Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 60th Congress, 2d session, is to be understood.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

It sometimes happens that when a public document is issued in 2 parts the 2d part appears before the 1st. This is the case with the special report of the Census Bureau on Marriage and divorce, 1867-1906. This part contains the statistical tables for the 40-year period from which the startling, and even shocking, advance newspaper notices of the amazing prevalence of divorce in this country were derived. The statistics have been collected directly from the records at the county-seats throughout the country, all of which were visited by agents of the Census Bureau. Part 1 will discuss the character and significance of the statistics.

A new edition of Farmers' bulletin 137, devoted to publicity for that popular naturalized citizen, the Angora goat, is among the month's offerings.

Conventions with foreign countries have been ratified and made public since the latest former issue of the monthly catalogue as follows: Arbitration, China, Peru, and Portugal; Naturalization, Brazil, Honduras, Portugal, and Uruguay; Parcel-post, Austria. Also the important convention between the United States and 39 other powers for the establishment of a permanent International Institute of Agriculture, the seat of which is in Rome, has been printed in French and English.

Magnesite deposits in California are the subject of a new bulletin of the Geological Survey, no. 355.

Among the most useful publications of the Government bureaus are those giving complete and authoritative lists of their own publications. The latest issue of this kind is from the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service, whose publications, always important, have now become numerous.

Hydrographic Office Publication 100 gives all available nautical information concerning the Gulf and River St. Lawrence and H. O. Publication 102 does the same service for the North Atlantic islands and the African coast. A 3d edition has just been issued of 100 and a 4th edition of 102.

The pamphlet edition of President Roosevelt's last annual message has as an appendix 9 full-page photographic plates illustrating the baleful effects of forest denudation and soil erosion in China.

This is the day of indexes. A useful new one is Circular 17, Plant Industry Bureau, which indexes all the papers relating to plant industry that have been printed in the 14 numbers of the Yearbook of Department of Agriculture.

The Annual report of commissioner of patents, 1906, is only now issued in its permanent bound form. The report is merely a few pages, but the annual index to the Official gazette which follows it and is bound up with it is a massive publication of 1197 pages.

Volume 26, Official opinions of Attorneys-General, is a December publication.

The new List of wireless-telegraph stations seems like a marvel. The invention is but an affair of yesterday, and already its stations belt the world. The list, which is issued by the Equipment Bureau, Navy Department, gives all available information about the stations, their location, call-numbers, character of service, etc.

Plant Industry Bulletin 132 is Inventory 13 of Seeds and plants imported from foreign countries for experimental purposes by the Agriculture Department, July, 1906-Dec. 1907. The mere list of the importations fills 192 pages.

The annual report of the Agriculture Department's Publications Division shows that during the fiscal year 1908 the Department issued nearly 17,000,000 copies of its publications.

The Report of commissioner of fisheries, 1908, has a strong passage on the necessity for the conservation of fishery resources and the indifference of many of the State legislatures to this important subject.

Three new national forests have been created—in North Dakota the Dakota forest, and in Florida the Choctawhatchee and Ocala forests.

One of the most important and interesting of all the Government's annual reports is that of the Experiment Stations Office on the agricultural experiment stations throughout the country, each State and Territory having at least one and some of them several. The amount of good these stations are doing in promoting scientific agriculture is incalculable, but some insight into it may be gained by reading this report.

Few subjects should be of more interest to good American citizens than the welfare and advancement of the millions of people in our noncontiguous possessions. One way to show this interest is to read the Report of chief of Bureau of Insular Affairs.

Small arms firing regulations, edition of 1908, is now available for distribution.

Hygienic Laboratory Bulletin 46 is the life history of Hepatozoon perniciusum, an ultramicroscopic beast of prey which should be encouraged because of the havoc it works with the health of rats.

Farmers' bulletin 339, a December issue, tells the story of Alfalfa, that wonderful forage plant which has played a great part in promoting the prosperity of agriculture in the western half of the country.

Biological Survey Circular 67, issued Dec. 9, 1908, is a very complete exposition of the attitude of the courts toward the restrictive game laws which have been enacted by the United States and by nearly or quite all of the States.

Chemistry Bureau Bulletin 84, pt. 5, issued Dec. 23, 1908, reports Dr. Wiley's investigation of the use of formaldehyde as a food preservative. His final conclusion is sufficiently positive to leave no reader in doubt as to his meaning. It is "that the addition of formaldehyde to foods tends to derange metabolism, disturb the normal functions, and produce irritation and undue stimulation of the secretory activities, and therefore it is never justifiable."

Annual reports are rather numerous in the December catalogue. Each one of them has its own special public, and some of them interest the general public also.

Two very notable additions to the long and astonishingly comprehensive series of published addresses by President Roosevelt are his speeches at the unveiling of the Sheridan statue and at the opening of the St. Gaudens exhibition in the Corcoran Art Gallery.

Three new notes by Dr. W. R. Brinckerhoff, director of the Leprosy Investigation Station at Molokai, Hawaii, in pursuance of the leprosy investigations authorized by the act of Mar. 3, 1905, are published in one pamphlet by the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service.

A new annotated edition of the patent laws is announced.

There is a new print from the General Land Office of Statutes and regulations governing entries and proof under desert land laws, with suggestions to persons desiring to make entries under said laws.

International arbitration is the subject of the latest bibliographical list from the Library of Congress. The references are very numerous and fill 151 pages. This notice is printed on the cover: "For sale by the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office." This will doubtless save the Library the trouble and expense of writing many letters of explanation. Perhaps some other publishing offices will take the hint thus given.

Part 6 of the Annual List of merchant vessels, 1908, containing the official numbers and signal letters of all seagoing vessels of the United States, has just been issued.

The 1908 Report of the Isthmian Canal Commission is a most elaborate and comprehensive document, embracing 358 pages of text, a large-scale map of the Canal Zone, and 194 plates. The Superintendent of Documents has a few copies for sale, in paper covers, at \$1.50 a copy.

The International Waterways Commission has issued a 4th Progress report, Dec. 1, 1908.

A quaint and interesting manual just issued by the Quartermaster's Department, U. S. A., is Pack transportation, by Chief Packer Henry W. Daly, who is said to be the last of the old-time packers.

EARLY FRENCH DISCOVERIES IN THE NORTHWEST AND ON THE MISSISSIPPI

By act approved Mar. 3, 1873 (42d Cong. 3d sess., Stat. L. v. 17, p. 513), appropriation was made "To enable the Joint Committee on the Library to purchase and print a series of unpublished historical documents relating to the early French discoveries in the

Northwest and on the Mississippi, ten thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, the printing of the same to be under the direction of said committee." The Library Committee never published a report concerning the work which it was thus authorized to issue, but it is identified by references in the annual reports of the Librarian of Congress for 1874-77, 1881, and 1882. The reference in the report for 1875 (44th Cong. 1st sess., S. mis. doc. 31) follows: "The publication of the large and valuable selection of original French documents relating to the discoveries and explorations made in the northwestern portion of the United States and on the Mississippi, under the auspices of the French Government, from 1614 to 1752, was authorized by act of Congress of Mar. 3, 1873, under the direction of the Joint Committee on the Library. After some delays, the printing of these documents was commenced a few months since under the superintendence of Mr. Pierre Margry, a highly competent historical writer and archiviste of the department of the navy at Paris. The collection will form 6 octavo volumes, of about 600 pages each, and will embrace a great mass of hitherto unpublished papers, comprising letters and journals of early missionaries and other explorers, the first 3 volumes being devoted to the discoveries of Cavalier de La Salle and his companions. These documents, the first volume of which is nearly ready," etc. In his Report for 1876 (44th Cong. 2d sess., S. mis. doc. 27) the Librarian says that "the whole work will be embraced in 6 octavo volumes, with an atlas of maps in quarto. . . . The edition of these historical volumes being small, only 500 copies, it is recommended that, instead of a gratuitous distribution, the Librarian be authorized to exchange copies of the work with historical societies and other libraries for any books deemed equivalent in value." A letter from the Librarian of Congress, Apr. 15, 1901, states, "Mons. Margry died pending the completion of the atlas, and no atlas was issued in connection with the governmental edition. Dr. Spofford informs me that later one did appear in Paris in connection with a commercial edition." The work was printed in Paris, entirely in French, and there is nothing on it or in it to indicate that any branch of the Government of the United States was in any way engaged in its publication.

The following description of the work is reprinted from a circular issued by the Library of Congress:

The general title as above appears only on the covers and as half-title. The regular title-pages present the special titles of the separate volumes as given in contents below. The fine paper edition, 1879-88, with special introductions and extra maps, has cover (and half) title "Mémoires et documents pour servir à l'histoire des origines françaises d'outre mer" [etc.]

The Library of Congress has duplicate copies of the work mentioned above, available for exchange with other libraries. This is offered on the "priced exchange" at a valuation of \$20 for the set.

MURCHISON'S DIGEST

Three appropriations were made for the compilation and publication of Digest of decisions relating to Indian affairs, by Kenneth S. Murchison—June 10, 1896, \$3,000, June 7, 1897, \$2,000, and May 31, 1900, \$5,000. Volume 1, Judicial, was issued in a bureau edition, 1901, and in a Congressional document edition, 1903 (56th Cong. 2d sess., H. doc. 538, in v. 116, serial no. 4190). Volume 2 has not been issued, the Government Printing Office never having received the manuscript therefor. There is no present prospect that it will be issued. The serial number 4191 must therefore remain a blank in the "sheep set," and also the volume number 117 in the House documents, 56th Congress, 2d session. Mr. Murchison has not been in the Government service for several years and is reported to be in Oklahoma. The records of the Indian Affairs Office show that the amount of the first two appropriations, \$5,000, was paid to him, and that of the third appropriation, \$5,000, there was paid to the Government Printing Office \$3,173.80 for printing v. 1, and the balance, \$1,826.20 returned to the Treasury.

CHANGE IN DOCUMENT NUMBERING

Heretofore, while committee reports in both houses have been numbered for the whole Congress, no matter how many sessions may have been held, the Senate and House documents have begun a new set of numbers with each session, having thus at least two series for each Congress, frequently three series, and occasionally a fourth series issued by the Senate at a special session. By operation of law (34 Stat. L. 1014), this duplication of document numbers and volume numbers in the same Congress has now been done away with. In the 60th Congress the documents as well as the reports are numbered through the Congress, and the same rule has been followed by the State Department in issuing the separate or slip prints of the public and private laws and resolutions.

The first Senate document issued for the 60th Congress, 2d session, is numbered 538, the first House document is 988, the first public law 178, and the first public joint resolution 33. Under the old plan each of these would have been numbered 1. No private laws or resolutions for the current session have yet been published.

POPULARIZING PUBLIC DOCUMENTS

In a column headed "Library notes" in the issue for Nov. 26, 1908, of the *Clarkston Republic*, of Clarkston, Wash., appears the

following businesslike notice, which is commended, and like notices by librarians in their local papers are recommended:

The librarian wishes to call attention to a list of "Government documents for the people" which is posted in the library. Few publications are in greater demand or of more practical benefit to the people than these issued by the National Government which has thousands of scientists in its employ who are working to detect adulterations in foods or in seeds or in medicines; or to learn how to destroy or restrict the insect pests which injure vegetation; or the cheapest and best ways to improve the public roads; or how to detect and prevent disease; these and many more methods of adding to the national wealth and prosperity are diligently sought and studied by the Government's army of trained scientists. The result of the work of the scientists are published in books and pamphlets which are sold at the mere cost of publication.

Five, 10, or 25 cents will bring a valuable paper on "Fruits," "Tar and oil for road improvement," "Louisiana Purchase," "Apple worm," "Lime, sulphur, salt wash," "San Jose scale," and hundreds of other subjects.

When a demand for any of these publications is created the library will endeavor to supply them.

"Government documents for the people," otherwise Bulletin 13, Documents Office, is a pamphlet of 32 pages printed poster fashion for exhibition in public places. It has been sent to every postmaster in the United States, to thousands of secondary and normal schools, to the depository libraries and many other libraries, and to numerous individuals who have asked for it. Six of its pages are used up by "A little talk," in big type but not in big words, about the work of the Documents Office. The remainder of the space is taken up by "A select list" of about 350 titles of public documents covering an extensive variety of subjects and selected for their popular quality. Bulletin 13 has proved to be the most effective advertising matter yet put out by the Documents Office. Copies may be obtained by application to the Superintendent of Documents.

THE DAY OF THE DOCUMENT

We reprint in full an article by Ethel Dane Roberts entitled "The day of the document," which appeared in the Dec. 1908, issue of *Public Libraries*, p. 408:

The committee to investigate the use of government documents in spite of the imposing length of its title, started upon its mission a little dubiously; it returned in rare good humor. Enthusiasm in any field is a pleasant sight, but in the stubble-field of public documents it acquires quite a new value. Time was when the public document was a scorn and a derision, but the new thought, assisted by good indexes, is rapidly changing that attitude, and in centers of library civilization the once derided volume is now referred to, albeit a bit patronizingly, as a "useful tool."

There is one library the committee to investigate, etc., wots of, where it has really come into its own. "Public documents? Do we use them much? Do we? Why we use them all the time. They are the best things for reference work we have; and now they are sending us the unbound pamphlets as they come out, so we have material right up to date. Why, we can find anything in them, and lots of things we can't find anywhere else."

Now, this was a refreshing thing for the committee to hear on the last day of its occasionally tiresome investigations. It inspected with interest the piles of current pamphlets which lay within easy reach of the ref-

erence librarian's hand, some in pamphlet boxes labeled "Forestry," "Education," etc. "But," the enthusiast went on, patting the piled up sheets affectionately, "mostly we just look through them for what we want; it keeps us familiar with what is in them. Then we keep an index of our own, besides the official indexes, where we jot down notes on material under different heads. Only the other day a man came in who was on the eve of going to join a brother in a little-known part of Alaska. He wanted to find out all he could about the place in a hurry. In two minutes I found in my index a report on that very place which I had noted because of some good material in it about the use of dogs in Alaska. In five minutes to his unbounded surprise and undisguised admiration, he had a full detailed account of the place with excellent illustrations—the report of a scientific expedition and the only account of that region published. You never saw a more delighted individual. That sort of thing is happening all the time. And this pamphlet material is just a boon—absolutely up to date on all sorts of things of immediate interest." And so on. The committee to investigate the use of Government documents felt its mission had not been in vain, and feels it due to the profession that this part of its report should reach as many as possible.

INDEX TO NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The cumulative index to this number of the Monthly catalogue includes index entries for the Notes of general interest, July–Dec. 1908, and in future the "Notes" will be indexed in the Monthly catalogue as issued from month to month. There is no index to the "Notes" for the year from July, 1907, to June, 1908.

EARLIER DISTRIBUTION TO DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES

Beginning with the new year, this Office will send to the libraries, by unregistered mail, immediately on receipt from the Government Printing Office, all publications of current interest whose usefulness would be impaired by delay in sending. These publications will be invoiced later on in the regular Depository invoices, so that libraries may know what they should have received. The early sending of unbound Congressional publications will of course be also continued.

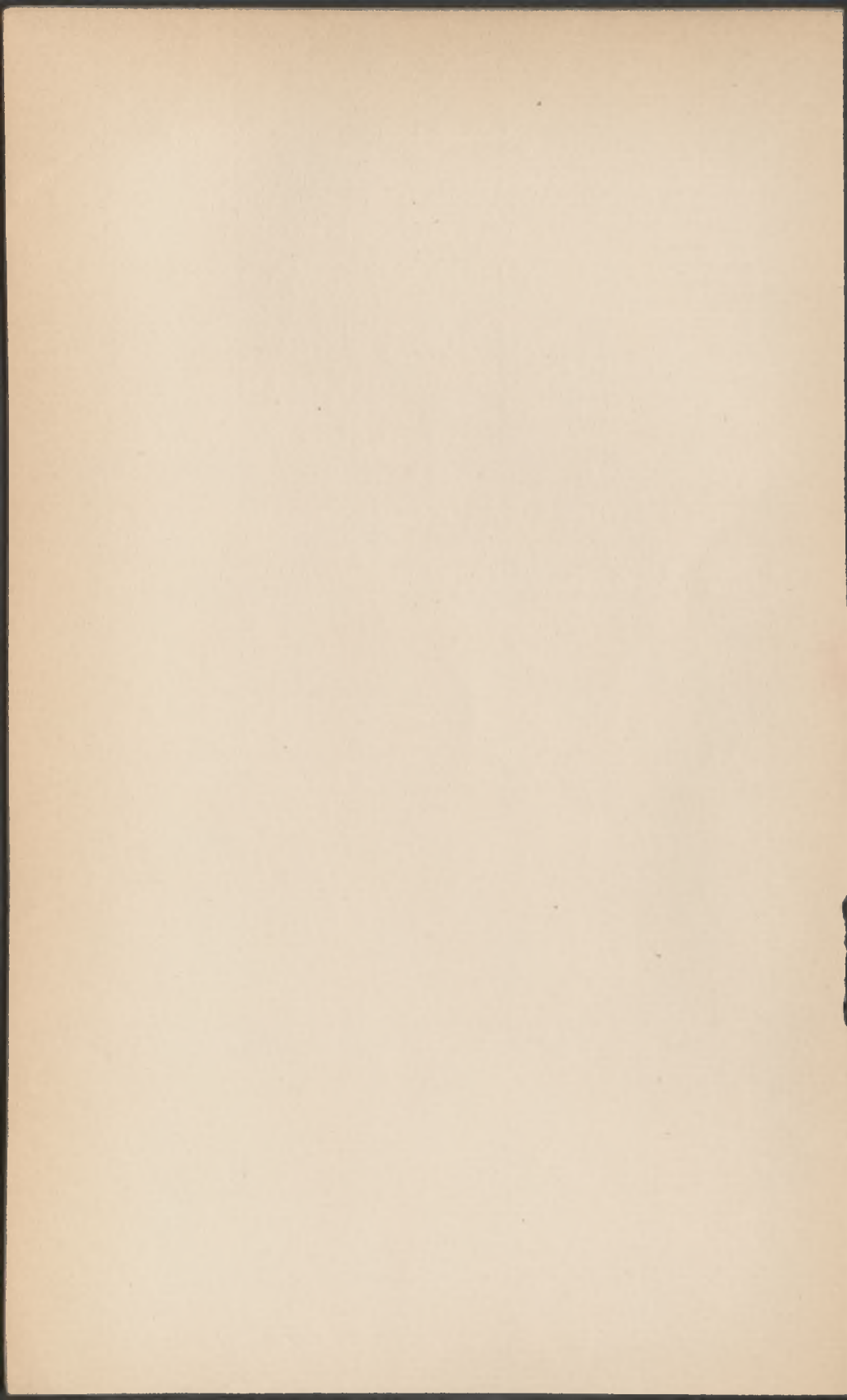

Three scales are used, 1:62,500, 1:125,000, and 1:250,000. These correspond, approximately, to 1 mile, 2 miles, and 4 miles to 1 linear inch on the map. The size, unless otherwise given, is about 17.5 inches in height by 11.5 to 16 inches in width, exclusive of the margin, the width varying with the latitude. A description of the topographic map is printed on the reverse of each sheet.

About one-third of the area of the country, excluding outlying possessions, has been mapped, nearly every State being represented. Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia are completely mapped.
