Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate, measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith. Processed publications are not obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents and requests for them, if they are available, should be addressed to the issuing office.

Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.



Benjamin Harrison Memorial Commission


Under the provisions of sec. 3 of Public law 352, 76th Congress, approved Aug. 9, 1939, the Benjamin Harrison Memorial Commission was appointed by the President, Jan. 15, 1940. The duty of the Commission, as prescribed in the law, was to consider and formulate plans for establishment of a permanent memorial in Indianapolis to the said Benjamin Harrison, 23d President of the United States.

Information Division

The Division of Information was established within the Office for Emergency Management by direction of the President, Feb. 28, 1941, and provides central informational service to the several agencies in the Office for Emergency Management.

Price Administration Office

The name of the Office of Price Administration and Civilian Supply was changed to the Office of Price Administration, by Executive order 8875 of Aug. 28, 1941. By the same order the functions of the Civilian Allocation Division, formerly a part of the Office of Price Administration and Civilian Supply, were transferred to the Office of Production Management.

Topographic quadrangle maps

NOTE.—The Geological Survey makes the contoured—i. e., the three-dimensional topographic maps of the country that are designed eventually to cover the whole United States, also Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. The individual maps are projected to represent quadrangle areas rather than political divisions, and each map is designated by the name of some prominent town or natural feature in the area mapped. The scales most commonly used are 1:31,680, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding approximately to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered varies with the latitude, but the average area of a quadrangle is 58, 230, or 920 square miles, respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by $16\frac{1}{2}$ inches

and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17½ inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. A general description of topographic maps and a list of the symbols used are printed on the reverse of each sheet.

About half of the continental area of the country, excluding Alaska, has been mapped, every State being represented. Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are completely mapped. Maps of the regular size are sold by the Geological Survey at 10c. each. Except as otherwise indicated, a discount of 40 percent is allowed on any order which amounts to \$5.00 at the retail price. TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

Remittances should be made payable to the 'Smithsonian Institution.' A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes, and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom are distributed gratuitously by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.
