NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a \* price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

## Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith, etc.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

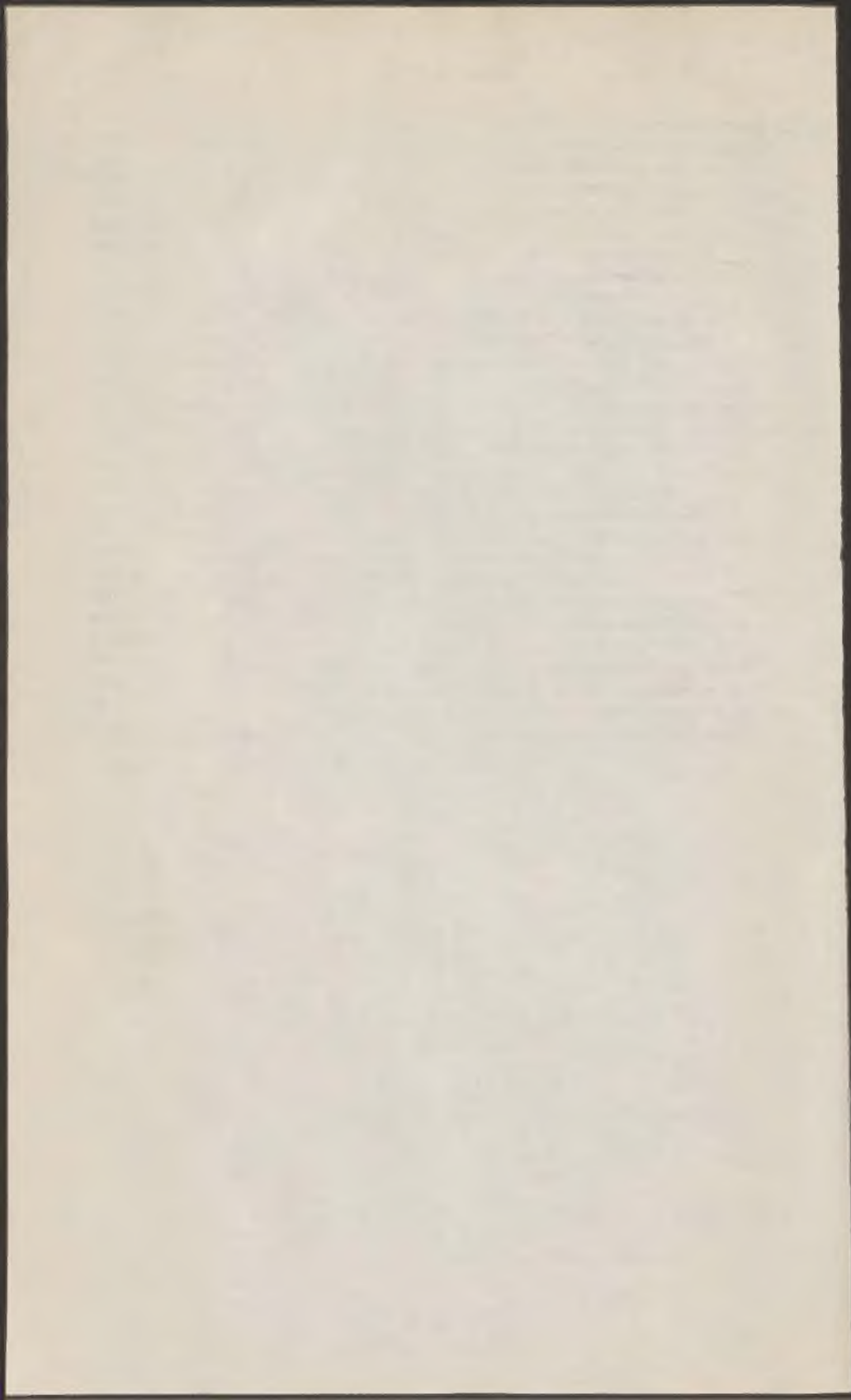

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25-percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record, Federal register, Supreme Court reports, Catalog of copyright entries, and Climatological data for United States, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

### PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

### WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

### HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (\*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 67, 75-1.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

### HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (\*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., by coupons, postal money

order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

*Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted.*

For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

#### TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check List of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a: So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23<sup>a</sup>: So 96<sup>a</sup> in a library.

#### LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, *not* to the Superintendent of Documents.

#### MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

#### INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

## NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

### NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART

For many years an art collection was administered in connection with the National Museum which finally became a separate unit under the Smithsonian Institution on July 1, 1920. This collection has always been known as the National Gallery of Art. That name has now been assigned, under the provisions of Public Resolution 14, 75th Congress, approved March 24, 1937, to the building and the collection of works of art given by the A. W. Mellon Educational and Charitable Trust to the Federal Government. That resolution provides that this bureau shall be under the Smithsonian Institution and that it shall be directed by a board to be known as the Trustees of the National Gallery of Art. The new National Gallery of Art is to be erected on Constitution Avenue in the District of Columbia and provision is made to prevent the introduction into the collection of inferior works of art by stipulating that no work of art shall be included in the permanent collection unless it be of similar high standard of quality to those in the collection acquired from the donor.

The existing bureau of the Smithsonian Institution now designated as a national gallery of art is to be known as the National Collection of Fine Arts. The earlier art collections of the Institution were partially destroyed by a disastrous fire which occurred in 1865, but the collection of paintings and other art works bequeathed in 1906 by Harriet Lane Johnston, mistress of the White House during President Buchanan's administration, was the first real impetus to the growth of the collection which will now carry this latter name. Since 1906 the national collections have increased rapidly, chiefly, however, through gifts and bequests of art works by patriotic citizens. There have also been many loans by artists and owners of valuable art objects which have served to augment the permanent collection. Numerous special exhibits have drawn lovers of art to this section of the Smithsonian Institution.

### UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMISSION

The issuance recently of a very attractive volume entitled *The Story of the Constitution* has served to call attention to the work of the United States Constitution Sesquicentennial Commission which was established by Public Resolution 53 of the 74th Congress, approved August 23, 1935, to prepare plans for the celebration of the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the formation of the Constitution. The volume referred to, as well as containing the Constitution itself, is a valuable source of information upon all subjects relating to the formation of the Constitution, being an ABC primer on the fundamental law and organization of the Government with an alphabetical analysis of the Constitution, the literal text of the Declaration of Independence and of Washington's "Farewell Address," questions and answers pertaining to the Constitution and a history of the Great Seal. It is said to be accurate in every detail and entirely devoid of any controversial matter. It is edited by Director General



Sol Bloom and has a special cover design by Howard Chandler Christy illustrating the signing of the Constitution. This volume is obtainable for 10c. by writing to the United States Constitution Sequicentennial Commission, Washington, D. C. There is also a "de luxe" edition bound in fabrikoid which is sold for \$1.00. These books are also being sold in chain stores, department stores, hotels, book stores, and Army and Navy supply agencies and are being distributed throughout the entire world under the American flag and on battle-ships and merchant vessels on the seas. By printing in large quantities the price has been placed within the means of the people and the objective will be achieved in getting them to the largest number of people.

#### THE WORLD WAR

In August 1931, a volume was issued by the Historical Section of the Army War College entitled *Order of Battle of United States Land Forces in World War, American Expeditionary Forces, Divisions*. That volume has now been designated as a second volume of a series of three issued for the purpose of making available an accurate digest of the principal facts concerning the participation of the larger organizations of the land forces of the United States Army in the World War. The volume which is named as first in the series has now been published and has to do with the organizations of the American Expeditionary Forces larger than a division—General Headquarters, Armies, Army Corps, Services of Supply, and separate forces. This volume is listed in this Monthly Catalog. A third volume is contemplated, dealing with organizations in the United States and containing appendices pertinent to the entire series. The work is based upon original sources, most of which are official documents of the War Department. Before publishing these volumes, drafts of their contents were forwarded to officers who participated in the operations, whose first-hand knowledge made their cooperation valuable, and their criticisms were examined and included in this work where justified. Controversial and personal factors have been purposely omitted.

## TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. Rural delivery routes are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,510 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows, in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A list of the county maps on file will be furnished upon application to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery routes emanating from post offices in counties for which county maps have not been drawn are shown on local maps. Blueprint copies of such maps are sold at 25 cents each. Orders for all postal maps should be accompanied by money order and addressed to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. NOTE.—With the publication of the first number of the printed Press releases on Oct. 5, 1929, the Department of State inaugurated a new publication program. The daily mimeographed releases are made available to the public weekly in printed form; also, all publications (except laws and treaties) are numbered consecutively in the order in which they are sent to press. Publications of a similar character are brought within well-defined series, and each series publication bears a series number in addition to its publication number. The diplomatic correspondence of the United States is published in the volumes entitled Foreign relations of the United States. Laws are issued in separate series and are numbered within each series in the order in which they are signed. Treaties are issued in a separate series and are numbered in the order in which they are proclaimed. Treaties are also published in the compilation Treaties and other international acts of the United States of America, which contains literal copies of the documents, followed by notes of a textual and procedural character. Indexes to the Press releases are supplied semiannually, as of December 31 and June 30. The Department of State includes in the Press releases series, each quarter, a complete list of its publications for the preceding quarter.

The list below frequently includes certain relevant publications issued by other agencies of the Government under requisition of the Department of State and certain relevant congressional documents.
