Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 55th Congress, 2d session, is to be understood.

General Information

With Reference to the Distribution of Documents

EXCHANGES

Exchanges will be made of surplus miscellaneous documents for such other documents and books as may be required when the same can be done to the advantage of the public service.

FREE TO INDIVIDUALS

The Superintendent of Documents is not authorized to supply documents free to individuals, except publications specifically authorized by Congress to be distributed to persons designated by Senators, Representatives, or Delegates. The only documents of that character now being distributed are, the compilation entitled "Messages and Papers of the Presidents, 1787 to 1897," by Richardson, and the Official Register, or "Blue Book."

FREE TO LIBRARIES

He is directed to distribute current publications to three classes of libraries, to be designated to him by Senators, Representatives, and Delegates in Congress, as follows:

To class 1.—Designated depositories;—one to be named by each Senator, Representative, or Delegate in Congress. Libraries of this class receive one copy of each of the departmental publications and of the numbered Congressional documents. These include everything sent to the other two classes.

To class 2.—Geological libraries;—two to be named by each Senator, Representative, and Delegate in Congress under the provisions of sec. 79 of the printing law, 28 Stat. at Large, 601. These libraries receive the monographs and bulletins of the Geological Survey.

To class 3.—Remainder libraries;—public and school libraries designated by Senators, Representatives, and Delegates in Congress to receive fractional remainders of Congressional quotas, under the provisions of sec. 68 of the printing law, above referred to. Such libraries do not receive complete sets of public documents, because "remainders" vary from a dozen to four hundred copies, never equaling the number of this class of depositories.

SALES

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for. Only one copy is permitted to be sold to the same person, excepting libraries or schools, and Members of Congress.

PRICES

Documents for sale by this office will be indicated by a (*) following the price named. The absence of a (*) indicates that application should be made to the Department, bureau, or division issuing the document.

HOW TO REMIT

Remittances may be made to the Superintendent of Documents by postal money order, express money order, draft, or check. In case of remittance by check the documents ordered will not be sent until after

the check has been collected. Any charge for collection will be deducted from the face of the check and documents sent for the remainder. *Stamps or foreign currency will not be accepted in any case.*

Remittances to the Public Printer should be made by postal money order, express money order, or draft on New York. Remittances to the Geological Survey should be made by money order. The War Records Office will receive currency as well as postal money orders if the exact amount be sent.

All the Government offices which have books, pamphlets, maps, or charts for sale issue price-lists, which will be sent free to all applicants. The prices charged are never more than cost and 10 per cent added, and frequently much less than that.

All public documents, from whatever Department or bureau they may be bought or procured, will be forwarded free of postage to all points in the United States, Canada, and Mexico. To other countries regular rates of postage are charged, and remittances must be made to include such postage.

A NEW FEATURE

A new, and it is hoped a helpful, feature has been added to the Monthly Catalogue, beginning with the December, 1897, issue—an index.

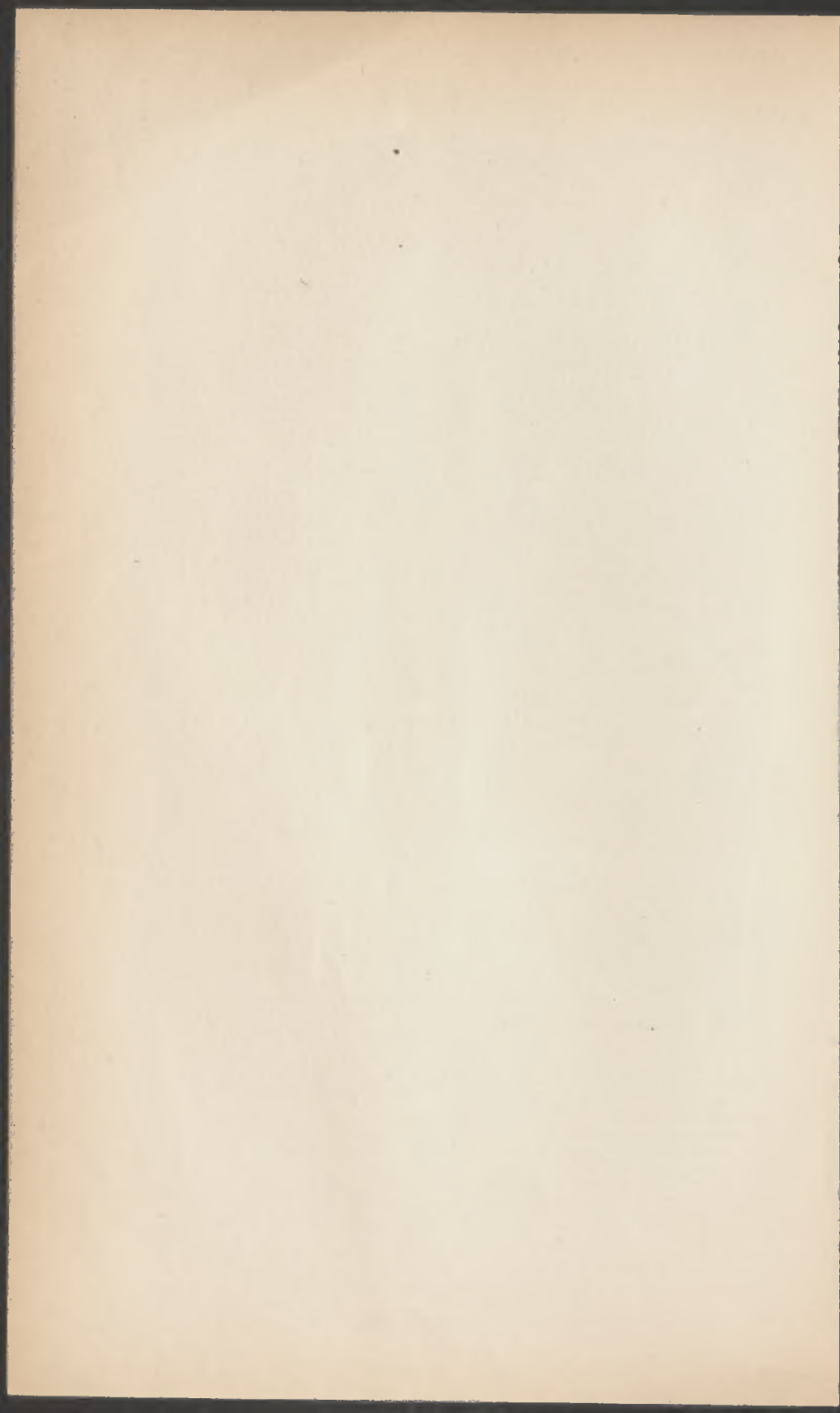

NOTE.—When the Document Checklist was compiled, in 1895, but 8 volumes of Census reports had been issued in the sheep set, and the compilers were not informed as to the form in which the remaining volumes were to be issued. So far as could be judged from the volumes then issued, each separate book was to be made a distinct part of volume 50, House miscellaneous documents, 52d Congress, 1st session. The only Census volume which at that time had been issued in parts in the sheep set was the Compendium, and in that case part 1 of the Compendium was published as part 3 of volume 50 and part 2 of the Compendium as part 4 of volume 50. Assuming that other parted volumes would be treated on the same plan, 30 serial numbers [3008-3037] were assigned for the Census set. When the remaining volumes appeared, it was found, however, that the plan of publication had been changed. Part 3 of the Compendium was issued as part 4 of volume 50, the same as part 2, Compendium, had been. Both parts of Wealth, Debt, and Taxation were back titled as part 2 of volume 50; Insurance, 2 parts, both were part 5, volume 50; Population, 2 parts, both part 8; Transportation, 2 parts, both part 11; Manufactures, 3 parts, all part 12; Crime, Pauperism, and Benevolence, 2 parts, both part 14; Vital and Social Statistics, 4 parts, all part 18. This notation is somewhat ambiguous and misleading. As part 1 of part 5 is devoted to Life Insurance, the user would be likely to assume that the following parts would treat of the same subject, and the reader who consulted part 2 of part 5, the theme of which is Fire Insurance, would almost necessarily assume that part 1 must relate to the same topic. So with part 11, of which one of the parts or volumes into which it is divided treats of Land transportation and the other of Water transportation. Evidently convenience in the use of the set would have been increased by giving each volume of each part of volume 50 a distinct number. But as this was not done, and as it was not known how many parts there would be, the plan that had been begun was followed out, and but one serial number was assigned to each part. Now it is found that the completed Census takes up but 18 [3008-3025] of the numbers that had been assigned to it, leaving in the Checklist an ugly gap of 12 numbers [3026-3037], which cannot be filled up because the numbers following, up to 3588, have been assigned and cannot now be changed. It therefore seems advisable, if not necessary, to recast the serial numbers for the 11th Census set, and thus take up the 12 numbers now unused.

The serial numbers, beginning with 3008, should therefore be changed as below, following the notation of the back-titles as found on the Congressional edition of the Census volumes and reproduced herewith (see Checklist, p. 95):

This will leave number 3037 open for the Statistical Atlas, which is the only publication of the 11th Census remaining unissued. The Commissioner of Labor, in charge of the Census, in his final report, dated October 5, 1897, says that "the Final Reports of the 11th Census consist of 25 volumes." These 25, however, make 26 in the sheep set, because Occupations, which in the cloth is included in Population, part 2, is separately bound in the sheep. The Abstract of the 11th Census is not one of the parts of volume 50, House miscellaneous documents, 52d Congress, 1st session, but is issued in the Congressional set as House miscellaneous document 185, 53d Congress, 2d session, and bound in volume 1 of the House miscellaneous documents of that session. The serial number of the volume is 3229. This is the 1st edition of the Abstract, printed in 1894. The 2d edition, printed in 1896, has not been issued as a Congressional document.

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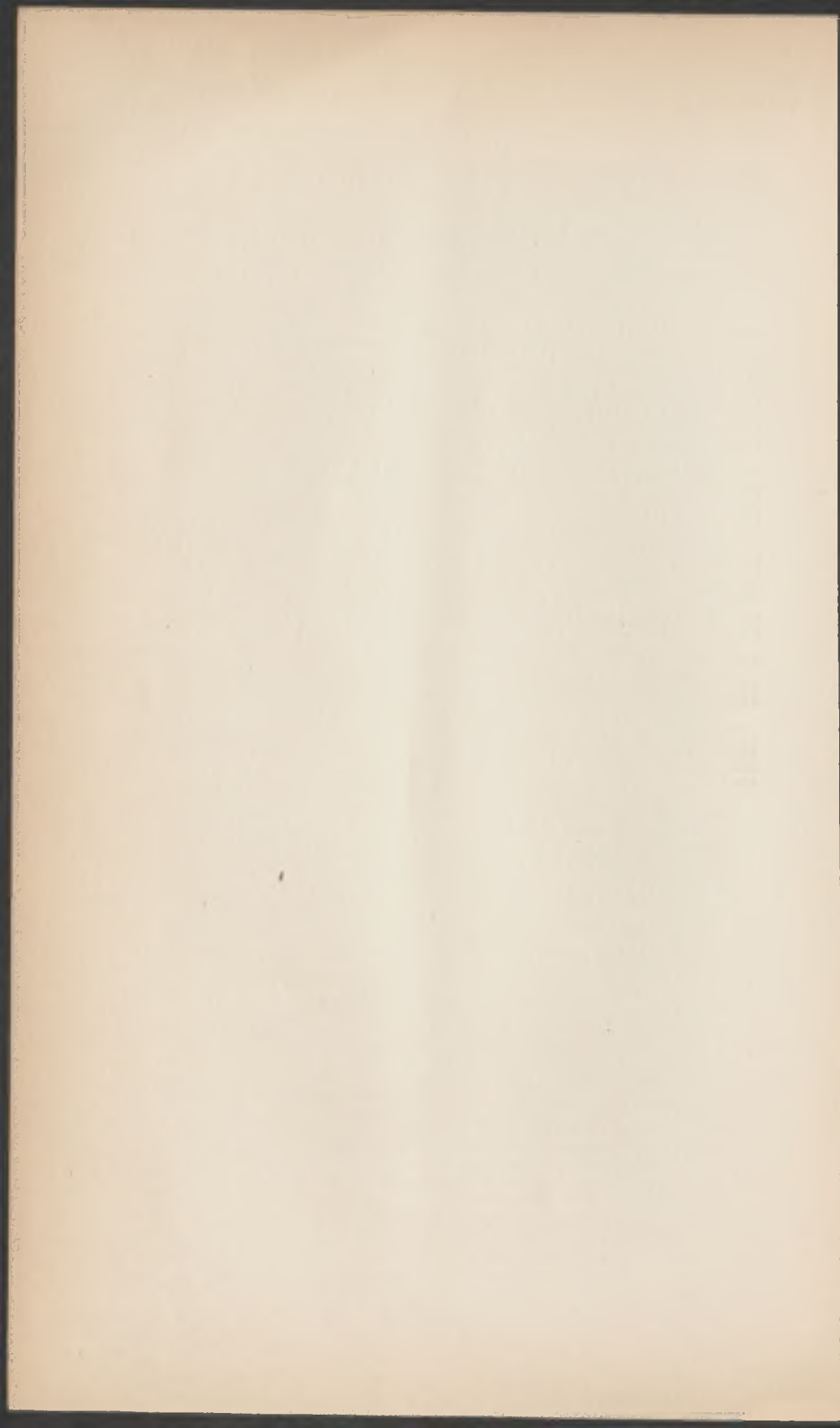
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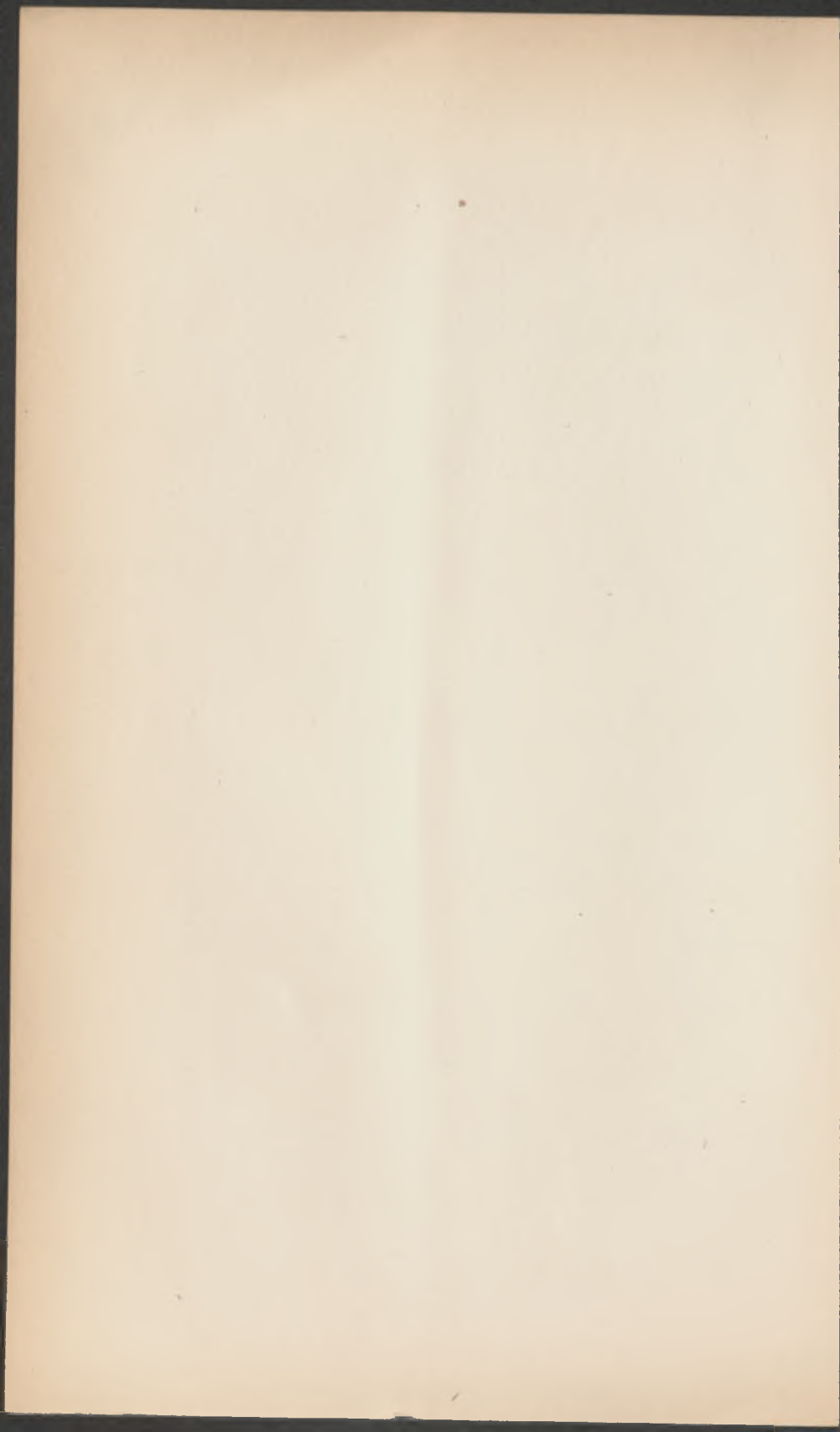
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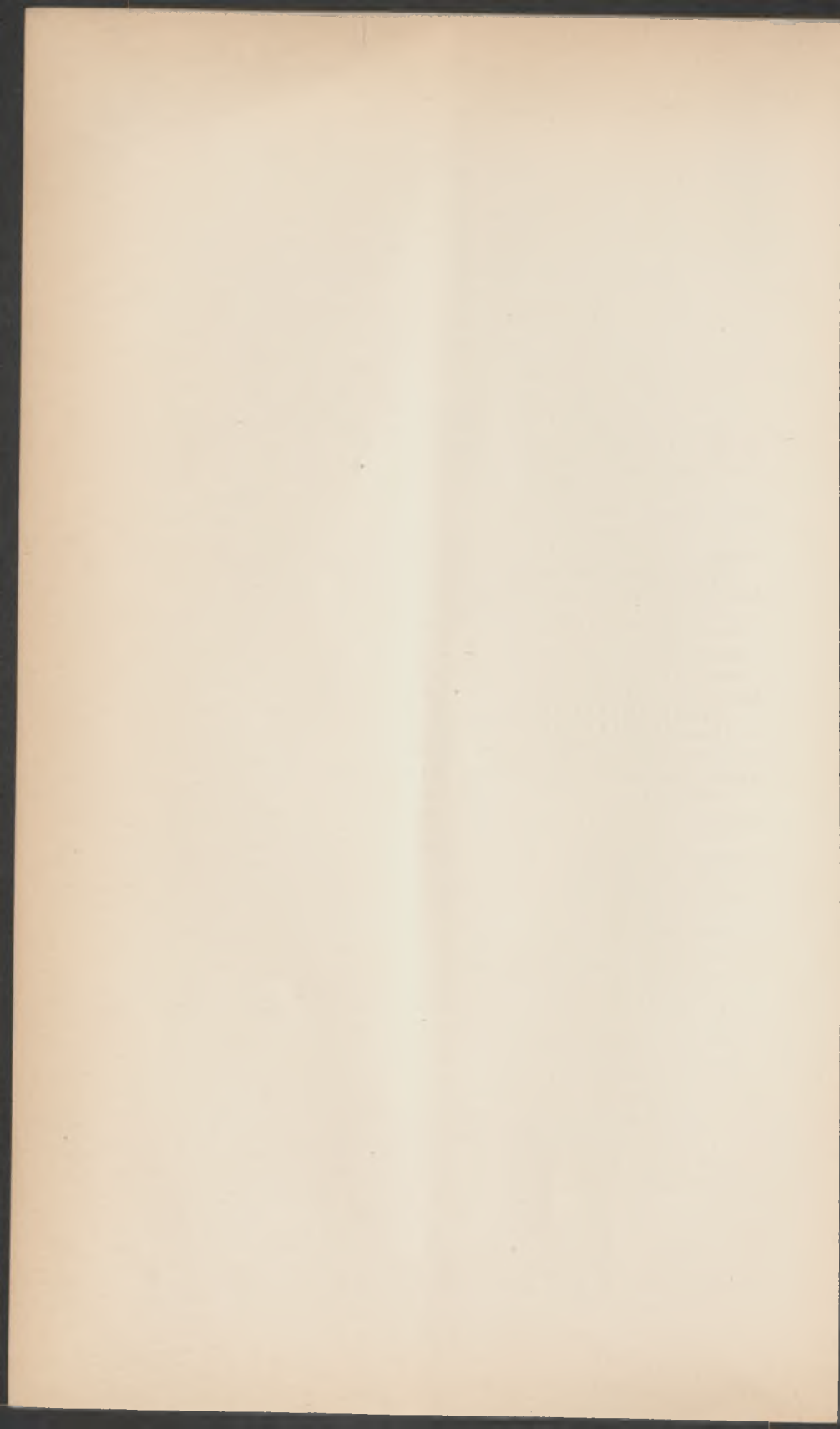
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
