NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a * price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS—FOLLOWS CONTENTS

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25-percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record, Federal register, Supreme Court reports, Catalog of copyright entries, and Climatological data for United States, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 458, 75-3.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

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Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington,

D. C., by coupons, postal money order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

Foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted. Do not send postage stamps.

For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Newfoundland (including Labrador), Panama, or Venezuela. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check List of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a: So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23: So 96⁴ in a library.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, *not* to the Superintendent of Documents.

MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.50 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$2.10 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

NEW GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

An Alaskan International Highway Commission was created under the provisions of Public Act 564, 75th Congress, approved May 31, 1938. The Commission, which is to be composed of five members to be appointed by the President, is to cooperate and communicate directly with any similar agency which may be appointed in the Dominion of Canada in a study for the survey, location, and construction of a highway to connect the Pacific Northwest part of continental United States with British Columbia and the Yukon Territory in the Dominion of Canada, and the Territory of Alaska. A report is to be made to the President of the United States within two years of their appointment as to the extent and results of their activities and of any conferences relative to such highway.

Under the provisions of Public Act 705, 75th Congress, which amends the Merchant Marine Act, 1936, there is established an independent agency in the executive branch of the Government to be known as the Maritime Labor Board to be composed of three members appointed by the President, by and with the consent of the Senate. The Board is to act as a mediator between maritime employers and employees, and to encourage and assist in making or interpreting labor agreements, and, if arbitration is necessary, to use its best efforts to secure the assent of both parties to such arbitration. It shall also, before March 1, 1940, submit a comprehensive plan for the establishment of a permanent Federal policy for the amicable adjustment of all disputes between maritime employers and employees and for the stabilization of maritime labor relations.

The same act, cited above, provides for the establishment of the United States Maritime Service to be a voluntary organization for the training of citizens of the United States to serve as licensed and unlicensed personnel on American merchant vessels. The ranks, grades, and ratings for the personnel of the said Service shall be the same as those prescribed for the personnel of the Coast Guard.

The Civil Aeronautics Act of 1938 (Public 706, 75th Congress, approved June 23, 1938) provides for the establishment of the Civil Aeronautics Authority for the purpose of encouraging and fostering the development of civil aeronautics and air commerce in the United States, and abroad, and for encouraging the establishment of civil airways, landing areas, and other air navigation facilities. The Authority is to be composed of five members to be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.

An Air Safety Board is also created within the Civil Aeronautics Authority under the provisions of the Civil Aeronautics Act of 1938, to consist of three members appointed by the President with the concurrence of the Senate. The general duties of the Board will be to make rules and regulations, subject to the approval of the Authority, governing notification and report of accidents involving aircraft; to investigate such accidents and report to the Authority the facts, conditions, and circumstances relating to each accident and the probable cause thereof; to make such recommendations to the Authority as, in its opinion, will tend to prevent similar accidents in the future; to make such reports and recommendations public in such manner as may be deemed by it to be in the

public interest; and to assist the Authority in ascertaining what will best tend to reduce or eliminate the possibility of, or recurrence of, accidents by investigating such complaints filed with the Authority or the Board, and by conducting such special studies and investigations, on matters pertaining to safety in air navigation and the prevention of accidents, as may be requested or approved by the Authority.

EXTENSIONS AND DISCONTINUANCE OF GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATIONS

The Works Progress Administration, the National Youth Administration within the Works Progress Administration, the Farm Security Administration within the Department of Agriculture, the National Emergency Council, and the National Resources Committee are extended until June 30, 1939, by the provisions of Public Joint Resolution 122, 75th Congress, approved June 21, 1938. These extensions are made in order to continue to provide work relief on useful public projects, and relief, in the United States and its Territories and possessions. The President's Executive Order 7906 of June 6, 1938, had already extended the date for the abolishment of the National Emergency Council to June 30, 1939.

The Special Mexican Claims Commission created by Public Act 30, 74th Congress, approved April 10, 1935 (49 Stat. 149) to settle all claims against the Republic of Mexico in which the Special Claims Commission, United States and Mexico failed to award compensation unless such claims were found to be general claims and recognized as such by the General Claims Commission, has completed its work prior to the date fixed for its completion, August 31, 1938, and so the President has terminated the powers, rights and duties of the Commission as of June 15, 1938, by Executive Order 7909 of that date.

STATUTES AT LARGE

Provision was made by the 74th Congress in Public 724, approved June 20, 1936 (49 Stat. 1551) that the Statutes at Large, heretofore published at the end of a Congress, should be issued at the end of *each session* of Congress. It was not realized, at that time, that a special session of Congress, providing a very few laws, would make it necessary in complying with the law to issue a very small volume. This has recently been remedied by the enactment into law of H. R. 10772, 75th Congress (Public 657, approved June 16, 1938). This act provides for the issuance of a volume for each *regular session* of Congress. In the event of an extra session of Congress, all laws and concurrent resolutions enacted shall be published as part of the volume for the next regular session.

DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES

The law relating to the distribution of public documents to depository libraries has been amended by H. R. 5471, 75th Congress (Public 750, approved June 25, 1938) so that such libraries may select for their public document collections in addition to documents already provided for under the selective plan, the following: Journals of the Senate and House of Representatives, all publications, not confidential in character, printed upon requisition of any Congressional committee, all Senate and House public bills and resolutions, and all reports on private bills, concurrent or simple resolutions.

The Superintendent of Documents has recently notified the librarians of depository libraries concerning the publication at the Government Printing Office of the Transactions of the Third World Power Conference in 10 volumes and the Transactions of the Second Conference on Large Dams in 5 volumes. These


meetings were held concurrently in Washington in September 1936. The World Power Conference program dealt with "The National Power Economy." Its physical and statistical basis; its technical, economic, and social trends; the relation thereto of the fuel-producing, processing and distribution industries and of electric and gas utilities, practices and policies respecting organization, control, and public regulation; national and regional planning of power development and use; conservation of fuel and water resources; rationalization of the distribution of gas and electricity; and a national power and resources policy. The Transactions of the Congress on Large Dams contains some 90 reports from 21 different countries dealing with special cements; expansion joints and facings for masonry dams; study of foundation materials; and calculation of the stability of earth dams. The notification was sent out in order that it might be possible to decide on the size of the edition of each to be printed.

LAND POLICY REVIEW

Another periodical publication which was originally issued in processed form began its appearance in printed form in June 1938. This is the Land Policy Review, taking the place of the former Land Policy Circular, a pamphlet of technical information for staff members, first issued by the Resettlement Administration and later by the Agricultural Economics Bureau. This first printed number is designated as volume 1, number 1, and is dated May-June 1938. It is issued by the Agricultural Economics Bureau and will endeavor to give adequate information on current developments in land policy and land programs to workers of the Department of Agriculture and cooperating groups. It is hoped that it will serve a valuable purpose in broadening the contacts of those who are engaged in the imperative task of helping the American people derive the fullest use of land resources. It will be published bimonthly and is obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., at 5c single copy, 25c a year, foreign subscription, 35c.

They are distributed without charge to public libraries, educational establishments, and learned societies in this country and abroad; and are supplied to other institutions, and to individuals at the prices indicated. Remittances should be made payable to the 'Smithsonian Institution.' A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratis* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.
