NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a \* price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

## Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith, etc.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25 percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record, Federal register, Supreme Court reports, Catalog of copyright entries, and Climatological data for United States, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

### PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

### WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

### HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (\*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 68, 75-1.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.



## HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (\*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., by coupons, postal money order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

*Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted.*

For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

## TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Checklist of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a: So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23<sup>a</sup>: So 96<sup>a</sup> in a library.

## LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, not to the Superintendent of Documents.

## MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

## INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.



# NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

## RESETTLEMENT ADMINISTRATION

By Executive Order 7530 dated December 31, 1936, all the powers, functions, and duties heretofore vested in the Resettlement Administration and in the Administrator and Deputy Administrator thereof were transferred to the Secretary of Agriculture, and all funds, personnel, property, records, and equipment of the Resettlement Administration were transferred to the Department of Agriculture, to be under the supervision, control, and direction of the Secretary of Agriculture, the order to become effective on January 1, 1937. The recreational demonstration projects administered by the Resettlement Administration had already been transferred by Executive Order 7496 dated November 14, 1936, to the jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior to be administered through the National Park Service.

## LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES

Beginning with the Seventy-fifth Congress, in accordance with the provisions of S. 3440, 74th Congress (Public 724, approved June 20, 1936), the Session or Pamphlet laws were discontinued. The Statutes at Large, heretofore published at the end of a Congress, will be issued at the end of each session of Congress.

The public and private acts and public and private joint resolutions are first published separately, and in this form are known as "slip laws." Heretofore, each one of these laws has been given its number in connection with the Congress enacting it, the number of the bill which was enacted into law, and the title of the act. Each law in slip form now bears, in addition to these, the chapter number of the Statutes at Large in which it will appear later, as well as the session of Congress to which it belongs. Previous to this, these "slip laws" have been published, at the end of each session of Congress, in a paper bound edition popularly known as Session or Pamphlet laws (this is the edition which has been discontinued). Subsequently, the Session laws for the whole Congress were printed in a permanent bound edition entitled Statutes at Large. This latter edition will now be issued at the end of each session of Congress.

## INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION DECISIONS

For many years, in fact since 1887, the date of its organization, the Interstate Commerce Commission has issued its decisions in separate form, later having them bound into volumes. The regular series of reports has now reached volume 216 in bound form while single opinions for volume 219 are current at the present time. In 1922, Finance dockets, each given a number preceded by the letter "F" began to be issued separately. These are included, as bound volumes, in the same series with the Traffic or Rate decisions but are bound up from time to time in a volume which, while designated as Finance reports, continues the volume numbering of the regular series. A series of Valuation reports has also been issued. The separate reports are distinguished by the

letter "B" preceding the number. At first, these dockets were bound in the regular series of volumes, each volume containing them having "Valuation reports" on the title page. In 1929, the Interstate Commerce Commission decided to issue its Valuation reports in an independent series beginning with volume 22 making allowance for the first 21 volumes that were included in the regular Interstate Commerce Commission report series. The last one in this series to come from the bindery is volume 46 although separate decisions are being received for volume 47.

The Interstate Commerce Commission has now decided to segregate and publish its Motor carrier reports as a numerical series, beginning with volume 1 and to be cited as "M. C. C." Reports will be made available in printed form, separately and in bound volumes, in the same manner in which the Commission now publishes its Traffic or Rate, Finance, and Valuation reports. The opinion number shown on each Motor carrier report, as published separately, will be preceded by the letter "M." The bound volumes will form an independent series similar to that for the Valuation reports.

#### A NEW PERIODICAL

The Education Office is now issuing in printed form, beginning with the January 1937 number, a periodical which it began as a processed publication entitled *The World Is Yours*, the Smithsonian Institution Radio Program. It presents, in advance, a radio program dedicated to the increase and diffusion of knowledge among men. It will take the one who reads the publication or listens over the radio through the doors of the Smithsonian Institution, our great national institution for the gathering and disseminating of scientific facts. Each article deals in a popular manner with some subject which opens a different door in the realm of knowledge. A brief bibliography accompanies most of the articles so that further reading on the subject is possible. This publication is obtainable, without charge, at the Education Office, Washington, D. C.

NOTE.—Many of the divisions of the Foreign and Domestic Commerce Bureau issue monthly statistical statements in processed form showing the exports or imports (and in some cases re-exports) of various commodities. ### TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

Maps of more than 1,510 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows, in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratuitously* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. The Institution maintains mailing-lists of public libraries and other educational establishments, but no *general mailing-list of individuals*. ## STATE DEPARTMENT

**NOTE.**—With the publication of the first number of the printed Press releases on Oct. 5, 1929, the Department of State inaugurated a new publication program. The daily mimeographed releases are made available to the public weekly in printed form; also, all publications (except laws and treaties) are numbered consecutively in the order in which they are sent to press. Publications of a similar character are brought within well-defined series, and each series publication bears a series number in addition to its publication number. The diplomatic correspondence of the United States is published in the volumes entitled Foreign relations of the United States. Laws are issued in separate series and are numbered within each series in the order in which they are signed. Treaties are issued in a separate series and are numbered in the order in which they are proclaimed. Treaties are also published in the compilation Treaties and other international acts of the United States of America, which contains literal copies of the documents, followed by notes of a textual and procedural character. Indexes to the Press releases are supplied semiannually, as of December 31 and June 30. The Department of State includes in the Press releases series, each quarter, a complete list of its publications for the preceding quarter.

The list below frequently includes certain relevant publications issued by other agencies of the Government under requisition of the Department of State and certain relevant congressional documents.

Under the practice of the State Department prior to the inauguration of the Executive agreement series (no. 98 of which is listed below) the material would have been published in the Treaty series.
