NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The Agriculture Department during the month of April made large contributions to the cause of agricultural education—and no cause is more vital to the national prosperity.

Animal Industry Bureau issued Circulars 126, 127, and 129. The first named describes a simple method of keeping creamery accounts. Number 127 presents evidence relative to the infection of butter by the bacillus of tuberculosis (consumption). Number 129 demonstrates that rabies (hydrophobia) is becoming increasingly prevalent. Theoretically it is one of the most easily eradicated of contagious diseases. All that is required for its extermination is that all dogs shall be kept muzzled for a few years. This has been demonstrated in several European countries. Whether this remedy can be effectively applied in this country is considered very doubtful, and in view of this doubt the Bureau believes the widest publicity should be given to the information found in Circular 129.

Chemistry Bureau offers, in its Bulletin 108, chemical and microscopical examinations of the commercial feeding stuffs of the United States. The pamphlet is well illustrated and supplies information of prime value to all classes of stock growers. From the same Bureau we have also Part 1 of Bulletin 112, which when completed will be a compilation of the food laws of the United States and of all the individual States and Territories enacted during the year ended June 30, 1907. Part 1 contains the Federal laws and those of the States in alphabetical order, Alabama to New Hampshire, inclusive.

Entomology Bureau supplies a second revision of Circular 37, on the use of hydrocyanic-acid gas for fumigating greenhouses and cold frames. Also, Part 1 of Technical series 16, entitled The national collection of Coccidæ (scale insects). This collection is said to be the most complete and valuable of its kind.

Experiment Stations Office, in its Bulletin 199, reports the proceedings of the 12th annual meeting of the American Association of Farmers' Institute Workers, held in this city last October. The members of this association are agricultural experts and their proceedings are of corresponding value to agricultural readers. The 46th number in the series called Experiment station work, is issued as Farmers' bulletin 320. It contains a round dozen fresh articles on farm topics.

Farmers' bulletins for the month (besides 320 and 321, mentioned elsewhere) are numbers 318 and 319, the first on that great southern crop, the cowpea, especially as to cheapening the cost of seed peas, and the second entitled Demonstration work in cooperation with

southern farmers. This describes one of the most successful methods of agricultural education yet put in practice by the Government. It is that of sending expert agents right to the farms to demonstrate to the farmers on their own premises the most modern and improved methods of cultivation. It began as a part of the fight against the cotton-boll weevil, and has since been extended to other kinds of farming. There is also a second revision of Bulletin 127, the standard publication on insecticides. Also an unrevised reprint of a 1905 Bulletin, no. 231, Spraying for cucumber and melon diseases, with the date changed to 1908.

Forest Service issues Circular 145, Forest planting on the northern prairies, and Circular 148, Practical results in basket willow culture. Also the large new forest map, in four sheets, which when put together make a handsome and striking wall map, showing the original forested regions in varying shades of red, the prairie regions uncolored, the waters in blue, and the national forests in bright green. The map presents not only the continental United States, but also all the outlying possessions. It is entirely new and shows the lines as they are to-day. For copies of the complete map, in four sections, remit 50c. to the Superintendent of Documents. There will be no free distribution of this map, not even to Designated depository libraries.

Plant Industry Bureau offers Bulletins 121, a collection of Miscellaneous papers; 123, Decay of oranges while in transit from California; 125, Dry-land olive culture in northern Africa; and 127, The improvement of mountain meadows. The same Bureau, which hitherto has issued all its educational publications as numbered bulletins, has now begun a series of numbered circulars, which are pamphlets of smaller size than the bulletins, but similar in character and purpose. The numbers thus far issued are 1 and 5. The title of no. 1 is Self-boiled lime-sulphur mixture as a promising fungicide. No. 5 is Barley culture in the northern Great Plains. Numbers 2, 3, and 4 are not yet through the press. Plant Industry Bureau gives us also one of those Familiar talks on farming which are helping the division of Farmers' Coöperative Demonstration Work to put new life into southern agriculture, and a leaflet, Cultural directions for bamboo, in aid of the effort which the Department is making to naturalize in the United States that most useful of oriental plants.

Public Roads Office publishes Circular 89, Progress reports of experiments with dust preventives. The advent of the automobile has made the dust question an even more serious and pressing one with road-builders than it was before. Recognizing that the self-moving vehicles are a permanency and that their use is sure to become more and more general, road engineers are directing every energy toward producing road surfaces which can withstand the action of the swift autos. The Public Roads Office has also supplied Farmers' bulletin 321. The use of the split-log drag on earth roads. The split-log drag is a very simple and cheap road-making

implement, with which remarkable results have been secured. It has been made the subject of a speech and a picture in the Congressional record.

Publications Division issues a new print of its Circular 1, revised to Jan. 1, 1908, sketching the organization of the Agriculture Department at that date. To such dimensions has this great Department grown that 41 closely packed pages are required merely to give a skeleton outline of its organization.

Soils Bureau issues Soil survey of Merrimack County, N. H., with map. These county surveys do not gain general circulation, but for the residents of the counties which are surveyed and described they are about the most entertaining and useful publication they can get hold of. From this Bureau we have also Bulletin 51, Absorption of vapors and gases by soils.

Weather Bureau issues the second part of a new quarterly periodical, Bulletin of the Mount Weather Observatory, in which record will be made of the results of the research work done at Mount Weather.

The Department as a whole issues this month the collected annual reports of Secretary Wilson and his Bureau chiefs for the fiscal year 1907, setting forth the year's extensive work in a compact manner, yet filling more than 800 pages in doing so.

The Light-House Board is out with its List of lights, buoys, and daymarks on the northern lakes and rivers, corrected to the opening of navigation, 1908. The navigation of the Great Lakes and their connecting and tributary rivers is difficult at best, but without this book it would be virtually impossible.

From the Music Division of the Library of Congress we have in the class of Dramatic music a Catalogue of full scores, now in the Library and mainly the accretion of the five years last past. The catalogue fills 170 pages and shows a remarkable growth in this important department of the great national library. There are still notable gaps in the collection, their existence being explained in a prefatory note. A supplementary catalogue, which is promised in a few years, will no doubt show most of the gaps satisfactorily closed, as well as further large accessions.

The Interstate Commerce Commission—very active in publishing these days—begins this month a new series of publications with Special report 1, Intercompany relationships of railways in the United States, as of June 30, 1906, compiled by the Statistics and Accounts Division. Also we have the 12th volume of Interstate Commerce Commission Reports, which are the reported decisions of the Commission on the weighty subjects with which it deals. Hitherto the series of Reports has been issued by a private publishing house. With volume 12 it becomes a public document, published and sold by the Government.

The General Land Office supplies a useful little pamphlet bearing the title Suggestions to homesteaders and persons desiring to make homestead entries. Also an important volume of tables showing

the land grants made by Congress in aid of railroads, wagon roads, canals, and internal improvements.

The first edition of the American nautical almanac for 1911 is out in excellent season.

Manufactures Bureau, Commerce and Labor Department, brings out no. 1 of a new numbered series of Consular reports, called the Annual series. This series will present in pamphlet form the contents of the well-known annual, Commercial relations of the United States with foreign countries, in advance of the issue of the completed volume and the returns from each country in a separate pamphlet. How very much earlier this information will be supplied by the new plan is well illustrated in this number of the Monthly catalogue, which notes the issue of the volume of Commercial relations for the fiscal year 1906, and also, in the new series, no. 1, the similar returns for Turkey for the year 1907. Thus those interested receive the statistics of our trade with the Turkish Empire for 1906 and for 1907 at the same time. No comment is needed to demonstrate the value of the new plan of publication.

NATIONAL MONUMENTS

The President issued, April 16th, a proclamation establishing Natural Bridges national monument, in southeastern Utah. This is the fourteenth national monument established by the President under the authority of section 2 of An act for the preservation of American antiquities, approved June 8, 1906. Little popular interest has apparently been aroused by this new series of proclamations, supplementary to the National park series, but the establishment of these national monuments is certainly a notable step in the advancement of the country along the lines of archeological and esthetic education. By the terms of the proclamations the national monuments are placed under the protection of the Government and everybody is warned not to appropriate, injure, or destroy them. So much of the surrounding land as may be needed for their proper protection is withdrawn from entry or sale. The national monuments thus far established are:

Chaco Canyon, New Mexico: extensive prehistoric ruins.

Cinder Cone, California: an illustration of volcanic activity.

Devils Tower, Wyoming: an extraordinary example of the effects of erosion.

El Morro, New Mexico: remarkable rocks, known as El Morro and Inscription Rock.

Gila Cliff Dwellings, New Mexico: the best representative of the cliff-dwellers' remains.

Grand Canyon, Arizona: this is the Grand Canyon of the Colorado River, the greatest eroded canyon in the national domain.

Jewel Cave, South Dakota: a Black Hills cavern whose walls are encrusted with crystal.

Lassen Peak, California: an extinct volcano.

Montezuma Castle, Arizona: a prehistoric structure.

Muir Woods, California: an extensive growth of redwood big trees (*Sequoia sempervirens*).

Natural Bridges, Utah: the highest and largest natural bridges known; extraordinary examples of stream erosion.

Petrified Forest, Arizona: mineralized remains of mesozoic forests.

Pinnacles, California: natural formations of peaks and caves.

Tonto, Arizona: two prehistoric ruins of cliff dwellings.

LEWIS AND CLARK

It is not an uncommon experience for the Documents Office to receive inquiries concerning the Government report of the famous expedition under command of Captain Meriwether Lewis and Captain William Clark, which crossed the continent 1803-06 and was the first expedition to do so. Such inquirers are much surprised when told that there is no Government report of this expedition, and probably sometimes think that the Documents Office doesn't know half as much about Lewis and Clark as it should know or as it pretends to know. Undoubtedly there should have been a Government report of this very famous and important expedition, and probably there would have been one had not the sudden and somewhat mysterious death of Meriwether Lewis in 1809 cut short President Jefferson's design. The Biddle-Allen narrative (2 v. Philadelphia, 1814), which was for many years the only authentic one, carries on its title-pages the words, "By order of the Government of the United States," but it was in fact issued by private publishers, without Government subsidy, and was copyrighted in the name of Captain Clark. Thus it remains that, to the best of our knowledge and belief, the following brief memoranda reveal the whereabouts of all the material concerning the Lewis and Clark expedition which is to be found in the public documents.

Poore, p. 62. 9th Congress, 1st session. Feb. 19, 1806. A message from President Jefferson transmitting a letter from Meriwether Lewis dated Fort Mandan, April, 1805. This letter, and an accompanying memorandum of information as to certain Indian tribes, are the only documents supplied by any member of the expedition and relating to the history of the expedition that were ever printed by the Government. The message and accompanying papers are reprinted in Gales and Seaton's American state papers, Indian affairs, volume 1, page 705.

Poore, p. 67. 9th Congress, 2d session. Jan. 23, 1807. This is a letter from Henry Dearborn, Secretary of War, transmitting a communication from Captain Meriwether Lewis giving his views as to the compensation, above the ordinary pay, that should be awarded to the men of his command for their services on the expedition. He gives a list of the men and notes on their conduct and characteristics. This document is reproduced in American state papers, Military affairs, volume 1, page 207.

President Jefferson commends the expedition very briefly in his 6th annual message, Dec. 2, 1806.

Hayden's Survey, Bulletins, volume 1, number 6. An account, by Dr. Elliot Coues, of the various editions of histories of the expedition that had been issued up to 1876.

American Historical Association, Annual report, 1903, volume 1. Story of Lewis and Clark's journals, by R. G. Thwaites. This brings the record of publications 27 years nearer to date, and tells of remarkable finds of unpublished material.

MONTHLY SUMMARY

The familiar statistical publication, now known as *Monthly summary of commerce and finance*, has gone through many changes. When the Bureau of Statistics, Treasury Department, was created, by act of July 28, 1866, one of the duties imposed upon it was the issue of a monthly report of imports, exports, etc. The first number bears date Nov. 15, 1866, and gives statistics for the months July–October, 1866. The second number was issued Jan. 15, 1867, with statistics for July–December, 1866. The title assumed was “Monthly report of the Director of the Bureau of Statistics.” With the third number appeared on the back leaf a sort of filing title, “Statistical tables, no. 3,” which was continued until no. 20, issued Aug. 22, 1868, and containing statistics for the year ended June 30, 1868. At this point the Director of the Bureau of Statistics disappears from the scene, his office and title having been abolished by act of Congress. The Bureau was left intact, and the Special Commissioner of Revenue was authorized to appoint a deputy and assign him to control of the Bureau. Because of these changes the issue of the monthly report was suspended for five months, the Deputy Special Commissioner of the Revenue issuing his first number Jan. 26, 1869, containing the statistics for July, 1868. He retained the queer filing title on the back, but changed it to read “Commerce and navigation.” He continued the numerical series without break, his first monthly issue being no. 21. After no. 24 the date of publication was not given. No. 28 gave the statistics for June, 1869, and for the fiscal year 1869. No. 29 gave a new version of the statistics for 1868 which had been previously given by the Director of statistics in no. 20. With the beginning of a new fiscal year (1870) a new plan of numbering, the same which is now in use, was begun. The monthly numbers for the fiscal year are numbered 1 to 12, and with each year a new set of numbers begins. The last number issued by the Deputy Special Commissioner was that for Sept. 1869 (no. 3 of fiscal year 1870). Nos. 4–7 of that year were still called “Monthly report of the Deputy Special Commissioner of the Revenue,” but they were issued by a clerk “in charge of the Bureau of Statistics.” No. 8 (Feb.) of the fiscal year 1870 was the first Monthly report of the Chief of the Bureau of Statistics, who has since been the editor and publisher of the monthly report or summary in all its various phases. The Chief retained the filing title “Commerce and navigation” on the back leaf until June 30, the end of the fiscal year 1875. With the beginning of the fiscal year 1876 (July, 1875) the title was changed to “Summary statement of imports and exports,” the filing title on the back leaf and the numbering were dropped, and the size of the publication was cut down to eight pages a month. With no. 8 (Feb.) of the fiscal year 1879 numbering began again, and continued till no. 10 (April) of the fiscal year 1884, when publication was suspended altogether, the size having meantime grown to 14 pages. In June, 1885, publication was resumed and the back numbers were issued, thus mak-

ing the series continuous. By June 30, 1885, when the May number was issued, arrears had been made up and regular issues resumed. The bound volume for 1894 received the title "Monthly summary of imports and exports, new series, vol. 1." For the first time the volume then had table of contents and index. The monthly issue for Nov. 1894 (no. 5 of fiscal year 1895), was erroneously numbered 4. With the issue for January, 1895 (no. 7 of fiscal year 1895), the monthly title was changed to "Finance, commerce, and immigration of the U. S.," but the title of the annual volume, 1895, remained as before. January, 1896 (no. 7 of fiscal year 1896), the monthly title became "Monthly summary of finance and commerce," but the annual title remained as before. Part 2 of the number for April, 1897 (no. 10 of fiscal year 1897), is "Comparison based upon H. R. 379" (Dingley tariff), 413 pages. In the bound volume it is interposed between pages 1820 and 1821. This volume shows a marked growth from the 96-page volume of 1876, the aggregate number of pages being 2573, besides many maps and plates. For 1898, the volume title was changed to "Monthly summary of finance and commerce, new series, vol. 5." At the beginning of the fiscal year 1899 the monthly title was changed to "Monthly summary of commerce and finance," and the annual title to "Monthly summary of commerce and finance, new series, vol. 6." Important special papers have appeared in many of the recent numbers, and these have also been printed separately. Beginning with November, 1895 (54th Congress, 1st session), and continuing until June, 1907 (59th Congress, 2d session), the Monthly summary was printed also as a numbered House document.

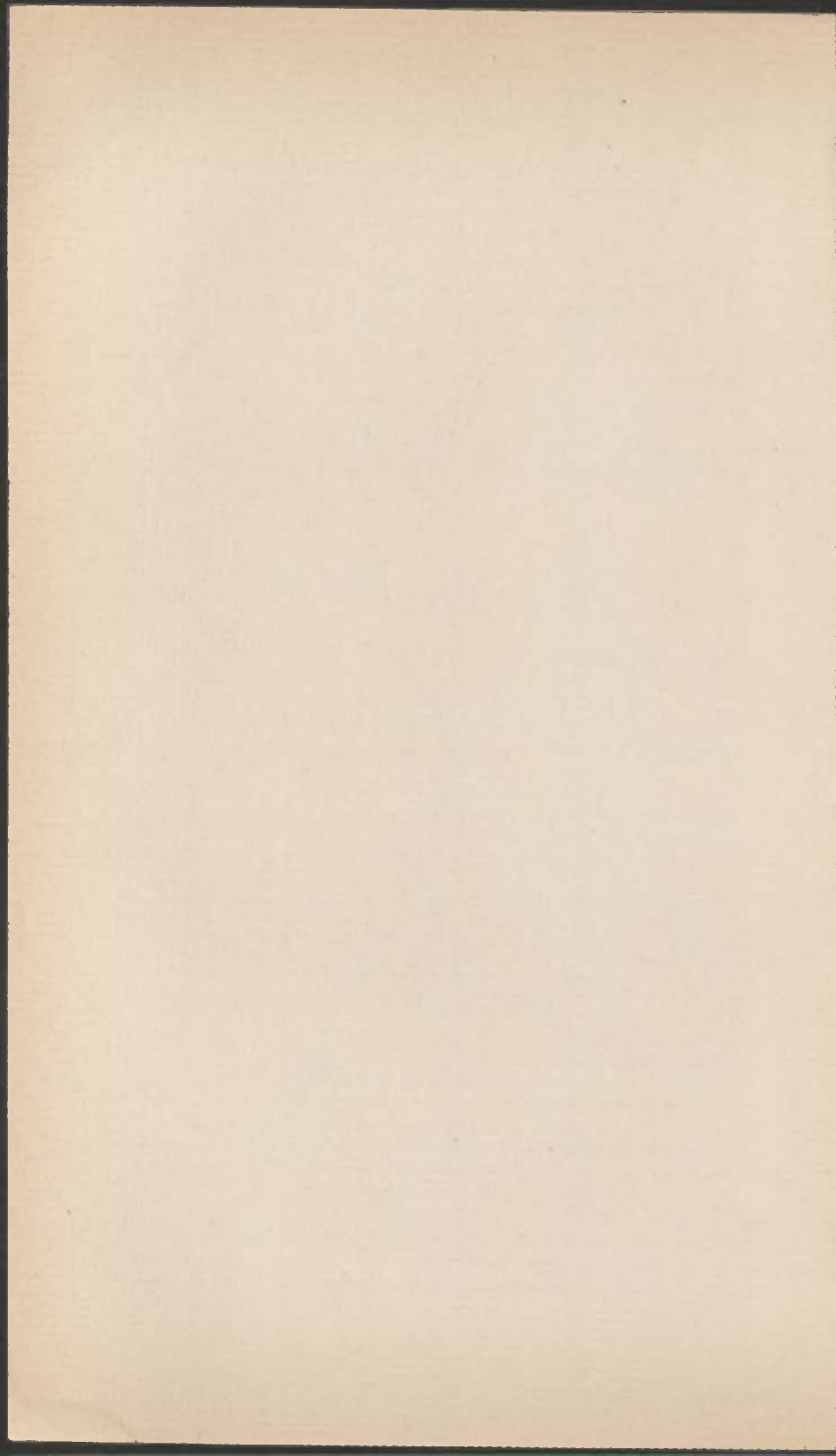
One of the "Notes of General Interest" in the February, 1908, number of the Monthly catalogue was this:

This year the annual classified statement of the expenditures of the Agriculture Department, of which for many years the "usual number" has been printed, being somewhere from ten to twenty times as many copies as were needed, was not printed at all, but a sufficient number of copies were produced at the Department by a duplicating process, saving, it is asserted, several thousand dollars. It was done at the suggestion of Mr. Littlefield, chairman of the House Committee on Expenditures in the Department of Agriculture, and it is told of in the annual report of the Department's Accounts and Disbursements Division. Which overprinted documents will be the next to go off the list?

This paragraph was and is quite true, but since it was written something else has happened. It happened in the Senate April 7. At that time the Agricultural appropriation bill was under consideration, and the typewritten or duplicated copy of the Statement of expenditures came to light. The Senate did not approve of it in that form, and it was ordered printed. Accordingly it has been printed, and is: 60th Congress, 1st session, Senate document 425. Quite a sizable document it is, too, filling 391 pages.
