# Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate, measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

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Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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# General Information

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Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

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#### LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for many publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Card Division, Library of Congress, not to the Superintendent of Documents.

#### MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.50 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$2.10 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

#### INDEX

An Index to the Monthly catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

# Notes of General Interest

# Reorganization Act of 1939

Pursuant to the Reorganization act of 1939, approved April 3, 1939, the President submitted to Congress Reorganization plans 3 and 4, made effective June 30, 1940, by Public resolution 75, 76th Congress.

## CIVIL AERONAUTICS AUTHORITY

The Civil Aeronautics Authority administrator under the provisions of the third plan on Government reorganization was made the chief administrative officer of the Authority. Under provisions of the fourth plan, the Civil Aeronautics Authority, the Office of the Administrator of Civil Aeronautics, and the Air Safety Board were transferred to the Department of Commerce. The functions of the Air Safety Board were consolidated with those of the Civil Aeronautics Authority, which shall hereafter be known as the Civil Aeronautics Board and which shall in addition to its other functions, discharge the duties heretofore vested in the Air Safety Board so as to provide for the independent investigation of aircraft accidents. The offices of the members of the Air Safety Board were abolished. The Administrator of Civil Aeronautics, whose functions shall be administered under the direction and supervision of the Secretary of Commerce, and the Civil Aeronautics Board, which shall report to Congress and the President through the Secretary of Commerce, shall constitute the Civil Aeronautics Authority within the Department of Commerce.

## FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE

The President's Reorganization plan no. 2, made effective July 1, 1939, transferred the Bureau of Fisheries of the Department of Commerce and the Bureau of Biological Survey of the Department of Agriculture to the Department of the Interior, and thus concentrated in one department the two bureaus responsible for the conservation and utilization of the wildlife resources of the Nation. Under provisions of the Reorganization plan no. 3, made effective June 30, 1940, by Public resolution 75, 76th Congress, the Bureau of Fisheries and the Bureau of Biological Survey in the Department of the Interior with their respective functions were consolidated into one agency in the Department of the Interior to be known as the Fish and Wildlife Service. The functions of the consolidated agency shall be administered under the direction and supervision of the Secretary of the Interior by a Director and not more than two assistant directors who shall be appointed by the Secretary and perform such duties as he shall prescribe.

#### WEATHER BUREAU

The importance of the Weather Bureau's functions to the Nation's commerce has led to the decision to transfer this Bureau to the Department of Commerce. The development of the aviation industry has imposed upon the Weather Bureau a major responsibility in the field of air transportation. The transfer to the Department of Commerce, will permit better coordination of Government activities relating to aviation and to commerce generally, without in any way lessening the Bureau's contribution to agriculture. The Weather Bureau in the Department of Agriculture and its functions were transferred to the Department of Commerce to be administered under the direction and supervision of the Secretary of Commerce, as provided for by the President's Reorganization plan no. 4.

## Topographic quadrangle maps

Note.—The Geological Survey makes the contoured—i. e., the three-dimensional topographic maps of the country that are designed eventually to cover the whole United States, also Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. The individual maps are projected to represent quadrangle areas rather than political divisions, and each map is designated by the name of some prominent town or natural feature in the area mapped. The scales most commonly used are 1:21680, 1:62500, and 1:125.000, corresponding approximately to ½ mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered varies with the latitude, but the average area of a quadrangle is 58, 230, or 920 square miles, respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by 16½ inches and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17½ inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. A general description of topographic maps and a list of the symbols used are printed on the reverse of each sheet.

### TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

## STATE DEPARTMENT

The Bulletin contains each quarter a complete list of the Department's publications for the preceding quarter.
