NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a (*) price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith, etc.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25-percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record, Federal register, Supreme Court reports, Catalog of copyright entries, and Climatological data for United States, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 67, 75-1.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., by coupons, postal money

order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted.

For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check List of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a : So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23^a : So 96⁴ in a library.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, *not* to the Superintendent of Documents.

MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

BINDING THE CATALOG

The Documents Office will soon issue an index to all entries in the twelve numbers of the Monthly Catalog, January to December 1937. A title page for the twelve numbers of the catalog will accompany the index. Duplicate numbers of the Monthly Catalog cannot be supplied.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

CONGRESSIONAL DOCUMENTS

The Numerical Lists and Schedule of Volumes of Reports and Documents of the 75th Congress, 1st session, January 5–August 21, 1937, has been issued by the Superintendent of Documents and the entry for it is recorded in this catalog. As was previously announced in connection with the issues for these lists for the 73d Congress, the consolidated index of congressional documents was discontinued with the Document Index for the 72d Congress, 2d session, by a ruling of the Joint Committee on Printing. Consequently, the publication here noted is the only distinct list of congressional documents of the 75th Congress, 1st session, which will be issued until the Document Catalog for the 75th Congress is published.

NATIONAL EMERGENCY COUNCIL

In the September 1937 Monthly Catalog, the Notes of General Interest recorded the fact that the President had abolished the National Emergency Council as of December 31, 1937. However, on December 27, 1937, the President issued Executive Order 7776, which modified the previous Executive Order 7709 A of September 16, 1937, so as to extend the date for the abolishment of the said National Emergency Council and for the transfer of its funds, records, and property to the Bureau of the Budget, to June 30, 1938, unless the said Council shall be sooner abolished by action of the President. It will be remembered that the Council was created by Executive Order 6433 A, dated November 17, 1933, and was reestablished by Executive Order 7073 of June 13, 1935.

The functions of the National Emergency Council have been (a) to provide for the orderly presentation of business to the President, (b) to coordinate interagency problems of organization and activity of Federal agencies, (c) to coordinate and make more efficient and productive the work of the field agencies of the Federal Government, (d) to cooperate with any Federal agency in performing such activities as the President may direct, and (e) to serve in an advisory capacity to the President and the Executive Director of the National Emergency Council. It has published and distributed the United States Government Manual, a textbook of authenticated information concerning the methods of operation followed by the various Federal Government units, and has carried on an Information Service making available general information concerning all phases of governmental activity.

PETROLEUM CONSERVATION DIVISION

The Petroleum Conservation Division was established as a division in the Interior Department by Administrative Order 1054 issued by the Secretary of the Interior on March 14, 1936, under the provisions of the act of February 22, 1935, to regulate interstate and foreign commerce in petroleum and its products by prohibiting shipment in such commerce of petroleum and its products produced in violation of State law. By provisions of this act, the law was to cease

to be in effect June 16, 1937. S. 790, 75th Congress (Public 145, approved June 14, 1937) amended the act so as to extend its provisions to June 30, 1939. By virtue of this act, the President has, by Executive Order 7756, dated December 1, 1937, prescribed the functions and duties of the Petroleum Conservation Division, the establishment of which he authorizes, to be: (1) to assist, in such manner as may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior, in administering the said act, (2) to cooperate with the oil- and gas-producing States in the prevention of waste in oil and gas production and in the adoption of uniform oil- and gas-conservation laws and regulations, and (3) to keep informed currently as to facts which may be required for the exercise of the responsibility of the President under sec. 4 of the said act.

UNITED STATES TOURIST BUREAU

The Secretary of the Interior authorized the establishment of the United States Tourist Bureau in the National Park Service of the Department of the Interior on February 4, 1937. The bureau's field office was opened at once in the Federal Courts Building, New York City, but these quarters were found unsuitable and in April 1937, it was moved to the Government-owned building at 45 Broadway. It is intended to stimulate a United States travel business that already has an annual volume estimated at something like \$5,000,000,000.

The objectives of the United States Tourist Bureau are: To promote increased travel within and to the United States by a public educational program describing the scenic, historic, recreational, climatic, and other tourist attractions; to increase international good will and understanding by encouraging foreign tourist and student groups to travel in the United States; to disseminate to the public the information obtained by the park, parkway, and recreational area study and from other sources relating to the availability of recreational areas and facilities in the United States; to cooperate with, and enter into agreements with, States and other agencies for the purpose of promoting travel to, and recreational use of, the national and State parks and other recreational areas in the United States and its Territories; to establish and maintain a complete file of information concerning recreation, recreational areas, both public and private, and travel for the use of publishers, reporters, authors, etc.; to cooperate with transportation lines in increasing tourist travel; to serve as a clearing house for the distribution of literature furnished by the States, Territories, and private agencies; to cooperate closely with various State and private organizations in the publication of literature and in the presentation of motion-picture travelogs and radio programs in English and foreign languages.

NOTE.—Many of the divisions of the Foreign and Domestic Commerce Bureau issue monthly statistical statements in processed form showing the exports or imports (and in some cases reexports) of various commodities. MARITIME COMMISSION

NOTE.—An agency to be known as the United States Maritime Commission was established under the provisions of H. R. 8555, 74th Congress (Public 835, approved June 29, 1936), to further the development and maintenance of an adequate and well-balanced American merchant marine, to promote the commerce of the United States, and to aid in the national defense. The same act dissolved the United States Shipping Board Merchant Fleet Corporation, directing that all records, etc., be taken over by the Commission, and transferred all the functions, powers, and duties vested in the former United States Shipping Board (later the Shipping Board Bureau under the Commerce Department) to the United States Maritime Commission. It also transferred to and vested in the Commission all the powers and duties now vested by law in the Postmaster General with respect to existing ocean-mail contracts.

Two of the publications listed below were prepared by the Maritime Commission, but since they belong to a volume of reports begun by the Shipping Board prior to the transfer of its functions to the Department of Commerce, the old classification, SB 1.10/a:, is retained in order that they may be filed with the other reports included in the volume.

TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. Rural delivery routes are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,510 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows, in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A list of the county maps on file will be furnished upon application to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery routes emanating from post offices in counties for which county maps have not been drawn are shown on local maps. Blueprint copies of such maps are sold at 25 cents each. Orders for all postal maps should be accompanied by money order and addressed to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery maps should not be confused with the State post route maps which are listed in the Monthly catalog for February 1937, page 213.

The papers issued in the series of Contributions to knowledge and Miscellaneous collections are not public documents, but are printed in limited editions at the expense of the Smithsonian Fund. They are distributed without charge to public libraries, educational establishments, and learned societies in this country and abroad; and are supplied to other institutions, and to individuals at the prices indicated. Remittances should be made payable to the 'Smithsonian Institution.' A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratuitously* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. The Institution maintains mailing-lists of public libraries and other educational establishments, but no *general mailing-list of individuals*. A library making application to be listed for Smithsonian publications should state the number of volumes which it contains and the date of its establishment, and have the endorsement of a Member of Congress." STATE DEPARTMENT

NOTE.—With the publication of the first number of the printed Press releases on Oct. 5, 1929, the Department of State inaugurated a new publication program. The daily mimeographed releases are made available to the public weekly in printed form; also, all publications (except laws and treaties) are numbered consecutively in the order in which they are sent to press. Publications of a similar character are brought within well-defined series, and each series publication bears a series number in addition to its publication number. The diplomatic correspondence of the United States is published in the volumes entitled Foreign relations of the United States. Laws are issued in separate series and are numbered within each series in the order in which they are signed. Treaties are issued in a separate series and are numbered in the order in which they are proclaimed. Treaties are also published in the compilation Treaties and other international acts of the United States of America, which contains literal copies of the documents, followed by notes of a textual and procedural character. Indexes to the Press releases are supplied semiannually, as of December 31 and June 30. The Department of State includes in the Press releases series, each quarter, a complete list of its publications for the preceding quarter.

The list below frequently includes certain relevant publications issued by other agencies of the Government under requisition of the Department of State and certain relevant congressional documents.


