NOTES OF

GENERAL INTEREST

New topographic map sheets for the month are of Agra, in Oklahoma; Blalock Island, in Oregon and Washington; Calhoun, in Kentucky; Four Oaks, in North Carolina; Las Vegas, in Nevada and California; Lewiston, in Maine; Loveland, in Colorado; Rochester, in Michigan; Shoshone Lake, in Yellowstone Park and Wyoming; Waukegan, in Illinois and Wisconsin; and Youngstown, in Ohio and Pennsylvania. Each map is named after some prominent place in its area, but the area mapped extends many miles beyond the point from which the name is derived. All of these new maps are parts of the great topographical map of the United States upon which the Geological Survey has been engaged for many years.

An Executive proclamation of date June 15, 1908, sets aside and reserves from settlement "all unpatented public lands of the United States lying within 60 feet of the boundary line between the United States and the Dominion of Canada."

Conventions providing for arbitration of differences between this country and Great Britain and Spain are published.

The report of the United States representative, W. I. Buchanan, on the Central American Peace Conference, held in Washington, Nov. 13-Dec. 20, 1907, is now just published.

That standard statistical work, Foreign commerce and navigation of the United States, is now just issued for 1907.

The Statistics Bureau, Agriculture Department, is issuing a series of bulletins showing the statistics for the forty years, 1866-1906, concerning the crops of corn, wheat, oats, barley, rye, buckwheat, potatoes, and hay. The potato, buckwheat, and rye crops are this month's contributions.

That wonderfully varied and useful series, the Farmers' bulletins of the Agriculture Department, has reached its 324th number with a treatise upon the cultivation of the sweet potato.

Chemistry Bureau Bulletin 113 discusses an interesting subject, "Injury to vegetation and animal life by smelter wastes."

The little book of information for immigrants seeking naturalization is being issued in many languages. This month's issues are in Bohemian, Croatian, Danish-Norwegian, German, Greek, Slovenian, and Swedish.

The Bibliography Division of the Library of Congress issues two new lists of books, one of publications on corrupt practices in elections, the other on workingmen's insurance.

Technical series 15 of the Entomology Bureau comprehensively considers that troublesome and injurious family, the Ixodoidea or ticks.

A new set of regulations for the manufacture, sale, and use of denatured alcohol has been published by the Internal Revenue Commissioner.

The Geological Survey publishes a new map of the coal fields of the United States with statistical and descriptive text.

The Coast Survey's volume of Tide tables for 1909 has been issued.

The Agriculture Department offers an interesting contrast this month by publishing the annual reports for 1907 of the two experiment stations most widely separated by climatic conditions—one situated in Hawaii, the land of perpetual summer, the other in Alaska, the land of almost perpetual winter. The reports indicate that both stations are flourishing and that both are growing bountiful crops, though there are, of course, great differences in the kinds of plants grown. Both reports are generously and instructively illustrated.

The Education Bureau has found occasion for the issue of a second edition of its Bulletin on Agricultural education (no. 2 of 1907).

Special consular reports, v. 40, pt. 2, fills 144 pages with information from all parts of the world about Motor machines.

DOCUMENT CATALOGUE

The Document catalogue of the 58th Congress is at last completed and will appear very shortly. It covers the period between July 1, 1903, and June 30, 1905, and will be larger than any of the previous volumes, as it contains 1,581 pages. On account of its size, an effort is being made by the Government Printing Office to obtain a thinner paper for it in order to make it easier for the user to handle.

ADVANCE SHEETS OF THIRD EDITION OF CHECKLIST OF UNITED STATES PUBLIC DOCUMENTS

Advance sheets for the several bureaus and offices of the Department of Agriculture have now been issued, 33 classes comprising a complete set for the Department.

The sheet for the American Republics Bureau has also been distributed. The publications of this Bureau are listed in a single number.

Nine of the 16 issues for the Department of Commerce and Labor are now (July 3, 1908), in press, and 2 of the classes have already been issued.

This Office is sending out copies of the Advance sheets to the bureaus concerned for their criticisms, and from time to time we are receiving in reply additional information which will be incorporated in the permanent Checklist. We wish to express here our appreciation of such cooperation on the part of Government officials and librarians.

We have a regular mailing list for the Advance sheets, and all sets as distributed should be complete. If, however, any numbers have gone astray, the missing ones may be obtained by application to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.

MONROE DOCTRINE

The Documents Office occasionally receives a request for "The Monroe doctrine," as if it were a volume or a pamphlet which might be passed out like an army register or a consular report. As a matter of fact, there is no such official publication as "The Monroe doctrine." The phrase has gradually grown into popular usage to designate a national principle which was formulated in a few diplomatically-phrased lines in the message sent to the 1st session of the 18th Congress, Dec. 2, 1823, by President James Monroe. He did not call it a "Doctrine" nor designate it by any other title. It appears in the text of the message, not distinguished by any heading or emphasis from other parts of the text. Here are the few words which by unanimous acceptance have become perhaps the most prominent and the most tenaciously-held principle of American national policy—though they have never had any legislative support and impose no legal obligation upon anybody:

In the wars of the European powers in matters relating to themselves we have never taken any part, nor does it comport with our policy so to do. It is only when our rights are invaded or seriously menaced that we resent injuries or make preparation for our defense. With the movements in this hemisphere we are, of necessity, more immediately connected, and by causes which must be obvious to all enlightened and impartial observers. The political system of the allied powers is essentially different in this respect from that of America. This difference proceeds from that which exists in their respective governments. And to the defense of our own which has been achieved by the loss of so much blood and treasure, and matured by the wisdom of their most enlightened citizens, and under which we have enjoyed unexampled felicity, this whole nation is devoted. We owe it, therefore, to candor, and to the amicable relations existing between the United States and those powers, to declare that we should consider any attempt on their part to extend their system to any portion of this hemisphere as dangerous to our peace and safety. With the existing colonies or dependencies of any European power we have not interfered, and shall not interfere. But with the governments who have declared their independence, and maintained it, and whose independence we have, on great consideration and on just principles, acknowledged, we could not view any interposition for the purpose of oppressing them, or controlling in any other manner their destiny, by any European power, in any other light than as the manifestation of an unfriendly disposition toward the United States.

Though this is expressed in terms used in diplomacy, nobody has ever had any doubt as to its meaning. It meant and still means that if Spain or any other European power or combination of powers shall attempt by force of arms to compel any American country having a republican form of government to accept or become subject to a monarchical form the United States, in President Monroe's opinion, should go to war to prevent such coercion. President Monroe's message, from which the quotation is made, may be most conveniently found in "Messages and papers of the Presidents," v. 2, p. 207. The quotation is from p. 218.

The most practical and serious application of the doctrine was made by President Cleveland, Dec. 17, 1895, when, after having failed to induce Great Britain to submit to arbitration her dispute with Venezuela over the boundary between that country and British Guiana, he sent in a special message asking Congress for an appropriation to pay the expense of a wholly American (United States) commission, which should determine the true boundary. This having been found, he proposed that the United States should require that it be observed. The appropriation was granted and the commission was appointed and began its work, but before it had made a report Great Britain consented to an arbitration. For this message, see "Messages and papers of the Presidents," v. 9, p. 655.

A few other public document references to the Monroe doctrine follow:

47th Cong., 1st sess., S. ex. doc. 194 (serial 1991), captioned "The Clayton-Bulwer treaty and the Monroe doctrine." It is a letter from the Secretary of State to the American Minister at London, dated May 8, 1882, with sundry explanatory papers and documents selected from the archives of the State Department. It shows how often and how emphatically the United States Government has asserted the Monroe doctrine. 203 pages.

56th Cong., 2d sess., S. doc. 41 (serial 4033). A conversation with Senator Stephen A. Douglas, in the summer of 1859, was reported by his brother-in-law, J. Madison Cutts, with a view to publication. It appears to have been first published in a newspaper in Dec. 1881. On Dec. 11, 1900, it was ordered to be printed as S. doc. 41. It refers to a speech in opposition to the Clayton-Bulwer treaty by Mr. Douglas Mar. 10 and 17, 1853, gives an interesting narrative of events connected with the ratification of the treaty in 1850, and concludes with a pointed note on the Monroe doctrine. 5 pages.

57th Cong., 1st sess., S. doc. 26 (serial 4220). This is correspondence between President Monroe and ex-President Jefferson, in Oct. 1823, a few weeks before the publication of the Monroe doctrine message. When Monroe had the message in mind he thought it wise to consult the two national sages, ex-Presidents Jefferson and Madison. Mr. Jefferson, then more than 80 years of age, wrote a vigorous letter sustaining the Monroe doctrine. Monroe's and Jefferson's letters are printed in this document. 4 pages.

58th Cong., 1st sess., S. doc. 7 (serial 4563). This is an English view of the Monroe doctrine, by Sir Frederick Pollock, an eminent barrister and writer on legal subjects. It is a fair-minded statement, giving much information as to the conditions existing in President Monroe's time and since and as to the friendly attitude of England toward the doctrine. 18 pages.

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

The National Academy of Sciences was organized at New York, Apr. 22, 1863, under an act of incorporation which had been approved by President Lincoln Mar. 4 of the same year. Its purpose was and is to give to the Government the benefit of scientific

counsel in relation to matters of practical administration. It has reported on many such matters which have been submitted to it by various Government Departments. Its members do not ask nor accept pay from the Government for services rendered, though the necessary expense of some of its investigations has been met by the public treasury. The Academy had at organization 50 members, and has increased to 88, with 26 foreign associates, though 109 members and 53 foreign associates have died. Only scientists of acknowledged eminence are admitted to membership. Besides the annual reports, Memoirs, and special reports, which are numbered Congressional documents, the Academy has published (at Cambridge, 1865, 1866, 1867) three volumes called "Annual of the National Academy of Sciences," which contain the first three annual reports, proceedings, lists of members, and biographical memoirs; also, a Constitution and membership pamphlet, presumed to be issued annually but with many breaks in the series; also, a volume of Proceedings, in three parts, issued at Washington, 1877, 1884, 1895; also five volumes of Biographical memoirs, published at Washington, 1877, 1886, 1895, 1902, 1905. The annual reports for 1868-72, 1874-77, and 1882 were not issued in the Congressional set, and are not known to have been issued in any form. The first volume of the Memoirs was not issued in the Congressional set, but was published in cloth by the Government Printing Office, 1866. There are also unnumbered cloth editions of the other volumes. The Memoirs are original scientific monographs, which are first printed in separate pamphlets, quarto, and later in collected volumes.
