Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate, measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith. Processed publications are not obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents and requests for them, if they are available, should be addressed to the issuing office.

Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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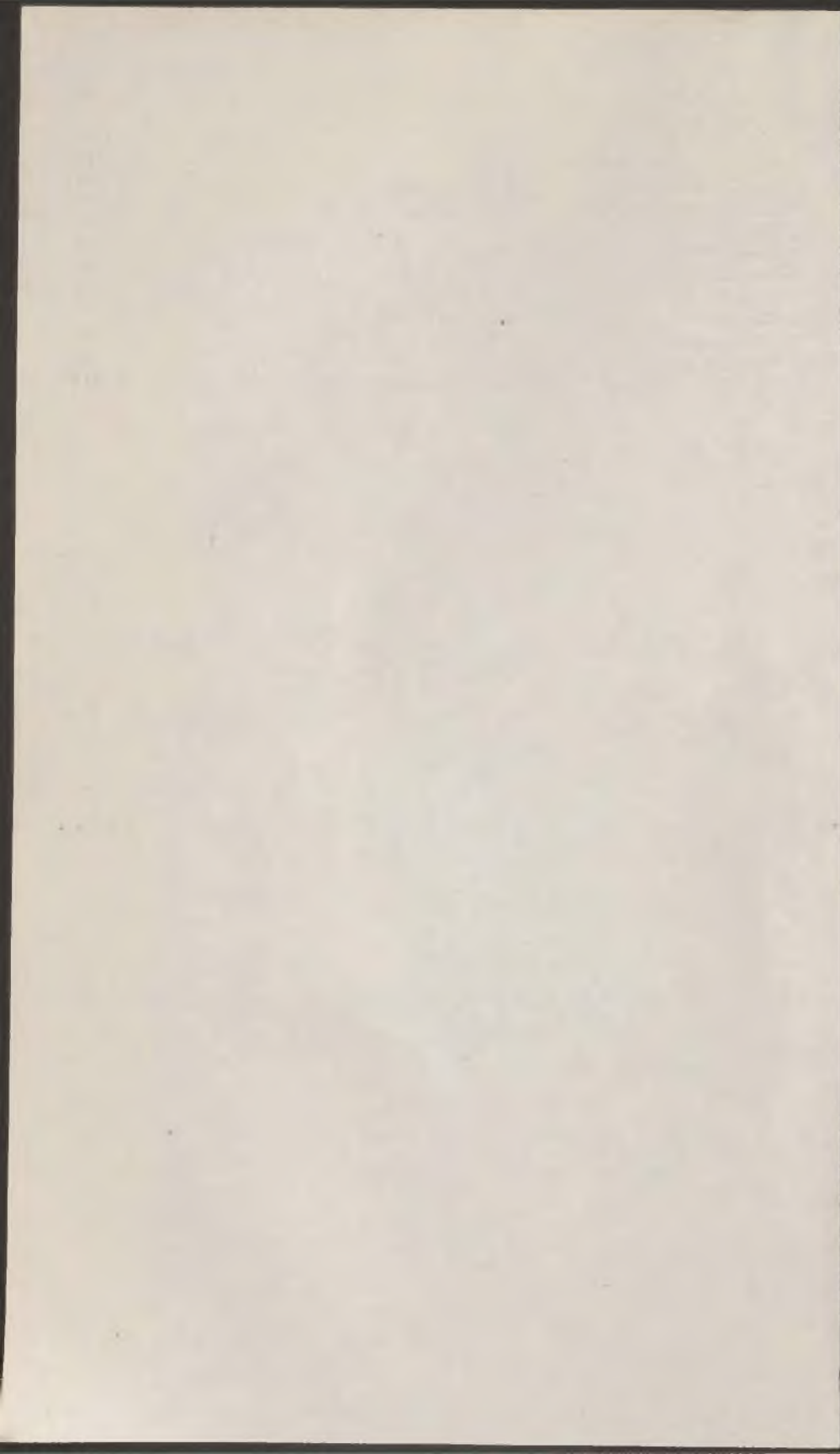
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General Information

Notes of General Interest

Commodity Exchange Branch

Executive order 9069, dated Feb. 23, 1942, consolidated the Commodity Exchange Administration with certain other agencies of the Department of Agriculture into the Agricultural Marketing Administration. Administrator's memorandum 2, dated Mar. 9, 1942, emanating from the Agricultural Marketing Administration, transferred all functions of the Commodity Exchange Administration to the Commodity Exchange Branch, except those functions assigned to staff divisions of the Agricultural Marketing Administration.

Defense Transportation Office

Executive order 8989, dated Dec. 18, 1941, established the Office of Defense Transportation in the Executive Office of the President to assure maximum utilization of the domestic transportation facilities of the Nation for the successful prosecution of the War. This Office assumed the duties formerly vested in the Transportation Division of the Advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense.

Services of Supply

Executive order 9082, of Feb. 28, 1942, effective Mar. 9, 1942, reorganizing the Army of the United States and transferring certain functions within the War Department, provided a service of supply command under a Commanding General, Services of Supply, and transferred to the Services of Supply, the functions of the Chief of Coast Artillery relating to procurement, storage, and issue. War Department circular 59, dated Mar. 2, 1942, listed the following supply arms and services and War Department offices and agencies, to come under the direct command of the Commanding General, Services of Supply:

- (1) Those parts of the office of Under Secretary of War engaged in functions of procurement and industrial mobilization.
- (2) Budget Advisory Committee.
- (3) Surgeon General.
- (4) Chief of Engineers (except with respect to civil functions, for which he reports directly to the Secretary of War).
- (5) Chief Signal Officer.
- (6) Quartermaster General.
- (7) Chief of Ordnance.
- (8) Chief of Chemical Warfare Service.
- (9) Present supply functions of Chief of Coast Artillery, and the military and civilian personnel assigned thereto.
- (10) Chief of Finance.
- (11) Judge Advocate General (except with respect to courts martial and certain legal matters for which he reports directly to the Secretary of War).
- (12) Adjutant General.
- (13) Provost Marshal General.

- (14) Chief of Special Services.
- (15) Chief of Chaplains.
- (16) All corps area commanders.
- (17) All general depots.
- (18) Ports of embarkation, staging areas, and regulating and reconsignment stations for oversea shipments.

War Information Office

Executive order 9182, dated June 13, 1942, consolidated certain war information functions into an Office of War Information within the Emergency Management Office. The powers and duties of the Office of Facts and Figures, the Office of Government Reports, the Coordinator of Information, and the Division of Information of the Emergency Management Office were transferred and consolidated into the Office of War Information, a director at the head thereof, appointed by the President.

NOTE.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. Rural delivery routes are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,575 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from negatives on file, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A list of the county maps on file will be furnished upon application to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery routes emanating from post offices in counties for which county maps have not been drawn are shown on local maps. Blueprint copies of such maps are sold at 25 cents each.
