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No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Cuba, Mexico, or Shanghai. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The economics of the meat situation in its various phases is thoroughly covered in a series of five reports by specialists of the Department of Agriculture. Four of these reports have now appeared. Part 5, Agriculture Department Report 113, describing the methods and cost of marketing live stock and meats, is now in the hands of the printer and will be issued in the near future. The treatment of this subject is the result of a campaign of education by the States and Federal Government working in cooperation among the stockmen and farmers and should aid materially in increasing the output of meats and minimizing the cost of production.

Trust Laws and Unfair Competition covers the field which the subject embraces in an exhaustive manner. Besides a table of cases in American, English, and colonial courts, it contains an historical account of antitrust laws, dealing principally with the legislation and judicial decisions of the United States and foreign countries with respect to industrial combinations and unfair competition. 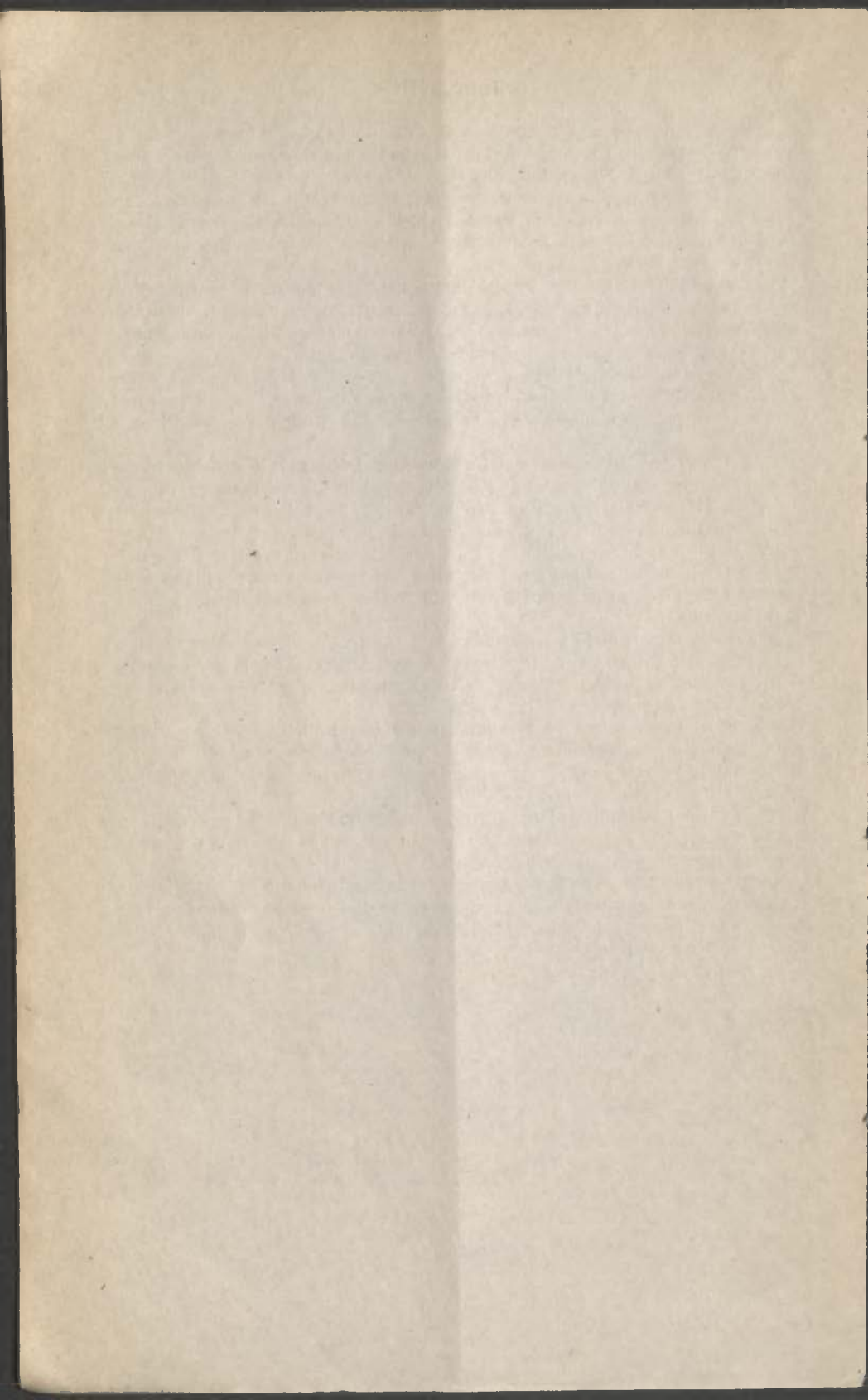

Topographic sheets

NOTE.—The Geological Survey is making a topographic map of the United States. The sheets of which it is composed are projected without reference to political divisions, and are designated by some prominent town or natural feature found on them. Three scales are ordinarily used, 1:62,500, 1:125,000, and 1:250,000. These correspond, approximately, to 1 mile, 2 miles, and 4 miles to 1 linear inch, covering, respectively, average areas of 230, 920, and 3,700 square miles. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. The usual size, exclusive of the margin, is about 17.5 inches in height by 11.5 to 16 inches in width, the latter varying with the latitude. A description of the topographic map is printed on the reverse of each sheet.

Nearly two-fifths of the area of the country, excluding outlying possessions, has been mapped, every State being represented. Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia are completely mapped. Sheets of the regular size are sold by the Survey at 10c. each; but in lots of 50 or more copies, whether of the same sheet or of different sheets, the price is 6c. each. The discount is allowed on all orders the net cost of which amounts to \$3.00 or more and applies on an order for either maps or folios alone or for maps and folios together, but does not apply to the folios sold at 5c. each on account of damage by fire.
