Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 62d Congress, 2d session, is to be understood.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals, **nor can they be forwarded in advance of payment.**

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions and, unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents give the name of the issuing Department, Bureau, or Division, and title. If publication is numbered give number also. Do not order by Library of Congress card number.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to over a million, of which several hundred thousand are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that many of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

No general price-list of public documents is available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indices. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and $\frac{7}{10}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. **Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress.** Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

CUMULATIVE INDEX

The Index to the Monthly catalogue will be issued separately each quarter and will cumulate for the twelve months ending June, 1912. That is, the September number of the Index is an index to the Monthly catalogue for July, August, and September, the December number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for October to December, the March number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for January to March, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1912. Persons desiring to bind the catalogue at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate numbers can not be supplied.

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Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins will positively not be accepted.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The Superintendent of Documents' new law Price list (no. 10, 5th edition) explains the technical titles under which the laws of the United States are published and sold and which are often unfamiliar and not wholly intelligible even to members of the bar. The Slip laws, the Session laws, the Pamphlet laws, the Statutes at large, and the Revised statutes are the official titles of the United States laws. The material is virtually the same. The differing titles indicate differing stages of publication. There are early prints for the prompt information of those most directly interested. There are collected editions at the close of each session of each Congress and again at the expiration of the Congress. Finally, there is a revised collection, in which only the general and permanent enactments are included. These are all laws, and the same laws, but the varying conditions of their publication call for varying titles, each of which has its special significance, as explained in the 5th edition of Price list 10. The explanations are brief, but the effort has been to make them so clear that nobody need be in doubt as to what he is ordering. The Government is not the only publisher of its laws. Various enterprising private publishers issue more or less complete editions of the statutes, edited, titled, and annotated in ways unknown to this office. With these editions the Superintendent of Documents has nothing to do. He is able to give positive assurance, however, that the only official editions of the laws of the United States, the only editions which are published by the Government itself, are those listed in his Price list 10, 5th edition. These official law books can be procured by purchase from the Superintendent of Documents and not otherwise.

Naval medical bulletin, v. 6, no. 2, April, 1912, has a special article of general as well as medical importance entitled Loss of life by drowning in naval warfare.

Water-supply paper 280 (10 cents) lists the many hundred gaging stations maintained by the Geological Survey on the streams of the country. The extent of this work is very remarkable and its ultimate value beyond reasonable calculation. This number contains also a list of the numerous Survey publications relating to the nation's water resources.

The pamphlet collection of consular reports on cotton tare—the document of which Congress ordered the unusual number of 100,000 extra copies—is out. It is House document 577, 62d Congress, 2d session. Its most striking feature is its demonstration, by words and views, that American cotton producers are cutting their own throats by packing their cotton more poorly than the cotton of other countries. The large deductions in foreign ports for tare, due in large part to the waste by poor packing, are like a millstone around the neck of the American cotton grower. 15 cents.

Education Bureau Bulletin 7, series of 1912, is the Educational status of nursing. It appears that 30 States have passed laws regulating nurs-

ing, while more than 1,100 American schools are training nearly 30,000 nurses. Evidently, nursing is rapidly becoming one of the learned professions, as it should be. Here is a field of supreme usefulness in which woman has and can have no competition, because the perfect nurse must have, besides education, the innate charm of womanliness which can not be taught. Even now, though the profession of nursing is still in its beginnings, no other words carry more of comfort and hope to the sick and to the friends of the sick than these: "trained nurse." The price of Education Bureau Bulletin 7, series of 1912, is 10 cents.

Probably few people have a clear idea of what the duties of a noncombatant officer, the chaplain, may be in the Army. Now comes War Department document 414, Chaplain's duties and how best to accomplish his work, to enlighten us. It is a little manual, but it suffices to show that no chaplain need rust for want of employment.

Vol. 2, Official register, 1911, giving the names, stations, pay, etc., of all members of the United States postal service, is now ready. Price, in cloth, \$1.25.

Beginning in the 37th Congress (1862) and continuing to the present time, numerous bills and resolutions respecting Federal control of interstate commerce have been introduced in Congress. Each one of these has its little history, usually ending in zero, but each being an item in the general history of a great legislative movement not yet ended. These bill-histories have been scattered through many volumes of Congressional record indexes and thus have been practically inaccessible. They have been now collected and printed for the use of the Senate Committee on Interstate Commerce under the title Regulation of interstate commerce, history of bills and resolutions, etc. Statesmen and publicists will undoubtedly be grateful for this convenient tool.

Farmers' bulletin 490, Bacteria in milk, is another contribution of the Agriculture Department to the cause of sanitation. Still another is Animal Industry Bureau Circular 197, Directions for the home pasteurization of milk. 5 cents each.

Statistical abstract for 1911 is now on sale. Paper, 50 cents.

The Secretary of Commerce and Labor has issued, under date April 15, 1912, Regulations governing the operation of the Government compensation act for employees injured in the service of the United States. Paper, 5 cents.

The act taxing the manufacture of white phosphorus matches at 2 cents a hundred, a rate thought to be sufficient to put an end to the manufacture altogether, was signed by the President April 9. The United States is said to have been the last civilized country to take up the regulation of this manufacture. Distressing accounts have been published of the sufferings of matchmakers from "phossy jaw" and other diseases contracted by workers in white phosphorus. 5 cents.

The Mines Bureau continues to issue new numbers in its important series of Technical papers. Recent numbers are: 12, The behavior of nitroglycerin when heated; 19, The factor of safety in mine electrical installations; 21, The prevention of mine explosions. The Superintendent of Documents supplies these at 5 cents each.

The vest-pocket edition of the text of the party platforms of the two leading parties, 1856-1908, for years past supplied free to all comers by the clerk of the House of Representatives, is apparently this year in more demand than ever.

The special articles in Public health reports which have been reprinted in pamphlet have often been in such demand that 2d editions have been called for. Such editions are now in hand of: 46, What the local health officer can do in the prevention of typhoid fever; 48, What the mayor and city council can do in the prevention of typhoid fever; 49, The present organization and work for the protection of health in the United States; 69, Epidemic cerebrospinal meningitis; 76, The necessity for safe water supplies in the control of typhoid fever. 5 cents each.

Numerous students of Indian life and language will welcome Bulletin 47 of the Bureau of American Ethnology, A dictionary of the Biloxi and Ofo languages, accompanied with 31 Biloxi texts and numerous Biloxi phrases, by the late James Owen Dorsey and John R. Swanton. It is bound in cloth and sold by the Superintendent of Documents for 45 cents.

Monetary systems of the principal countries of the world, a new pamphlet from the Mint Bureau, is not an essay but a collection of solid facts of recent date concerning the coinage of various countries. In each case the value of the coins in United States money is stated. Copies can be supplied by the Superintendent of Documents at 5 cents.

There is a 1912 edition of Professional paper 29, the Engineer field manual, 6 parts in one. In leather, pocketbook style, \$1.00.

A Reconnaissance soil survey of western Kansas has been published by the Soils Bureau, Agriculture Department. Copies from the Superintendent of Documents, 15 cents. All the advance sheets of soil surveys published during the present year are on sale at the same price.

The first Yearbook of the Agriculture Department is dated 1894. It contains all the scientific papers formerly printed with the Annual report of the Department. The administrative matter left to make up the Annual report hardly exceeded 200 pages in 1894. During the succeeding 17 years the administrative work of the Department has been growing and there has been a corresponding growth in the size of the Annual report, until in 1911 it exceeded a thousand pages, and was considerably larger than it had been before the Yearbook was taken out of it. It presents a comprehensive view of the vast range of the beneficent activities of the Agriculture Department, and is about the only place where such a view can be obtained.

Public Roads Office Bulletin 43, Highway bridges and culverts, is an up-to-date version of Bulletin 39 of the same office. Modern concrete construction is described and illustrated. Price 15 cents.

Standards Bureau Circular 33, announced as just coming out of press, is a most timely publication, an important contribution to the literature of the Age of Cement. Its title is: United States Government specifications for Portland cement. Presumably it will establish the American standard for quality of this great structural material. Copies can be supplied by the Superintendent of Documents.

Special agents series 51, Manufactures Bureau, Cotton goods in Russia, is a report conveying information which may be familiar to the cotton trade but certainly is not so to the average reader. It is shown that Russia is the fourth cotton-producing country in the world; that it grows more than half the cotton it consumes, and that it exports more cotton goods than it imports. Turkestan and the Caucasus are the districts where cotton is grown and has been grown from the most ancient times. The cotton industry in all its branches is firmly established and highly prosperous in Russia.

The Annual report of the United States Life-Saving Service for 1911 is an interesting volume. Its subjects are difficult rescues, restoration of the apparently drowned, awards of life-saving medals, report of the Board on Life-Saving Appliances, and others along similar lines. Cloth, 30 cents.

The President's Commission on Economy and Efficiency has published its Circular 21, Memorandum of conclusions reached by the Commission concerning the principles that should govern in the matter of handling and filing correspondence and preparing and mailing communications, etc. Business men as well as Government officials may find useful hints in the pamphlet.

Farm management, organization of research and teaching. This is Plant Industry Bureau Bulletin 236. It seems to point to the fact that the modern farmer on a large scale must be a student as well as various other things.

There is a 5th revision, dated April 13, 1912, of the Secretary of Agriculture's Circular 21, Rules and regulations for the enforcement of the food and drugs act. 5 cents.

Farmers' bulletin 492, The more important insect and fungous enemies of the fruit and foliage of the apple, is a timely issue in these days of expanding and profitable apple culture. 5 cents.

The Index number of vol. 25, Experiment station record, July-Dec. 1911, was issued April 9.

Animal Industry Bureau Circular 184, Pasteurization of milk, tells what pasteurization is and how to do it. There are many different ways, and many different kinds of apparatus therefor. Probably nowhere else in so brief a compass or at so small a price can so much information on the subject be obtained. 5 cents.

Senate document 615, Address of President Taft at Boston April 25; Senate document 616, Address of former President Roosevelt in reply to Senate document 615, at Worcester, Mass., April 26; Senate document 617, Reply of President Taft to the Reply of former President Roosevelt to the Address of President Taft, were all ordered printed April 29, on motion of Senator Reed of Missouri, no objection being made by any Senator.

The 1912 edition of the Special report on the diseases of cattle, ordered printed in an edition of 100,000 copies by resolution approved Mar. 4, 1911, is now available. The letter of transmittal states that for the new edition it was necessary to make only a few slight changes. Cloth, \$1.00.

Special consular reports 51, Foreign trade in denatured alcohol, indicates that such trade is more active and general abroad than here, where free alcohol for power has been something of a disappointment. 5 cents.

Proceedings of the national park conference, Yellowstone National Park, Sept. 11 and 12, 1911, is a document that will interest pleasure travelers and vacation seekers. The members of the conference were national park officials and transportation men who are interested in travel to and from the parks. Secretary Fisher of the Interior Department presided and the needs and prospects of the parks were considered from various points of view.

International radio telegraph convention of Berlin, 1906, and propositions for the international radio telegraph conference of London, is a new Navy Department pamphlet. The London conference is to be held in June of this year and the "propositions" are proposed amendments of the convention signed at the Berlin conference of 1906. Radio telegraphy is the formal name for wireless telegraphy. The United States is a party to the convention of Berlin (a plan for joint international control of radio telegraphy), and will of course be represented at the London conference, which, in view of the Titanic calamity, may be expected to take radical action for the better control of radio operators and radiograms.

No volume of Foreign relations of the United States has been printed for 1909, 1910, or 1911. The entry for the 1908 volume appears in this catalogue, but as to 1909, 1910, and 1911 no information is obtainable. The time of publication of these volumes of diplomatic correspondence is entirely within the discretion of the State Department.

One of the important books of the month is the Report of the commissioner of corporations on water-power development in the United States. It is in 3 parts, but all are in one volume, well illustrated by tables, charts, and maps. It is notable for its good tables of contents, lists of tables and illustrations, and index. It is in paper covers and sells at 45 cents.

Plant Industry Bureau Bulletin 250, Diseases of ginseng and their control, is out of press. Price 15 cents. This is the first important Government publication on ginseng, but others are promised.

House document 643, 62d Congress, 2d session, in 2 volumes, is the report of the Tariff Board on tariff schedule I, Cotton manufactures, transmitted to Congress Mar. 26 last. Vol. 2 contains photographic reproductions of 100 samples of textiles.

Vol. 24 of the Superintendent of Documents' set of the publications of the National Monetary Commission is now ready, completing the set.

The 3d edition of the Congressional directory for the 62d Congress, 2d session, corrected to Mar. 28, 1912, is now on sale by the Superintendent of Documents at 60 cents in cloth.

Twenty-four of the 42 volumes of the Reports of the Immigration Commission had been received up to May 1st. The aggregate price of the 24 volumes is \$11.95, the average being a fraction less than 50 cents a volume. It is thought safe to estimate that the cost of the 42 volumes will be not less than \$20 and not more than \$25. All are in paper covers. It is supposed that the publication of vol. 42, which will be a general index, will be considerably delayed.

FOR NUMISMATISTS

Catalogue of coins, tokens, and medals in the numismatic collection of the mint of the United States at Philadelphia, Pa. This is the title of a book of 634 pages of text and 16 pages of plates illustrating early and rare coins of this country and of other American republics which will be welcome to collectors and students. Numismatic collectors are numerous and eager for information in their line which this book will supply.

In addition to its descriptions of lawful money, it describes numerous "tokens" which have been used as substitutes for money at critical periods in the country's history. Also the historical medals which were numerous ordered by Congress to commemorate some remarkable event or to compliment some prominent citizen in the closing years of the 18th and the first half of the 19th century. The coins of the other American republics are also listed, as well as those of European countries, ancient and modern.

In a modest note at the back of the book the cataloguer apologizes for the incompleteness of the collection and consequently of the catalogue. Making all due allowance for any such shortcomings, it is safe to say that the collection is a remarkable one and that the catalogue, though making no display of typography or illustration, serves well its office as a guide. Sold by the Superintendent of Documents, cloth, \$1.00.

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

A 2d edition of State and national laws concerning the weights and measures of the United States has been issued by the Standards Bureau. The former edition was published in 1904, and since that time numerous changes have been made—all, however, by State legislation. While it is true that the Constitution expressly authorizes Congress to fix the standards of all weights and measures, it is also true that Congress has not exercised this authority.

The early Presidents, Washington, Adams, Jefferson, urged the importance of the subject upon Congress, but unavailingly. Congress did, however, pass a resolution, in response to which John Quincy Adams, a man of many-sided learning, then Secretary of State, in 1821 wrote a somewhat famous report on weights and measures which was published in the 16th Congress, 2d session, as House document 109 and Senate document 119.

Though no Congressional action followed, the Treasury Department found it necessary, in the course of its duties in enforcing the customs laws, to establish standards for the fundamentals, the pound, yard, gallon, and bushel. These have been made State standards by legislative action in only a part of the States. As to other weights and measures State action is discordant and Federal action wanting.

The new compend of information on this important subject is well printed on unusually thick and smooth paper, making a large book, though its pages number less than 600. It is dated Jan. 1, 1912. Its price, from the Superintendent of Documents, is 85 cents.

NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART

This is at last a reality. National Museum Bulletin 70, published 1909, made this reasonably clear, and Bulletin 78, published 1912, puts it beyond doubt. This latest bulletin is: Catalogue of a selection of art objects from the Freer collection exhibited in the new building of the National Museum, April 15 to June 15, 1912. Citizens who have doubt of the existence of a national gallery, or of its worthiness, should see the exhibition now open and also should read Bulletins 70 and 78, which may be had from the Superintendent of Documents. No. 70, richly illustrated, is \$1.00. No. 78 is 10 cents.

A NEW HOLIDAY

It seems there is to be a new annual holiday—in the schools, at least, with proper observances to impress upon young minds the importance of Peace day, which is the name of the new anniversary. The date is May 18, which is also the date of the assembling of the first Hague Conference. The Education Bureau has issued as Bulletin 8, series of 1912, Peace day, suggestions and material for its observance in the schools. It is not to be expected that on the first occasion the new anniversary will be observed in all the schools, but the strong demand for Bulletin 8, of which the Superintendent of Documents has sold a good many thousands, indicates already a wide-spread interest. The bulletin contains information concerning The Hague tribunal and various associations for the promotion of international peace and conditions for the award of prizes which are offered for essays on the subject; also a compilation of selections in prose and verse appropriate for school use on Peace day and a bibliography of recent peace publications.

A NEW BUREAU

April 9 President Taft signed the law creating the Children's Bureau in the Commerce and Labor Department. April 17 he sent to the Senate the name of Julia C. Lathrop of Illinois as nominee for chief of the new Bureau. April 23 the nomination was confirmed by the Senate. Miss Lathrop is the first woman to be appointed chief of bureau in the United States Government service.

The new Bureau is of considerable magnitude even at the outset, and, like other bureaus, will undoubtedly grow. The law provides for a chief at \$5,000 a year; an assistant chief at \$2,400; a private secretary at \$1,500; a statistical expert at \$2,000; 2 clerks of class 4 (\$1,800 each); 2 clerks of class 3 (\$1,600 each); 1 clerk of class 2 (\$1,400); 1 clerk of class 1 (\$1,200); 1 clerk at \$1,000; 1 copyist at \$900; 1 special agent at \$1,400; 1 special agent at \$1,200; 1 messenger at \$840; total, \$25,640 for salaries. The Secretary of Commerce and Labor has sent in estimates for the new Bureau as follows: Rent, \$2,000; contingent expenses, \$15,000; printing, \$10,000, the aggregate being \$52,640.

Evidently it is planned to be an important bureau. Its duties, as defined in the law creating it, are to "investigate and report upon all matters pertaining to the welfare of children and child life among all classes of our people, especially investigate the questions of infant mortality, the birth rate, orphanage, juvenile courts, desertion, dangerous occupations, accidents and diseases of children, employment, and legislation affecting children."

Miss Lathrop is a native of Illinois, a graduate and a trustee of Vassar College, has long been associated with Jane Addams in Hull House, has served three terms as a member of the State Board of Charities of Illinois, and has been active in securing a juvenile court and probation law and other reform legislation in her State and in exposing abuses in State charitable institutions.

A NEW LEGAL SERIES

In a circular dated May 3, 1912, the Librarian of Congress announces the publication of *Guide to the law and legal literature of Germany*, by Edwin M. Borchard, law librarian, being the first of a series of guides to foreign law now in course of preparation in the Library.

The occasion for the series arises out of the great increase in our day of international intercourse and the constantly enlarging number of Americans traveling abroad and living abroad, to whom a knowledge of the laws of the foreign lands in which they are domiciled is not only a convenience but often a necessity.

Though Mr. Borchard's volume at the time of writing had not been received, and therefore is not entered in this catalogue in its proper place under the heading Library of Congress, it will undoubtedly be on sale by the Superintendent of Documents before this note falls under the reader's eye. It is a cloth bound book of 226 pages. The price is 65 cents. Postage to foreign countries 12 cents. An idea of its comprehensiveness may be gathered from a list of its chapter headings which are: Bibliography, legislation, court reports, legal education, philosophy of law, legal history, civil code, literary and industrial property, commercial law, bankruptcy, social insurance, labor law, civil procedure, criminal law and procedure, law reform, public law. It contains an extensive Glossary of technical terms with English translations and a comprehensive index.

A SERIES DISCONTINUED

In 1881 the Mint Bureau issued Report of the director of the mint upon the statistics of the production of the precious metals in the United States. Though the title does not say so, the statistics given were those of the production of gold and silver for the calendar year 1880. A like report was issued as a separate volume for each succeeding calendar year up to 1909, making a set of 30 volumes, 1909 being the last issue in this form.

The statistics are still to be gathered and published, but not in a separate volume. The Precious metals report will hereafter be part 2 of the Annual report of the director of the mint for the following year; that is, the Report of the production of precious metals for the calendar year 1910

is part 2 of the Annual report of the director of the mint for the fiscal year 1911, the two being printed in one volume.

The explanation is made that the public confused the two annual reports from the Mint Bureau, asking for the Annual report when the Precious metals report was wanted, and vice versa. By issuing but one report, covering the ground formerly occupied by both, no such confusion can arise. The annual report for the fiscal year 1911, carrying as part 2 the Precious metals report for the calendar year 1910, is now on sale by the Superintendent of Documents at 45 cents in cloth.

CORRIGENDA

Education Bureau Bulletin 6, series of 1912, page 7, the heading states: "Papers read at the second annual meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, Columbus, Ohio, November 14, 1911." Of course this is a slip of the pen. The 2d annual meeting of the American Association specified was not held in 1911, but in 1849. The one which really met in Columbus in 1911, and before which the papers now printed as Education Bureau Bulletin 6 were read, is the American Association for the Advancement of Agricultural Teaching, as correctly appears on other pages of Bulletin 6.

Librarians, navigators, and all buyers of Bowditch's Practical navigator (Hydrographic Office Publication no. 9), edition of 1912, are likely to be puzzled by the fact that Part 1 ends at page 339 while Part 2 does not begin till page 501, no explanation of the hiatus of 162 pages appearing in the book itself. There is, however, an explanation. The omission is not accidental. A revision and expansion of the text of Part 1 is going on. It is not known when it will be completed nor how many pages it will fill. An estimate was made, however, resulting in the beginning of Part 2, Tables, on page 501. It is hoped that this will leave clearance enough to prevent the expanding text of Part 1 from colliding with the Tables of Part 2. It is, however, too much to expect that the new matter will exactly fill the missing 162 pages, so that some additional readjustment will probably be necessary even after the new text of Part 1 has been incorporated in the volume. So far, however, from the 1912 edition being 162 pages deficient as compared with earlier editions, the 1912 edition is larger than its predecessors. Tables 45, Haversines; 46, Corrections to be applied to the observed altitude of a star or of the Sun's lower limb to find the true altitude; 47, Longitude factors; and 48, Latitude factors, have been added. Table 45 is a very extensive table, filling more than a hundred pages. The total number of pages is 933 less 162, equaling 771, while the last previous edition had but 652 pages.

Senate document 305, 62d Congress, 2d session, is also Entomology Bureau Bulletin 114, but the customary bureau edition has not been printed, the 2000 copies ordered by the Bureau bearing the Senate document number instead of the Bureau bulletin number, though that number is parenthetically stated in the letter of transmittal. No precedent is known for this method of publication. It will be troublesome to librarians unless they read this notice and take warning by it. The Superin-

tendent of Documents will explain it to buyers. The subject of Senate document 305 (Entomology Bureau Bulletin 114) is the Mexican cotton-boll weevil, being a restatement of the result of all the investigations up to the close of the year 1911.

Topographic sheets

NOTE.—The Geological Survey is making a topographic map of the United States. The sheets of which it is composed are projected without reference to political divisions, and are designated by some prominent town or natural feature found on them. Three scales are ordinarily used, 1:62,500, 1:125,000 and 1:250,000. These correspond, approximately, to 1 mile, 2 miles, and 4 miles to 1 linear inch, covering, respectively, average areas of 230, 920, and 3,700 square miles. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. The size, unless otherwise given, is about 17.5 inches in height by 11.5 to 16 inches in width, exclusive of the margin, the width varying with the latitude. A description of the topographic map is printed on the reverse of each sheet.

More than one-third of the area of the country, excluding outlying possessions, has been mapped, every State being represented. Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia are completely mapped.
