Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 61st Congress, 3d session, is to be understood.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for.

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Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions, and unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents give the name of the issuing Department, Bureau, or Division, and title. If publication is numbered give number also. Do not order by Library of Congress card number.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to over a million, of which several hundred thousand are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that many of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

No general price-list of public documents is available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indices. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

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Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and $\frac{1}{10}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. **Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress.** Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

CUMULATIVE INDEX

Beginning with July, 1910, the Index to the Monthly catalogue will be issued separately each quarter and will cumulate for the twelve months ending June, 1911. That is, the September number of the Index is an index to the Monthly catalogue for July, August, and September, the December number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for October to December, the March number will be an index to the Monthly catalogue for January to March, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1911. Persons desiring to bind the catalogue at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate numbers can not be supplied.

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To facilitate the payment of the cost of documents, the Superintendent of Documents will hereafter accept coupons issued by him instead of cash. No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Senate document 798 is the Constitution of Arizona and House document 1369 is the Constitution of New Mexico (both documents of the 61st Congress). These new Constitutions have been framed by Conventions in the incipient States and have been ratified by popular vote, but neither one has yet been made a real Constitution by the approval of the President and Congress. Both can be supplied by the Superintendent of Documents at 5 cents each.

Senator Aldrich's Suggested plan for monetary legislation has received its second publication, this time as Senate document 784. 5 cents.

A publication of unusual interest just now is House document 1350, 61st Congress, 3d session, entered in this Catalogue under Congress. It is made up of extracts from the Congressional debates on the reciprocity treaty of 1854 with Canada, and contains also the Message of the then President (Pierce) on that subject. That treaty was in operation about twelve years with good results commercially and was abrogated by the United States as a measure of reprisal against Canada because of her having harbored the Confederates who raided the town of St. Albans, Vt.

The shooting affray at Brownsville, Texas, August 13 and 14, 1906, has been the source of a whole library of official literature. The latest contribution is a 12-volume report from a board of five general officers who took testimony last summer.

Workmen's insurance and compensation systems in Europe is the title of the 24th annual report of the Commissioner of Labor. Vol. 1 describes the systems of Austria, Belgium, Denmark, France, and Germany. This volume, which is the only one thus far received, is sold at \$1.00 in paper covers and \$1.10 in buckram binding. Vol. 2, completing the report, will describe the systems of Great Britain, Italy, Norway, Russia, Spain, and Sweden. Remarkable progress in these matters has been made in recent years. The report shows that in no case has any country after having adopted a system of compensation or insurance gone back to the liability system.

Bulletin 74, Hygienic Laboratory series, is another of those publications of the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service intended for the assistance and enlightenment of physicians and pharmacists by bringing together in convenient manuals all available knowledge on the subjects treated. The title of the new bulletin is Digitalis standardization and the variability of crude and of medicinal preparations. Price 10 cents.

Animal Industry Bureau Bulletin 110 is entitled A biometrical study of egg production in the domestic fowl. Part 1, subtitled Variation in animal egg production, was issued May 28, 1909. Now we have Part 2, Seasonal distribution of egg production. Both parts proceed from the

Maine Agricultural Experiment Station, where poultry problems are studied with unusual zeal and success. Each of the two parts sells for 15 cents.

Certain preliminary documents which were printed in confidence for use before The Hague Tribunal in the north Atlantic coast fisheries arbitration last summer have now been made public, but there are no copies for general distribution. They form a set of 6 volumes, namely: The case of the United States, 1 volume; Appendix to the case of the United States, 2 volumes; Counter case of the United States, 1 volume; Appendix to the counter case of the United States, 1 volume; The argument of the United States, 1 volume. The British documents in this arbitration have not been printed in this country, though Senator Root, who was the chief counsel for the United States, has urged upon the Senate the advisability of such printing. This is the case which was so fairly decided by The Hague Tribunal that each side thought itself the victor. Surely never was the wisdom of arbitration more conclusively vindicated. The official reports of the proceedings before the Tribunal, including the oral arguments, remain to be printed. As the leading counsel on each side spoke eight days continuously (16 days altogether for but two of the advocates engaged) there should be enough "copy" for another respectable set of volumes.

The 17-year locust emerging mysteriously from the ground in the early summer never takes the entomologists of the Agriculture Department by surprise. They know when he went into his hole and when he is due to come out. Not all of these disagreeable visitors come at the same time. They are divided into broods, whose several entrances, exits, and habitats are well known. Brood no. 2, which ranges from New York to North Carolina, is due to emerge the present season, and so is Brood no. 23 of the 13-year variety, which covers the lower half of the Mississippi Valley. What must be the emotions of such a brood if, when seeking the sunlight after 13 years or 17 years of burial alive, they find that the monster man has hopelessly entombed them under miles of macadam road or concrete pavement or acres of house foundations. And would any one of them recognize itself as a periodical cicada, the name under which the coming of the swarms is commemorated in Entomology Bureau Circular 132, price, 5 cents. The author of the circular certifies that the cicada do but little harm, though their emergence in multitudes after many years disappearance always causes much alarm.

The Mines Bureau has begun a series of circulars entitled Miners' circulars. In List 3 of its publications the Bureau listed the title Permissible explosives tested prior to November 15, 1910, as no. 1. This title, with later date, has now been made Miners' circular no. 2, and no. 1 will be assigned to a new publication not yet issued. The Mines Bureau has also issued its Bulletin 4, Features of producer-gas power-plant development in Europe. It has also reprinted Geological Survey Bulletin 416 as Mines Bureau Bulletin 9 and Geological Survey Bulletin 428 as Mines Bureau Bulletin 10. The titles are: Recent development of the producer-gas power-plant in the United States and The purchase of coal by the Government under specifications.

Some things that girls should know how to do and hence should learn how to do when in school is the title of a little pamphlet printed by the Office of Indian Affairs as a manual for use in the Indian schools. It shows that many things are taught in the Indian schools that are not taught in even the best eastern boarding schools. For instance, how to milk the cow; how squirrels, woodpeckers, and beavers store their food; how to store supplies when living in a one-room house; how to build fires; how to make a log table; how to pare potatoes; how to make brown gravy; how to make a bureau from a drygoods box; the advantage of having a change of clothing; how to make a box for the dog to sleep in instead of letting him sleep with the family, and many more very practical and useful things. Copies of this novel manual may be had from the Superintendent of Documents at 5 cents each.

Abstracts of 22 of the forthcoming volumes of the final report of the Immigration Commission have been issued in as many pamphlets ranging from 8 pages to 99 pages in size. These are not for the public, having been printed in limited editions for the convenience of the Commission.

There is a new edition of the Immigration laws and regulations dated Feb. 1, 1911. Price 10 cents. Sold by the Superintendent of Documents.

A new edition of Farmers' bulletin 363, corrected to December 15, 1910, has been issued by the Experiment Stations Office. Its title is The use of milk as food.

The 1910 Annual report of the Director of the Mint gives some information which is no doubt familiar to students of finance but nevertheless may be somewhat surprising to the average citizen. The Director renews a former recommendation for the discontinuance of the coinage of gold, his reason being that more than a thousand million dollars in coined gold is now in the Treasury—more than has been or will be called for in a generation. The only use for gold coin is as the basis of our monetary system. Nobody wants to carry it, the paper substitutes being always preferred. It is not wanted for export, bars being always required for that use. "Practically the entire gold product of this country is going into the vaults of the Treasury," says the Director, adding, "This gold will never be wanted in the form of coin; the habits of our people are fixed, and it is certain that they will always prefer paper money for active use." The 1910 Mint report, in cloth binding, is sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 40 cents.

Potash is one of the three essentials to plant growth. Pretty much all the potash used as a fertilizer in this country is imported from Germany. As the German Government has proposed the imposition of taxes that would much increase the cost of potash to American importers and consumers, the potash question has become one of national and international importance. Hence the issue of an advance chapter from the 1910 edition of Mineral resources, entitled Potash salts, their uses and occurrence in the United States. This pamphlet is virtually a manual or compend of the whole subject.

Senate document 831, 61st Congress, 3d session, is a reprint of 11 reciprocity treaties. 10 of which were sent to the Senate by President McKin-

ley and one by President Roosevelt. Seven were negotiated on behalf of the United States by John A. Kasson, 2 by John Hay, 1 by William I. Buchanan, and 1 by Archibald J. Sampson. One was with France, 1 with the Argentine Republic, 1 with Newfoundland, 1 with Ecuador, 1 with Nicaragua, 1 with Denmark for the island of St. Croix, and 5 with Great Britain for that number of her West Indian colonies. The 10 sent in by President McKinley are dated 1899 or 1900 and the one sent in by President Roosevelt 1902. The only action taken on them by the Senate was to refer them to the Committee on Foreign Relations and order them printed.

An interesting and important compilation of 53 pages is Senate document 823, 61st Congress, 3d session. Its title is Teachers' pension laws in the United States and Europe.

The Joint Printing Committee has adopted a new rule intended to facilitate the publication of the permanent bound edition of the Congressional record. It forbids the publication of numbers of the Record containing delayed speeches later than 10 days after the close of a session of Congress. Speeches not ready for publication within that time will go unprinted. Librarians may therefore expect their bound copies of vol. 46 of the Record somewhat earlier than usual.

The bill establishing the Appalachian and White Mountain forest reserves passed the Senate February 15, and became a law by the President's signature March 1. The very complete illustrated volume on the Appalachians published by the Agriculture Department in 1902 is still for sale by the Superintendent of Documents at \$1.25.

A new publication for the instruction and assistance of manufacturers is Chemistry Bureau Circular 68, Tomato ketchup under the microscope, with practical suggestions to insure a cleanly product. 5 cents.

Public health bulletin 42 is a very practical and untechnical work from the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service which in all probability will have a wide popular circulation. Its character is sufficiently indicated by its title Disinfectants, their use and application in the prevention of communicable diseases. Price 10 cents.

There is a new Farmers' bulletin, issued in the Plant Industry Bureau, that will appeal to a wide constituency. It is numbered 428 and titled Testing farm seeds in the home and in the rural school.

Only last month the Monthly catalogue declared that Circular 3, Publications Division, Agriculture Department, since it had been provided with an index, had become "one of the indispensables" in handling the public documents relating to agriculture. Now we learn that the publication of Circular 3 and its companion list, Circular 2, has been discontinued. To dispense with the indispensable will be hard indeed.

Senate document 725, 61st Congress, 3d session, reproduces the evidence taken by the Interstate Commerce Commission in the matter of proposed advances in freight rates by carriers. It is in 10 volumes. It will be remembered that the Commission refused to permit the proposed advances.

The American system of agricultural education is the important subject of Experiment Stations Office Circular 106. 15 cents.

Farmers' bulletin 429, which supersedes no. 268 in the same series, has for its subject Industrial alcohol, sources and manufacture. This bulletin embodies in brief form the latest researches of the Chemistry Bureau.

Now that the Appalachian and White Mountain forest reservations have become certainties, publications relating to the districts to be conserved have acquired an additional importance. The very latest is Geological Survey Professional paper 72, Denudation and erosion in the southern Appalachian region and the Monongahela basin. The work has many illustrations and maps. 35 cents.

WORLD TRADE DIRECTORY

This important work, compiled and published by the Manufactures Bureau, Commerce and Labor Department, is now available for distribution and is being rapidly mailed to those whose orders and remittances have been on file. While the Directory is sold by the Superintendent of Documents, sales will be made only to those whose orders are approved by the Manufactures Bureau. The work is issued solely for the use of the American export trade and an indiscriminate sale is not proposed. Applications should therefore first be made to the Manufactures Bureau. The price of the Directory is fixed by law and is \$5 a copy.

It is a quarto volume of nearly 1,200 pages, substantially bound in buckram. It has an introduction which of itself is of large value to any American house which is engaged in or which contemplates engaging in the export trade. It includes tables of foreign weights and measures, coins and currency, trade names, etc.

Chiefly the work is a directory of foreign trade. It gives classified and alphabetically arranged lists of representative business firms in all lines of trade and in all countries of the world. The classification is by continents, countries, cities, and businesses. These are brief geographical, commercial, and statistical descriptions of each country, city, and town.

The information has been in the main received from American consuls and apparently it has been skillfully and accurately compiled. A table of contents and an index make its contents available for prompt and easy consultation.

TREASURY DECISIONS

The decisions of the Treasury Department under customs and other laws are printed in weekly pamphlets. These weekly issues, supplied with title-page and index, have been for a number of years also bound in half-yearly volumes. For 1910 a change was made by binding all the decisions of the year in one volume instead of two. The experiment was not altogether successful. Not only was the usual bulk of decisions too great for a handy volume, but the decisions of the new Court of Customs Appeals, which it was found advisable to print with the Treasury decisions, came along to swell the total, making Treasury decisions, vol. 19, for the year 1910, a book of almost 1500 pages, priced at \$2.50. So large

a book is obviously inconvenient as a reference book, and as, like most public documents, it is printed on the ordinary wood-pulp paper, which has little tensile strength, it is not likely to prove very lasting.

The numerous buyers and users of this work will no doubt be glad to know that it is not the intention to issue Treasury decisions in a single annual volume hereafter. It is understood that the former plan of semi-annual volumes will be returned to.

THE MAN WHO ROBBED GEORGE WASHINGTON

One of the most surprising public documents of recent date is House report 2179, 61st Congress, 3d session, which was made by the Committee on Private Land Claims Feb. 16, 1911. It is a report on House bill 5266, to reimburse the estate of Gen. George Washington. It recommends that a patent for 3100 acres of public land be issued to Robert E. Lee, jr., who on Oct. 29, 1907, was appointed administrator of the estate of Gen. George Washington, who died Dec. 14, 1799. The grounds of this claim are fully set forth in the report, and the story is, as the report says, "one of absorbing interest."

Only the briefest outline of it can be given here. In 1763 the last royal governor of Virginia, Lord Dunmore, issued to John Rootes a warrant for 3000 acres of land to be located in the territory then owned by Virginia "northwest of the Ohio River." Rootes sold this warrant to Gen. Washington. In 1785 the Virginia Legislature provided for the validation of such warrants when held by Revolutionary soldiers. In 1787 Gen. Washington sent an agent to Ohio to locate under the 3000-acre warrant and also under one for 100 acres. The lands were located in Clermont County, Ohio, and the proper notices, etc., filed with the Virginia authorities. Later on Congress confirmed these surveys and also provided that papers concerning them should be filed with the Secretary of War. This last provision was overlooked by Gen. Washington and his agents. Then one Joseph Kerr, a deputy surveyor of the Government, being familiar with the surveys and the failure of Gen. Washington to file with the Secretary of War, secured persons to make entry on the Washington lands, and when they had done so and had secured their patents Kerr bought the patents and thus became the owner of the lands. The efforts of Gen. Washington and his executors to protect his rights and the assurances given him by officials are all detailed most interestingly in the report, but all ended in Kerr holding the lands, though several times, up even to 1900, there were provisions of law under which the Washington estate might have been protected had there been any one to take the proper measures.

Mr. Lee, the present administrator, who has given the whole matter a thorough looking up, asked that Congress should reimburse the estate for the present value of the lost lands, which is estimated at \$100 an acre, though in his will, made in July, 1799, the General placed the then value at \$5 an acre. The Committee on Private Land Claims declined to recommend so large an appropriation (more than \$300,000) and favored the issue of a land warrant for 3100 acres instead. No action was taken by Congress.

The inappropriate conclusion to Joseph Kerr's spoliation of Gen. Washington is the fact that on Dec. 14, 1814 (15 years to a day after the General's death) the same Kerr became a Senator of the United States from Ohio, serving till the 3d of March following, and then dropping back into the obscurity from which he has been now temporarily and discredibly rescued.

House report 2179 is certainly one of the Congressional reports well worth reading by all who have an interest in episodes of American history.

PUBLIC DOCUMENT CHECKLIST

The 3d edition of the Checklist of United States public documents, long in preparation, is at last in the hands of the printers. This does not mean that it will be very soon in the hands of readers. It is a work of such magnitude and particularity that the task of seeing it through the press will necessarily be prolonged. Nothing is risked in saying that this Checklist is so superior in completeness and accuracy to all preceding lists of the kind as to put it altogether in a class by itself. It will fill two volumes, vol. 1 being the list of Congressional and Departmental publications and vol. 2, the index. It will answer certainly all important questions relating to the public documents and will leave unanswered few if any even of the unimportant ones.

As the work of publication progresses, further notes concerning it may appear in the Monthly catalogue.
