NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a * price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS—FOLLOWS CONTENTS

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25-percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record, Federal register, Supreme Court reports, Catalog of copyright entries, and Climatological data for United States, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

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A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

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In addition to the price lists,¹¹ the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 458, 75-3.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

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TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check List of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a: So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23^a: So 96^a in a library.

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS

Labor Standards, published by the Labor Standards Division of the Labor Department, is one of the periodicals recently approved for publication in printed form by the Director of the Bureau of the Budget. The April 1938 number is designated as volume 1, number 1, but it was preceded by a processed publication which began in March 1936 with the title Labor Administration Survey, containing current news of State and Federal action on health, safety, and employment standards. The title was changed with the second issue to Survey of Labor Law Administration and has appeared with that title ever since, the last processed number being for January 1938. The change to a printed publication was made because of the many requests from labor law administrators, labor, employer, and civic groups for information concerning the promotion of labor standards and the enactment and enforcement of State labor laws. It is the function and aim of the Division of Labor Standards to act as a clearing house for information on safety regulations and industrial occupational hazards, and currently to advise State departments of labor and other agencies having a legitimate interest in labor problems on labor legislation and related matters. This monthly periodical, Labor Standards, is intended to be a distinct aid in carrying out this program. The processed publication was distributed free, but the printed publication is issued on a subscription basis. It is for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., at 10c. single copy, subscription price 75c. a year, foreign subscription, \$1.15.

Social Security Bulletin is another periodical recently approved for printing. The first printed number is for March 1938, and has volume 1, numbers 1-3 on the cover and also on page 1. It is proposed by the Social Security Board to publish it monthly and it will report current data on operations of the Social Security Board and the results of research and analysis pertinent to the social security program. The Bulletin was preceded by a processed publication, a monthly desk bulletin issued for the use of the Social Security Board as a record of current data pertinent to its activities. The initial numbers were entitled Selected Current Statistics and were issued from August 1936 to June 1937. Since July 1937, it has carried the title used for the printed numbers, Social Security Bulletin. As now issued, it will serve as a link between the Nation-wide organization of the Board and the groups of Federal, State, and local agencies directly concerned with administration of the social security program. It is hoped that it will prove of use to students of public affairs, sociologists, economists, political scientists, editors and writers, social workers, social security administrators, Federal and State agencies, research organizations, reference librarians, and individuals interested in the development of social security. As now published, it embraces three monthly periodicals which have been issued separately for some time. These are Public Assistance, Relief in Rural and Town Areas, and Relief in Urban Areas. These sections, included in the March 1938 number of the Social Security Bulletin, have been issued in separate form also as preprints from the Bulletin. In its printed form the

Social Security Bulletin has been made available on a subscriptional basis to organizations and individuals concerned with social security and is for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., 20c. for a single copy, the subscription price in the United States, Canada, and Mexico being \$2.00 a year; other countries, \$3.75.

Indian Education, a fortnightly field letter of the Education Division, Office of Indian Affairs, was printed at first (the first number being dated September 15, 1936) by the students of Phoenix Indian School Print Shop and distributed on request to schools, libraries, members of the service and Indians in the interest of better understanding of the American Indian. Beginning with 9, dated March 1, 1937, the Haskell Institute Print Shop issued the first number in each month, and since September 15, 1937, the Chillico Agricultural School Print Shop has printed the issue for the fifteenth, taking the place of the print shop at the Phoenix Indian School. The number dated April 1, 1938 (no. 28) carries the announcement that publication is suspended for the time being, but also says: "It is hoped that resumption may be authorized in the next fiscal year."

The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratuitously* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world.
