# Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith. Processed publications are not obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents and requests for them, if they are available, should be addressed to the issuing office.

Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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# General Information

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In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 19, 77-1.

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The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check list of United States public documents, 1789–1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior or inferior number (the numbers immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers as superiors or inferiors in the Monthly catalog.

#### LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for many publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Card Division, Library of Congress, not to the Superintendent of Documents.

#### MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$2.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$2.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

# BINDING THE CATALOG

The Documents Office will soon issue an index to all entries in the Monthly catalog, January to December 1942. There are only eleven numbers for 1942 since the first issue for 1942 covers the period for January and February. A title page for the eleven numbers of the catalog will accompany the index. Duplicate numbers of the Monthly catalog cannot be supplied.

# Notes of General Interest

# Procurement and Material Office

By direction of the President, Navy Department General order 166 of Jan. 30, 1942, established in the Navy Department the Office of Procurement and Material. This Office, under the direction of the Secretary of the Navy, coordinates all the material procurement activities of the Navy Department, supervises programs for the procurement of ships and materials of every character and performs such other duties as the Secretary of the Navy may direct. The orders of the Office of Procurement and Material are considered as emanating from the Secretary of the Navy and have full force and effect as such.

# Reconstruction Finance Corporation

Under the provisions of Executive order 9071, dated Feb. 24, 1942, all the functions, powers and duties of the Federal Loan Agency and Federal Loan Administrator, which related to the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, were transferred to the Commerce Department to be administered under the direction and supervision of the Secretary of Commerce.

# Tax Court


By sec. 504 of title 5 of Public law 753, 77th Congress, approved Oct. 21, 1942, the name of the Board of Tax Appeals was changed to the Tax Court of the United States. The jurisdiction, powers, and duties of the Tax Court of the United States, its divisions and its officers and employees, etc., are the same as by existing law provided in the case of the Board of Tax Appeals.

# TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

Note.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. Rural delivery routes are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,600 or 1:63,860 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,575 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and libe line prints, made from negatives on file, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage.
