Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate, measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e.g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith. Processed publications are not obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents and requests for them, if they are available, should be addressed to the issuing office.

Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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General Information

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25 percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record (daily issues and subscription), Supreme Court reports (bound volumes and subscription), Catalog of copyright entries, Climatological data (subscription, and all weather maps, including Weekly corn and wheat region bulletin, and Weekly weather and crop bulletin), Federal register (subscription), 1938 U. S. wall map, old Naval documents, and Writings of George Washington, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance

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The sales stock which amounts to more than 8 million, includes approximately 65,000 different titles. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

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A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

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In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly list of selected United States Government publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

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Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use and is not obtainable. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 72, 76-1.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

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For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Columbia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Newfoundland (including Labrador), Panama, or Venezuela. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

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The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check list of United States public documents, 1789–1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior or inferior number (the numbers immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers as superiors or inferiors in the Monthly catalog.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for many publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Card Division, Library of Congress, not to the Superintendent of Documents.

MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.50 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$2.10 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEX

An Index to the Monthly catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

Notes of General Interest

INFORMATION SERVICE

The Information Service, formerly under the National Emergency Council, is entered for the first time in this Monthly catalog as a subordinate division to the Government Reports Office. This change was effected by Public Resolution 20, 76th Congress, Reorganization Plan no. 2, which provided that all functions of the National Emergency Council other than those relating to Radio Service and Film Service were to be transferred to the Executive Office of the President.

The Information Service functions as a central clearing house for information on all phases of governmental activity, and furnishes to the public on request factual information on the structure and operations of the Federal departments and agencies.

NEW PERIODICAL

The Federal Loan Agency News, is the joint publication of the following agencies: Federal Housing Administration, Federal Home Loan Bank System, Home Owners' Loan Corporation, Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation, Reconstruction Finance Corporation, RFC Mortgage Company, Federal National Mortgage Association, Disaster Loan Corporation, Electric Home and Farm Authority, and Export-Import Bank of Washington.

This publication will attempt to explain and clarify the functions of the organizations falling under the Federal Loan Agency and provide readable information of interest to the public.

FEDERAL REGISTER


The bound volumes of the Federal Register, as such, subsequent to June 3, 1938, have been discontinued. Regulatory material appearing in the daily issues of the Federal Register after June 1, 1938, will appear in the various supplements to the Code of Federal Regulations. The material which appeared during the period June 1, 1938, through December 31, 1938, will appear in the first supplement to the Code and that material appearing in 1939 will be contained in the second supplement to the Code.

CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS

Under provisions of act of June 19, 1937 (Public no. 158, 75th Congress) a code of all executive and administrative "documents", rules and orders "of general applicability and legal effect", of "each agency" of the Federal Government, is required to be prepared and submitted to the President (sec. 11a) and, thereafter, at his direction, to be published and to be "prima-facie evidence of the text of such documents and of the fact that they are in full force and effect" (sec. 11c); in carrying out this purpose, the Congress has provided that "each agency of the Government" within the executive and administrative branches is required to prepare and file with the Administrative Committee of the Federal Register, not later than July 1, 1938, a "complete codification" of all such documents which "are in force and effect and relied upon by the agency as authority for, or invoked or used by it in the discharge of, any of its functions or activities" (sec. 11a).

Volume 1 of the Code has not yet been printed; volume 2 was entered in the Monthly catalog for December 1939, page 1723; and volume 3 is entered in this January 1940 Monthly catalog, for which see National Archives, Federal Register Division. Supplements have not yet been issued.

The scales most commonly used are 1:31,650, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding approximately to 1/2 mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

Note.—A list of post route maps, prepared primarily for the postal service but available to the public, is given below. New editions are published about once a year. Each of these maps shows all post offices within the State and indicates how each is supplied with mail. County boundaries are shown and each county is named, but only the principal drainage features are delineated. These maps show no highways and only such railroads as carry mail. The maps listed at 60 cents each are single-sheet maps; those priced at \$1.20 are 2-sheet maps.

Rural delivery routes are not indicated on the post route maps, but are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1.92.500 or 1.63.360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1.550 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows, in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage.
