NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The amazing variety of topics treated of in the United States public documents furnishes fresh cause for wonderment in each Monthly catalogue. The present Catalogue, for May, 1908, is in no wise behind its predecessors in the varied interest of the official publications to which it supplies a guide.

It is not a wide-spread popular belief that census reports have a general and enduring popularity with the reading public, yet we have this month a fifth edition of the ponderous Agriculture volume (v. 6) of the twelfth census. There would not be a fifth edition if the four preceding editions had not been exhausted by the popular demand.

Part 1 of a summary of the Report of the commissioner of corporations on cotton exchanges has been issued.

Bulletin 94 of the Census Bureau is composed of statistics of employees, executive civil service of the United States. The total number of employees is given as 286,902, of whom a little over 10 per cent, or 29,103, are employed in Washington. If there is any kind of employee that is not employed by the Government it must be a rather rare kind. The list in Bulletin 94 is not in detail, but in groups and classes, yet such titles of employees as these are found in it: Appraisers, apprentices, architects, attorneys, bakers, botanists, chaplains, collaborators, collectors, computers, cooks, curators, domestics, detectives, editors, experts, farmers, firemen, fish culturists, gaugers, geographers, guards, internes, interpreters, janitors, keepers, librarians, laborers, melters, mates, musicians, nurses, openers, packers, pharmacists, stewards, surfmen, statisticians, storekeepers, samplers, taggers, teachers, translators, watchmen, woodworkers, and zoologists.

In the medical line we have Bulletin 43 of the Hygienic Laboratory, Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service, on the Standardization of tetanus antitoxin; Drill regulations and outlines of first aid to the injured, for the Hospital Corps of the Army; Bulletin 104 of the Animal Industry Bureau, Agriculture Department, entitled Medical milk commissions and the production of certified milk in the United States; and Bulletin 112, part 2, of the Chemistry Bureau, Agriculture Department, Food legislation during the fiscal year 1907.

Of the great Geologic atlas of the United States upon which the Geological Survey has been engaged for a quarter-century, two new folios are issued for the month: No. 156, the Elk Point folio, which includes parts of the States of South Dakota, Nebraska, and Iowa, and No. 158, Rockland, Me.

Volumes 11 and 12 of the Library of Congress print of the Journals of the Continental Congress, issued by the Manuscripts Division, are now available, bringing the record down to the close of the year 1778.

Farmers' bulletin 327 is on the Conservation of natural resources, and its author is Forester Gifford Pinchot: a subject of vital moment treated by a master hand.

Of timely interest, we have the following fresh from the press: List of works relating to the first and second banks of the United States, with chronological list of reports, etc., contained in the American state papers and in the Congressional documents; Statistical abstract of the United States, 1907.

Bulletin 74 of the Labor Bureau is on the Legal liability of employers for injuries to employees in the United States. It is stated that laws relating to such liability have been enacted in 22 foreign countries.

Bulletin 329 of the United States Geological Survey is of present economical interest, being on the Organization, equipment, and operation of the structural-materials testing laboratories at St. Louis. The pamphlet is fully illustrated and will give careful readers a clear understanding of the methods of the important work which has been done at St. Louis during the few years last past.

Bulletin 1, series of 1908, Education Bureau, has the interesting theme, On the training of persons to teach agriculture in the public schools, and it is by the eminent agricultural author, Prof. Liberty Hyde Bailey, of Cornell University.

Some hard nuts for legal minds to crack would be found in a pamphlet from the Naval War College, if it were not for the fact that the solutions are supplied in the same publication. Its title is, International law situations, with solutions and notes. Because naval officers may at times represent the Government in any part of the world, they must be well grounded in international law, and one of the means of testing and increasing their knowledge is that of submitting to them various hypothetical "situations" to which they are to furnish "solutions."

The Adjutant-General of the Army has promulgated a little volume which will be more interesting than a novel to that large part of the bone and sinew of the land which is enrolled in the National Guard of the various States and Territories. Its title is Regulations of the War Department governing the organized militia under the Constitution and laws of the United States.

GEORGE CATLIN

None of the books written by George Catlin is a public document of the United States, but the unsuccessful efforts of many prominent persons, prolonged for many years, to induce Congress to buy the hundreds of portraits of Indians painted from the life by him and the numerous objects illustrative of Indian life which he had collected during eight years' habitation among the tribes, and the

final acquirement of these collections by the National Museum after they had suffered from neglect and vicissitude for a generation, are interesting episodes described in various numbered Congressional documents (409-636; 476-374; 491-806; 511-152; 527-820; 2432-15). Mr. Donaldson's thorough account of the Catlin gallery (National Museum Report, 1885, Appendix, part 5) contains also an excellent biography of Catlin and lists of his works, both literary and artistic. Mr. Catlin never received a cent of subsidy from the Government. He maintained himself and family in Europe for many years by exhibiting his gallery of Indian paintings and curios. The proposal to buy his paintings and collections for \$65,000 was once lost in Congress by a single vote in the Senate, and the failure was attributed to the jealous opposition of another artist, J. M. Stanley, who also had Indian pictures to sell. There was fierce rivalry, in the first half of the nineteenth century, between those who were exploiting the Indians for the fame and fortune of the exploiters. Schoolcraft published a note questioning the truth of Catlin's account of certain religious ceremonies among the Mandans. Catlin resented this, and brought forward in defense much corroborative evidence. He wrote Humboldt that Schoolcraft "had not the industry or courage to go within a thousand miles of the Mandans." Catlin was born in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., 1796, and died in Jersey City, 1872. For the last ten years of his life he suffered the severe disability of total deafness.

HENRY ROWE SCHOOLCRAFT

Schoolcraft's books relating to the North American Indians were found desirable for distribution by Congresses before the civil war. Mr. Schoolcraft, who was born near Albany, N. Y., 1793, and married an Indian wife at Mackinaw, 1823, began his exploring trips among the tribes as early as 1820 and began publishing his narratives in 1821, but it was not till 1847 that he got the first appropriation from Congress for the publication of his chief work. When the Treasury tap was once started it flowed freely. The first appropriation, March 3, 1847, was \$5,000, and others followed in this order: January 26, 1849, \$5,000; September 30, 1850, \$10,000; February 27, 1851, \$19,361; July 21, 1852, \$28,875; March 3, 1853, \$17,620; March 3, 1855, \$17,200. In none of the appropriation bills does Schoolcraft's name appear. The first appropriation was made "to enable the Bureau of Indian Affairs" (then an office in the War Department) "to collect and digest such statistics and materials as may illustrate the history, present condition, and future prospects of the Indian tribes," and the succeeding appropriations were made "to continue" the same work. Notwithstanding the liberality of the subsidies, the work moved slowly, and not until July, 1852, did Congress find it needful to make a special appropriation for printing and binding the first volume. In this appropriation act the legislators gave evidence of impatience by providing that the work should be finished in five volumes and that at least one volume should be

published every year. Nevertheless the work grew to six volumes, and Schoolcraft had two more ready, but Congress would not pay for printing them. The series was peremptorily wound up by adding to the final appropriation (1855) the proviso that the money was "for the completion of the sixth and last volume," and that "said volume shall embrace all the material now or to be collected, and be completed within two years," and also that the text should be submitted to the Secretary of the Interior before publication "for revision with a view to the curtailment of all matter useless, irrelevant, or inconsistent."

In his latter years Schoolcraft was a paralytic and had no use of his hands. Typewriters were then undreamed of and stenographers were few. The volumes for which Congress paid so handsomely were mainly written and compiled, under his direction, by his second wife, a white woman. The full title of the second (which is the standard) edition of his work is: "Information respecting the history, condition, and prospects of the Indian tribes of the United States: collected and prepared under the direction of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, per act of Congress, March 3, 1847, by Henry R. Schoolcraft. Illustrated by Seth Eastman, captain, U. S. A. Published by authority of Congress. Philadelphia, Lippincott, Grambo & Co., 1853-1858. 6 vols. 4°." Volume 6 has a special title, "History of the Indian tribes of the United States." The first edition, 1851-1857, has the words "Historical and statistical" as the first of the title, which otherwise is as found in the second edition. There is also an edition entitled "Archives of aboriginal knowledge, containing all the original papers laid before Congress," etc. None of these volumes is found in the series of numbered Congressional documents.

There are conflicting opinions as to the merit of Schoolcraft's work. In a letter to Catlin, Humboldt calls it "a huge scrap-book," but no room was found in it for mention of George Catlin, a contemporary painter of and writer concerning the Indians. He also had wares to sell to Congress, and was probably looked upon as a rival. Schoolcraft published several minor works, but not under the patronage of Congress. He died in Washington, 1864.
