They are published in two forms, one giving simply the rural free delivery routes starting from a single given post office, and sold at 75 cents each; the other, the rural free delivery routes in an entire county, sold at 50 cents each. A scale of 1 inch to 1 mile is generally used. The rural-delivery county maps are printed from the latest negatives. It is impracticable for the Department to keep maps corrected to date at all times. Editions are not issued, but blue print copies are produced in response to special calls addressed to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D.C. NOTE.—The publications of the National Museum comprise an annual report and three scientific series, viz., Proceedings, Bulletins, and Contributions from national herbarium. The editions are distributed to established lists of libraries, scientific institutions, and specialists, any surplus copies being supplied on application. The Proceedings are usually brief technical papers and the Bulletins generally monographs based on the Museum collections in biology, geology, and anthropology. No sets of any of these series can now be furnished.

Beginning with v. 66, the Proceedings are issued only in pamphlet form. The separate papers will be sent to depository libraries and to others designated to receive them, as issued, and a title-page and index will be published for each volume so that the volume may be bound if desired.

STATE DEPARTMENT
