Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 63d Congress, 1st session, is to be understood.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions and, unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give the name of the issuing Department, Bureau, or Division, and title. If publication is numbered give number also. Do not order by Library of Congress card number.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over a million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that many of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

No general price-list of public documents is available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, Resident Commissioner, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the

cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and $\frac{7}{16}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. **Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress.** Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

INDEX

Beginning with July, 1913, an Index to the Monthly catalogue will be issued at the end of the fiscal year, June, 1914. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from July, 1913, to June, 1914, and can be bound with those numbers as an index for the volume. NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Bulletin 45, American Ethnology Bureau, Chippewa music, by Frances Densmore, was sought by many persons and aroused an active interest. This is likely to be increased by the issue of a second and final study of the same subject as Bulletin 53, cloth, price 60 cents. The melodic and rhythmic analysis of the songs, which was begun in the first work, is developed more extensively in the second, which is also illustrated by many photographic plates.

The revised regulations for the protection of migratory birds, with President Wilson's proclamation on the subject, are found in Bulletin 22 of the Agriculture Department, edition of Oct. 15, 1913, price 10 cents. The same bulletin gives a compend of the Game laws for 1913.

Nov. 11, 1913, the United States Geological Survey sent the manuscript of its Water-supply paper 337 to the Public Printer, with a request to make the printing special and "rush to the limit," subject to a 20-per-cent. extra charge. This was because of "the urgent need for prompt publication of this report," the title of which is *The effect of ice on stream flow*.

Bulletin 43, series of 1913, Education Bureau, Agriculture and rural life day, is now for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, at 10 cents per single copy, \$7.00 a hundred, \$30.00 for 500, \$45.00 for a thousand copies. It is a collection of literary material suitable for use in celebrating the annual holiday commemorative of the pleasures and hopes of rural life.

The Secretary of Commerce has announced that on account of the scarcity of foxes and land otters in the Afognak Reservation, Alaska, caused largely by the recent volcanic activities in that region, it is hereby ordered that the pursuit, capture, or killing of foxes in that reservation shall be unlawful until Nov. 16, 1918, and the pursuit, capture, or killing of land otters shall be unlawful until Nov. 16, 1915. It is left open to surmise whether the volcanic convulsions killed these fur-bearing animals or merely scared them away.

The Public Health Service is printing and reprinting of late many of its popular bulletins on various diseases and their prevention. These bulletins are scientific in the sense that they are the work of trained scientific investigators, but they are popular in the sense that they are expressed in the common speech of the people and readily to be understood by everybody. Among the subjects of new publications or new editions now current are: Tuberculosis, its predisposing causes; Tuberculosis, its nature and prevention; Whooping cough; Measles; Country schools and rural sanitation; Antimalarial measures for farmhouses and plantations; What the local health officer can do in prevention of typhoid fever; Relation of climate to treatment of pulmonary tuberculosis; The citizen and the public health; Malarial fevers, prevalence and distribution in Alabama; Pellagra. All of these (and others from the same source) are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, and the price in nearly all cases is 5 cents.

Agriculture Department Bulletin 27 has for title: *Bouillon cubes, their contents and food value compared with meat extracts and home-made preparations of meat*. The conclusions arrived at are not favorable to the claims set up by the promoters of the cubes. 5 cents.

No. 2 of the Journal of agricultural research has been published. It contains five technical papers with illustrations.

Teachers especially will be interested in the Education Bureau's Bulletin 41, series of 1913, The reorganization of secondary schools. It is a preliminary statement by the chairmen of committees of the National Education Association. 10 cents.

Agriculture Department Bulletin 36 is the first contribution of the Markets Office to the published literature of agriculture. Its title is Studies of primary cotton market conditions in Oklahoma. 5 cents.

The decisions of the Interstate Commerce Commission, in the slip form, unbound, have formerly carried on their face the Opinion number. This has now been dropped, the last published Opinion number being 2444.

The series of Technical papers of the Mines Bureau has reached 50 numbers and is still growing rapidly. No. 50, Metallurgical coke, summarizes the history of coke-making in the United States. Price, 25 cents.

Bibliography of State participation in the Civil War, 1861-66, is a third edition, very much enlarged, of Subject catalogue no. 6 of the War Department Library, first issued in 1897 under the title Military literature in the War Department Library relating to the participation of the individual States in the War for the Union. The second edition, 1899, was issued under the same title. The first edition had 203 pages, the second, 266 pages, and an Appendix of 103 pages was issued in 1904. The third edition, now published, has 1140 pages, and comprehends all the previous prints as well as numerous titles not given before. It also presents a variety of new numberings. At the top of the title-page are these legends: War Department, Office of the Chief of Staff, War College Division, General Staff, no. 19. In the middle of the title-page: War Department Library, subject catalogue no. 6, third edition. On the back of the title-page: War Department, document no. 432, Office of the Chief of Staff. It is, however, not at all necessary for any citizen wanting the book to call for it by all these varying numbers and designations. The citizen may take his choice, with a reasonable certainty that any one of the set of names or numbers will be sufficient to identify it. Price, 75 cents, Office of Superintendent of Documents.

Many library-loving persons will be glad to know that the Library of Congress has completed and published in its Classification series a revised edition of that very important class, E-F, America. It is for sale by the Superintendent of Documents at 40 cents.

The Senate report on the banking and currency bill (H. 7837) was at first printed as Report 133, pts. 1, 2, and 3. Part 1 was Senator Owen's report, very brief and formal, Part 2 was the "Views" of Senators Owen, O'Gorman, Reed, Pomerene, Shafroth, and Hollis, these 2 parts with an Appendix filling 107 pages. Part 3 was Senator Hitchcock's "Views," signed also by Senators Nelson, Bristow, Crawford, McLean, and Weeks, 24 pages. There is a second print, in which all three are stitched together and paged continuously, 132 pages. The original Report number, 133, is retained.

Agriculture Department Bulletin 29, a contribution from Plant Industry Bureau, title, Crew work, costs, and returns in commercial orcharding in West Virginia, will interest many others as well as West Virginians. Though fruit growing on a commercial scale is not an old story in the mountain State, it is already of much importance. Mr. J. H. Arnold, author of Bulletin 29, says that commercial orcharding is "one of the most highly developed enterprises illustrating the principle of farm management." The orchards studied are in the mountainous section of West Virginia, in the basin of the Potomac, where during the past 10 years not less than 2,500,000 fruit trees have been

set out. Probably most of these have been planted during the past four years. Very full details of methods and costs in the growing and gathering of the crop are given in the bulletin. 5 cents.

Price list 58, of the Superintendent of Documents' series, 1st edition, just issued, takes up a subject not heretofore treated in these lists. This subject is Mines and mining. The list fills 17 pages, containing about 300 titles. It is only recently that the public documents properly falling under this classification have become sufficiently numerous to warrant publishing a separate list of them. Present prospects are, however, that at no distant day Mines and mining may be one of the largest of the public documents price lists. The Mines Bureau did not begin operations until July 1, 1910, but from that date it has been an exceedingly fertile publisher.

The Annual register of the United States Naval Academy for its 69th academic year is now available in the sales stock of the Superintendent of Documents. Price, 15 cents.

The Annual report of the commissioner of patents for the calendar year 1912, carrying with it the index to the Patent Office Official gazette for the same year and making a book of nearly 1200 pages, the report filling 8 pages, the index 1164 pages, is now ready. From the Superintendent of Documents, in paper covers, \$1.00; in canvas binding, \$2.00.

The Interstate Commerce Commission has published the 1st issue, effective Jan. 1, 1914, of its Uniform system of accounts for telegraph and cable companies, exclusive of wireless telegraph companies. 10 cents.

Agriculture Department Bulletin 28, Experiments in bulb growing at the United States bulb garden at Bellingham, Wash., covers new ground. The results of the experiments there thus far are highly satisfactory. This is a practical matter in view of the fact that we now import from Europe flower bulbs at a cost of more than a million dollars annually. Price of the bulletin, 5 cents.

Technologic papers 16 of the Standards Bureau, entitled, Manufacture of lime, is one of the most important of recent Government publications. The need of exact information on this subject has been great. Price of the paper, 25 cents.

The Experiment station record has dropped its series of whole numbers, the last one being 1548 on the abstract number issued Sept. 2, 1913. The Publications Division, Agriculture Department, has also dropped its whole numbers. Every superfluous number dropped from a public document increases its value by making its use simpler and less difficult.

The compilation of Part 1, Metals, of Mineral resources for the calendar year 1912 has been completed and the large volume is in press.

Works of art in the United States Capitol building, including biographies of the artists, has been published as Senate document 169, 63d Congress, 1st session—and as a Senate document only, no provision having been made for extra copies, for which there will probably be considerable demand. The works listed number 209. No attempt is made at artistic valuation of them. The artists of whom brief biographies are given are 145 in number. Most of them were long since forgotten, and regain through this pamphlet of 96 pages their only—and very slender—hold on immortality. Real industry must have been employed in digging up so much information concerning persons so obscure. The number of famous artists represented in the Capitol is small indeed. This publication is entered under Capitol Building and Grounds Superintendent.

Vol. 42, Immigration Commission's Report, announced to be a general index, is not to be published.

Farmers' bulletin 563 is the 3d issue in the series entitled Agricultural outlook.

Vol. 1, American Historical Association report, 1911, has just been issued. Price in paper covers, 60 cents; in cloth binding, 75 cents.

Vol. 5 of the final reports of the thirteenth census is out of press and for sale at \$1.40. Its title is: Agriculture, 1909-10, general report and analysis.

That very interesting volume issued by the Treasury Department transmitting Estimates of appropriations required for the service of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1915, was ready, as it always is, for the opening of the session of Congress, Dec. 1. No book is studied in Washington with deeper interest than this.

Special agents series 76, Foreign and Domestic Commerce Bureau, is in press and will probably be on the market by the time this note reaches the reader. Its title is: Commerce and industries of Canada and Newfoundland. Price, 10 cents.

Erratum: Monthly catalogue of public documents, Oct. 1913, page 154. 3d paragraph from the bottom, instead of "Commerce Court" read "Court of Customs Appeals." This court is still in active operation and its decisions are all published in the weekly Treasury decisions.

A BIG UNDEERTAKING

President Taft swept the whole collection of 4th-class postmasters into the classified service without inquiry as to their qualifications. Propositions were brought up to sweep them all out again. But President Wilson has adopted a middle course. He has not swept the 4th-class postmasters out, but he has required them to demonstrate their fitness to stay in by taking an examination.

As the 4th-classers number many thousands, this course puts upon the Civil Service Commission probably the largest task that has ever fallen to its lot. The Commission has published its Form 2060 in a different edition for each State, giving schedules of places where examinations will be held and lists of the post offices which are to be filled as a result of these examinations.

The work of examining will begin Jan. 10, 1914.

THIS YEAR'S BLUE BOOK

The United States Official register (blue book) is really due Dec. 1 in each odd-numbered year, but this year it has been slightly delayed because of the wish to bring it more nearly up to date. According to the precedents of the last 97 years (the first number having been issued in 1816), the statistics are those of the end of the fiscal year in which the Register is issued. For many years this has been June 30. This year the record will be improved upon by including all important changes in the public service up to Nov. 15, 1913.

This has delayed the publication, but not greatly. At the time of writing the work is well advanced, and publication before the end of December is announced as a certainty.

This year's Official register will be in one volume. Congress having ordered the discontinuance of vol. 2, which for many years past has contained the names and other particulars concerning postal officials and employees.

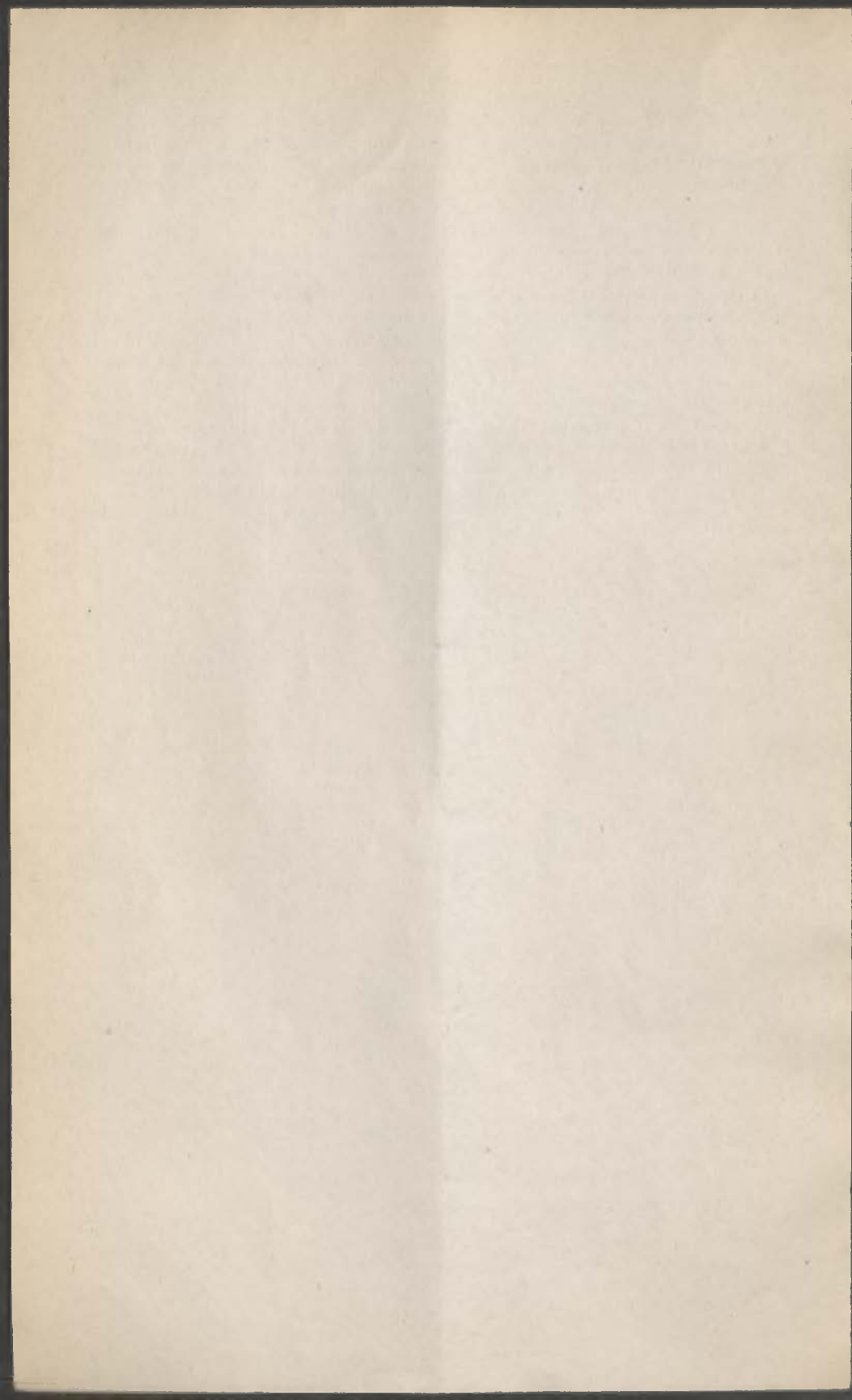
RURAL CREDITS AND COOPERATION

A very important work now in press is designated as Senate document 214, 63d Congress, 1st session, and will make nearly 1000 pages, royal octavo. It will contain the first part of the joint report of the United States Commission,

appointed by President Wilson, and the American Commission, appointed by Governors of States and commercial bodies and assembled by the Southern Commercial Congress, both commissions having for purpose the acquirement of knowledge concerning the methods of agricultural cooperation and credit which have been successfully worked out in European practice.

This document will present the evidence gathered in Europe by the two commissions, which acted jointly. This evidence consists of reports of the hearings held by the commissions and their various subcommittees in many countries and of translations from several languages of constitutions, regulations, and other documents of the various successful cooperative associations which lent cordial assistance to the commissions during their stay abroad the past summer. It is thus a compend of first-hand knowledge on a subject in which a lively interest is felt throughout this country, but which has been much more maturely worked out in the older countries than here.

The discussion of this knowledge by the members of the two commissions and such recommendations as they may choose to make in their official reports remain to be printed later, in a separate volume which will be very much smaller than the first. Part 1 is estimated to contain 90 to 95 per cent. of the whole.
