NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

NEW GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND CHANGES IN FORMER ORGANIZATIONS

Under the provisions of Public Act No. 1, Seventy-fourth Congress, approved January 1, 1935, the Reconstruction Finance Corporation is authorized to continue to perform its functions until February 1, 1937, or such earlier date as the President may fix by proclamation, and the liquidation and winding up of its affairs as provided for by section 13 of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, as amended, are postponed during the period that the functions of the Corporation are continued pursuant to the act of January 1, 1935.

The Bureau of Agricultural Economics announces the organization of a Division of Marketing Research as an aid to their new program of research on problems of marketing agricultural products.

NEW PERIODICALS

The Federal Emergency Relief Administration has recently started the publication of two periodicals entitled *The Project* and *Concerning Workers' Education*. *The Project* is an illustrated monthly bulletin issued in conjunction with the Federal Surplus Relief Corporation, and is printed by the Citizens' Service Exchange, Richmond, Va. *Concerning Workers' Education* appears at somewhat irregular intervals and is not printed at the Government Printing Office, being reproduced by a process other than printing, by an outside agency. Application for both periodicals should be made to the Federal Emergency Relief Administration, Washington, D. C.

Topographic maps

NOTE.—The Geological Survey is making a series of topographic maps that will eventually cover the whole United States, also Alaska and Hawaii. The individual maps are projected to represent quadrangle areas rather than political divisions, and each map is designated by the name of some prominent town or natural feature in the area mapped. The scales most commonly used are 1:31,680, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding, approximately, to ½ mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered differs with the latitude, but the average area is 58, 230, or 920 square miles, respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by 16½ inches, and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17½ inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. A general description of topographic maps and a list of the symbols used are printed on the reverse of each sheet.

About 46 percent of the area of the country, excluding Alaska, has been mapped, every State being represented. Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are completely mapped. Twenty-four of the topographic maps covering areas in New Jersey are out of print, the Survey not reprinting the maps as the stocks become exhausted but referring applicants to the Department of Conservation and Development, at Trenton, which publishes maps on a larger scale. Maps of the regular size are sold by the Geological Survey at 10c. each. Except as otherwise indicated, a discount of 40 percent is allowed on any order which amounts to \$5.00 at the retail price. TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—A list of post route maps, prepared primarily for the postal service but available to the public, is given below. New editions are published about once a year. Each of these maps shows all post offices within the State and indicates how each is supplied with mail. County boundaries are shown and each county is named, but only the principal drainage features are delineated. These maps show no highways and only such railroads as carry mail. The maps listed at 60 cents each are single-sheet maps; those priced at \$1.20 are 2-sheet maps.

Rural delivery routes, not indicated on the post route maps, are shown in detail on county or local center maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,470 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows, in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline

No sets of these are for sale or distribution, as most of the volumes are out of print. Special publications are also issued from time to time. The papers issued in the series of Contributions to Knowledge and Miscellaneous collections are not public documents, but are printed in limited editions at the expense of the Smithsonian Fund. They are distributed without charge to public libraries, educational establishments, and learned societies in this country and abroad; and are supplied to other institutions, and to individuals at the prices indicated. Remittances should be made payable to the 'Smithsonian Institution.' A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratuitously* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. The Institution maintains mailing-lists of public libraries and other educational establishments, but no *general mailing-list of individuals*. A library making application to be listed for Smithsonian publications should state the number of volumes which it contains and the date of its establishment, and have the endorsement of a Member of Congress."

Although the annual reports are the only Smithsonian publications that are regularly issued as public documents, the others are usually regarded as such and have free transmission by mail, therefore they are listed in the Monthly catalog.

Treaties and are numbered in a separate series and are numbered in the order in which they are proclaimed. Treaties are also published in the compilation Treaties and other international acts of the United States of America, which contains literal copies of the documents, followed by notes of a textual and procedural character. Indexes to the Press releases are supplied semiannually, as of December 31 and June 30. The Department of State includes in the Press release series, each quarter, a complete list of its publications for the preceding quarter.
