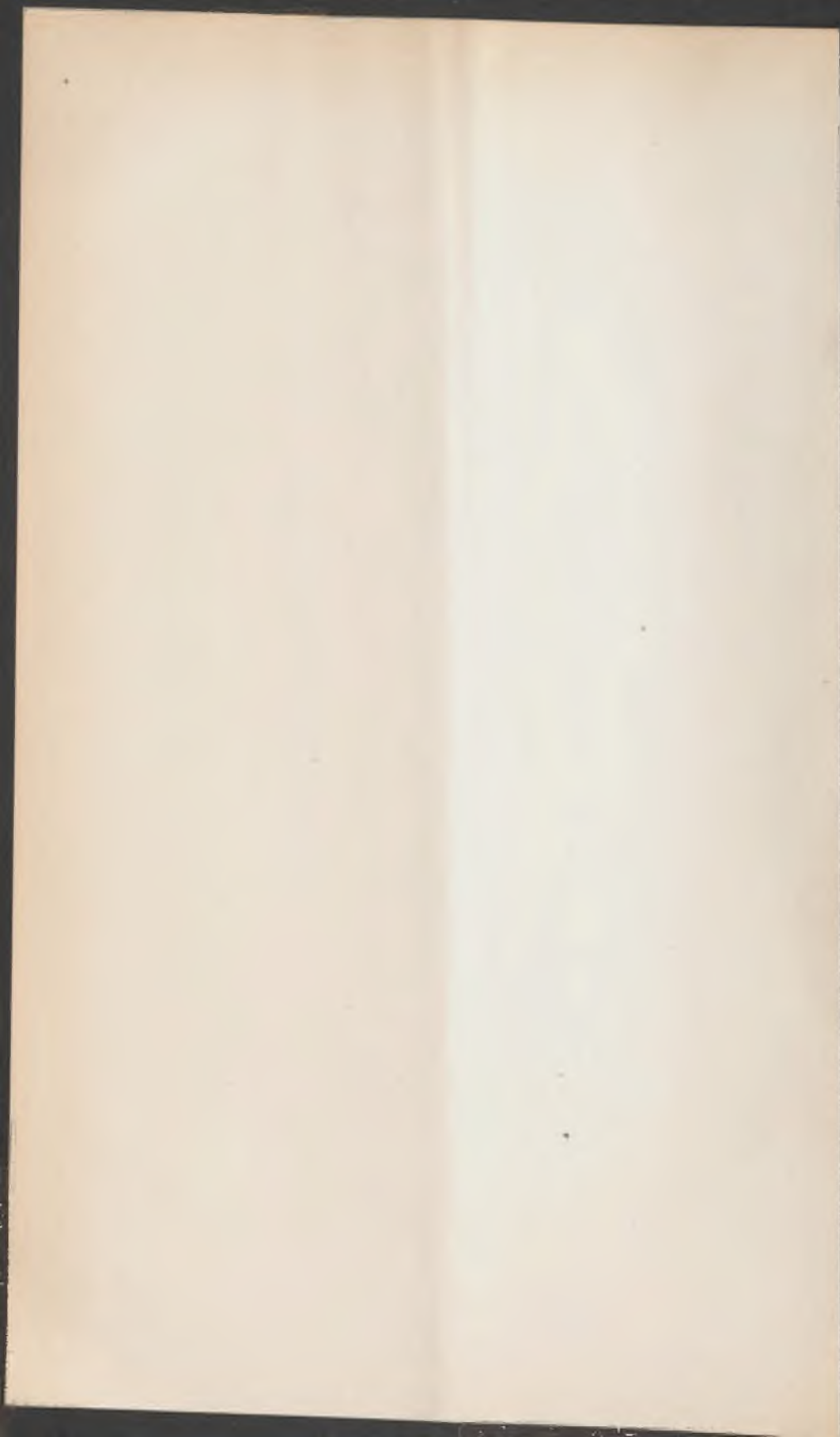
Besides these six, the Service has nine other manuscripts ready which are withheld from publication for lack of funds. The nine titles are: The influence of age and temperature on the potency of diphtheria antitoxin; The presence of an organism in the filtered water of Washington, D. C., agglutinated by the serum of typhoid fever patients; The effect of restricted diet and various diets upon the resistance of animals to certain poisons; The bleaching of flour, and the effect of various drugs upon the toxicity of nitrites; Some problems and facts concerning rabies; The solubilities of the organic acids and salts of the Pharmacopœia; Digest of comments on the Pharmacopœia, etc.; The action of light upon the eye, with special reference to the mercury arc as an artificial illuminant; The prevention of tuberculosis.

These topics are all of timely and practical medical interest, the ticks and fleas considered being those that are known to carry contagious disease. Such a congestion of medical literature has led the Secretary of the Treasury to ask Congress for a separate appropriation of \$50,000 to pay for printing for the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service for the fiscal year which will end June 30, 1911. Surely the results of the labors of this able corps of medical investigators should be published to the world.

Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia are completely mapped.
