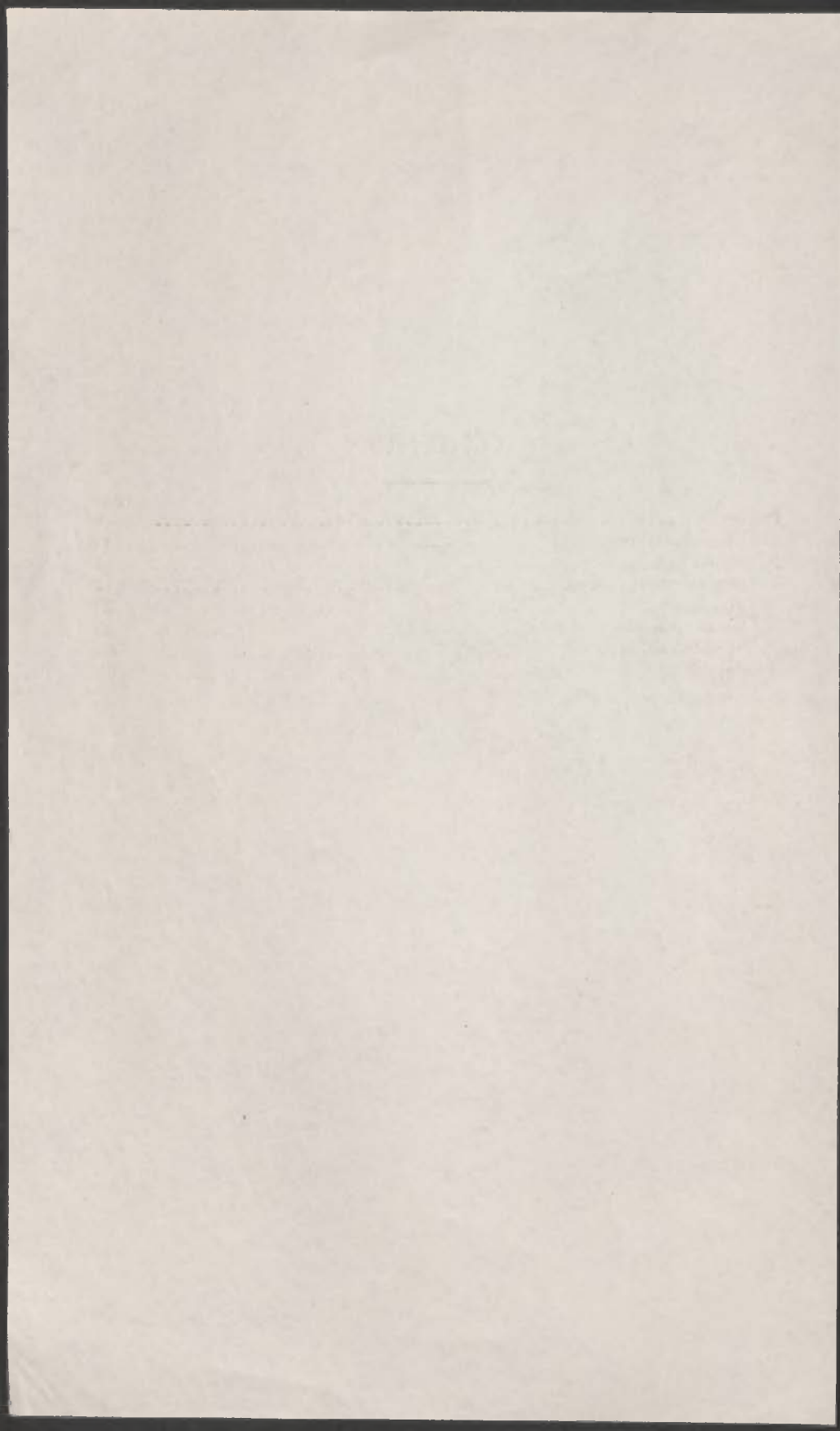
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PREFACE

The documents included in the Numerical Lists and Schedule of Volumes for the second session of the Eighty-second Congress herewith presented number 2,742 divided as follows: 1,064 Senate reports; 1,291 House reports; 81 Senate documents; 306 House documents. Senate report 755, pt. 2 and House report 505, pts. 2 and 3 are parts of reports of the 82d Congress, 1st session, and are not included in the total figure.

Serial number 11564 is assigned to the Senate Journal and number 11565 is assigned to the House Journal of the second session of the Eighty-second Congress.

The bound set of congressional reports and documents listed in the Schedule of Volumes, p. 61, represents a set which is distributed only to the Senate and House libraries, the Library of Congress, the National Archives, and the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. Although this complete bound set is not sent to depository libraries and international exchanges as such, all publications included in the volumes thereof will be received by them if selection has been previously made under the provisions of continuing legislation which was first authorized by Public Act 171, Sixty-seventh Congress, approved March 29, 1922. The annual and serial publications of the departments, bureaus, and independent establishments of the Government and certain other publications prepared by Government agencies are sent without the congressional document numbers on the title pages and in the binding used by the offices issuing them; the other publications are sent bound in volumes corresponding to those listed in the schedule.

For the benefit of those libraries desiring to keep the serial arrangement, the serial numbers will be printed upon strips which will be furnished, on request, to designated depositories and international exchanges for attachment to the bound books.
