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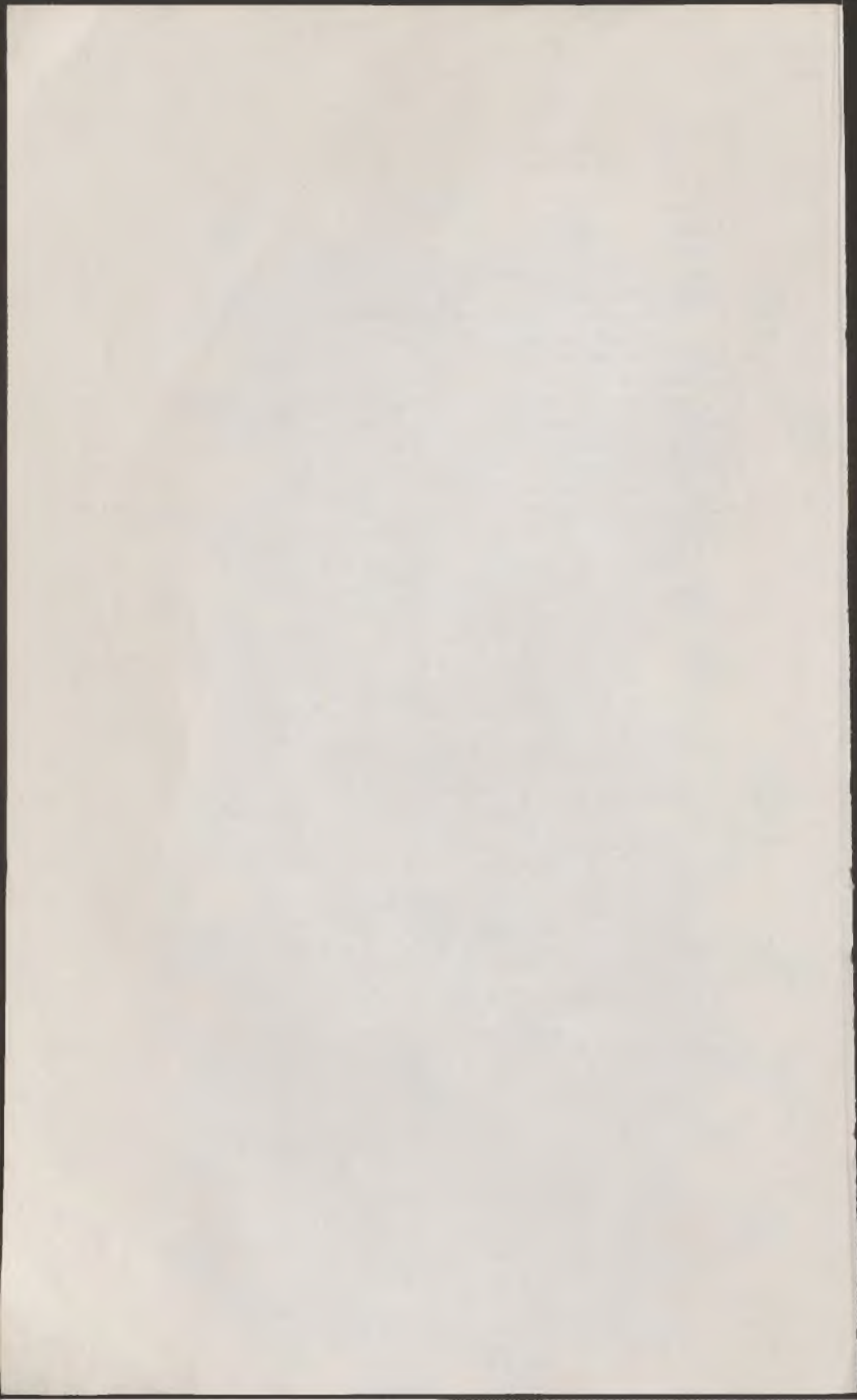

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

NEW GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

The Federal Interdepartmental Safety Council was established by Executive Order 8071 of March 21, 1939, to act as an official advisory agency in matters relating to the safety of Federal employees. The Council shall consist of such officers and employees of the various Executive departments and agencies of the Federal Government and of the Government of the District of Columbia as may be designated by the respective heads thereof. The members of the Council shall serve without additional compensation.

The council shall, without entailing additional expense to the Federal Government, act as a clearing house for accident prevention and health conservation information, and shall make recommendations and prepare forms relating to safe practices and procedures. The Council shall also, on request, conduct surveys or such other investigations as may be deemed necessary to reduce accident hazards, and shall report the results of such surveys and investigations to the head of the department or agency concerned, together with its recommendations.

The general policy of the Council shall be determined by a Board consisting of the Secretary of Labor (who shall act as chairman), the Secretary of the Treasury, the Secretary of the Navy, the Secretary of War, the Postmaster General, the Secretary of the Interior, the Secretary of Agriculture, and the heads of such other departments or agencies as the above-named members shall determine should have representation thereon.

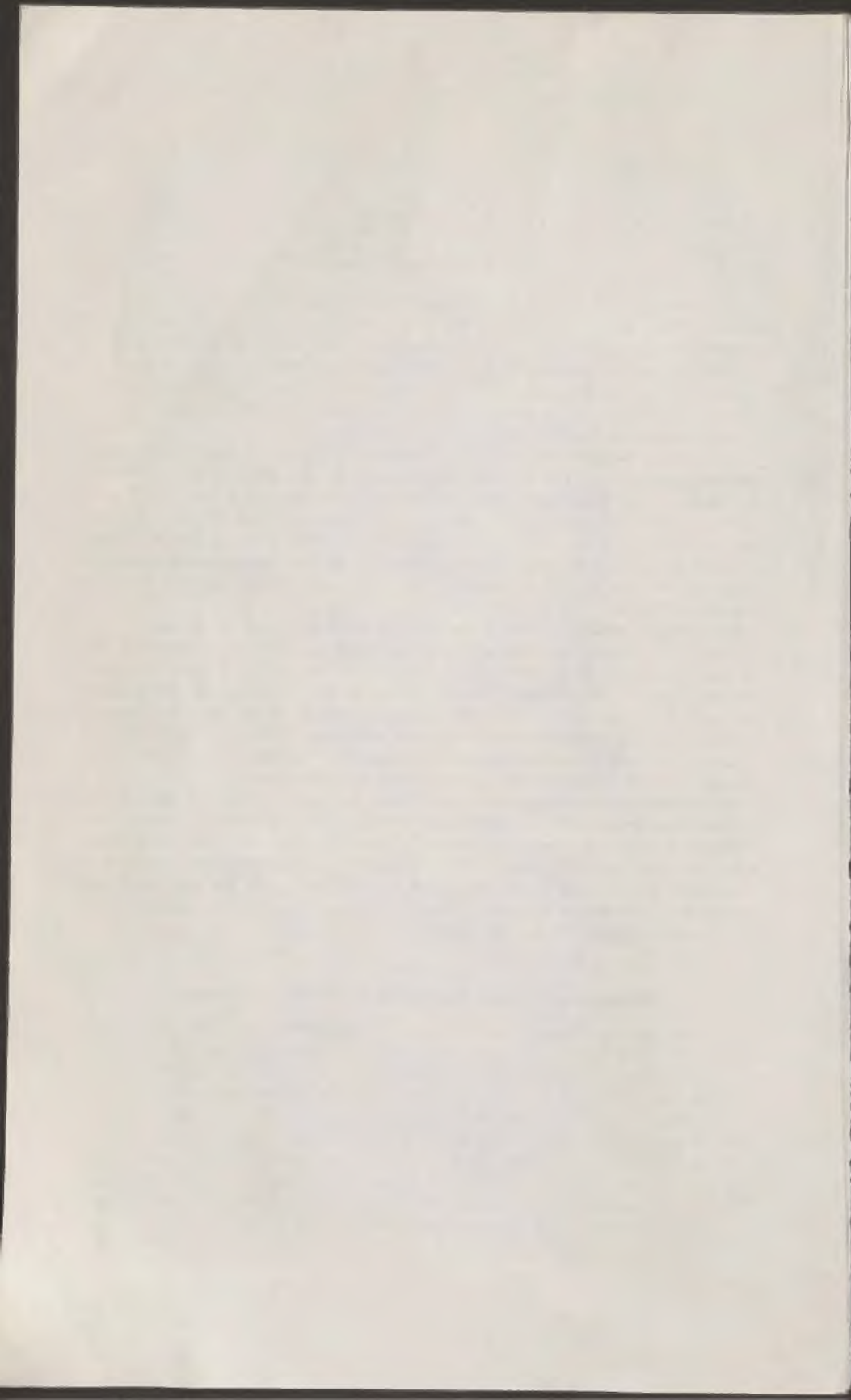
The Division of Labor Standards, Department of Labor, is requested to cooperate with the Council in the performance of its functions.

The Sugar Administration was established by the Secretary of Agriculture in office Memorandum 783, dated October 6, 1938, to become effective on and after October 16, 1938. However, amendment 1, dated October 15, 1938, changed the name to the Sugar Division. This Division is authorized and directed to administer the provisions of the sugar act of 1937, and the personnel and functions of the Sugar Section of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration are transferred to the Sugar Division.

TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. Rural delivery routes are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,550 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A list of the county maps on file will be furnished upon application to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery routes emanating from post offices in counties for which county maps have not been drawn are shown on local maps. Blueprint copies of such maps are sold at 25 cents each. Orders for all postal maps should be accompanied by money order and addressed to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. STATE DEPARTMENT
