Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 61st Congress, 1st session, is to be understood.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

The Government frequently calls upon citizens to act as volunteer assistants in scientific work, and usually, we believe, meets a willing response. A couple of new calls of this kind are now current. The Entomology Bureau has sent out a circular letter asking for samples of diseased honeycomb. It wishes to make bacteriological examinations in order to determine whether new diseases are attacking the American busy bee. The Forest Service has also a very recent circular letter in circulation. It is addressed to teachers, and seeks to enlist them—and through them the army of American school children, computed to be now about 18,000,000 strong—in a plan for tree observation. The Service wishes to obtain more definite knowledge than it now possesses as to the leafing, blossoming, and fruiting of forest trees, and takes this method of enlisting multitudes of observers in all parts of the country.

The agreement to submit certain claims to arbitration, which was entered into at Caracas Feb. 13, 1909, by the Venezuelan Minister of Foreign Affairs and Mr. Buchanan, special commissioner of the United States, has now been published in English and Spanish.

Getting it down to exact figures is the purpose of Statistics Bureau Bulletin 73, Agriculture Department, entitled Cost of producing Minnesota farm products, 1902-07.

The War Department has issued a Circular showing absences otherwise than temporary of officers of the line of the Army detached from their corps or arms of service, July, 1902-Dec. 1908.

Circular 90, Public Roads Office, has this comprehensive title: Progress reports of experiments in dust prevention, road preservation, and road construction. The experiments have been numerous and their results are receiving careful study.

The Interstate Commerce Commission has issued a new edition, dated May 1, 1909, of the Act to regulate commerce (the original Sherman act of 1887), with the laws amendatory of and supplementary thereto, with other cognate acts, namely: the safety appliance act, the act requiring monthly reports of accidents, the arbitration act, and the hours of service act.

Under date of May 13 the President issued an Executive order establishing the General Supply Committee, which is to buy all supplies for Government use. Thus the Government will be one

buyer instead of many and will pay one price instead of several varying prices for the same supplies.

Bulletin 3, series of 1909, Education Bureau, has the title Daily meals of school children. Some persons may think this has nothing to do with education, but in this they are much mistaken.

Primer of Forestry, part 2, Practical forestry, has now been issued in cheap popular form as Farmers' bulletin 358.

From the General Land Office comes a new print of the mining laws, or, more correctly, the laws relating to mineral lands owned by the Government.

The Post-Office Department publishes a report of extensive investigations of pneumatic-tube service for the mails.

The Interstate Commerce Commission has issued a Table of cases and opinions covering the work of the Commission from the beginning in Apr. 1887, to Jan. 1909, and all references to the reported decisions of the Commission, vols. 1-15. Vol. 15, thus indexed, is not yet published, though it is in press.

Contributions from the National Herbarium, vol. 12, pt. 9, contains a botanical romance, the Rediscovery of *Echeveria carnicolor*.

Folio 164 of the Geologic atlas of the United States is of special interest because it maps one of the big irrigation projects, the Belle Fourche in South Dakota.

Report 88, Department of Agriculture, is the report of the Referee Board of Consulting Scientific Experts on the popular preservative, benzoate of soda, or sodium benzoate, declaring that it is not injurious to health. The signers of Report 88 are Dr. Ira Remsen, president of Johns Hopkins University, Professor Russell H. Chittenden of Yale University, Professor John H. Long of Northwestern University, and Professor Christian A. Herter of Columbia University.

Two new publications of the Agriculture Department will probably be found to fill long-felt wants. One is Biological Survey Bureau Bulletin 33, The brown rat in the United States, which gives extended information as to the best methods of mitigating this worst of mammalian pests; the other is Experiment Stations Office Circular 83, The American system of agricultural education, illustrated with plates of buildings and classes.

Volumes 13 and 14 of the Library of Congress edition of the Journals of the Continental Congress were issued during May.

Volumes 4-6 of Thorpe's Constitutions and charters have been received, and it is likely that volume 7, completing the set, will be out of the bindery by the time these lines reach the reader. This important work is to be sold by the Superintendent of Documents in sets only at \$5.25 in cloth binding.

The Interstate Commerce Commission republishes in a pamphlet a recent decision of the United States district court for the northern district of Illinois construing the hours-of-service law. The court holds that a period of nine hours means nine continuous and consecutive hours, and that a railroad had violated the law in requiring certain men to work from 6.30 p. m. to 12 m., "lay off" from 12

to 3, then work from 3 to 6.30 a. m. The work was only 9 hours, but the detention and control were 12 hours.

Volume 35, National Museum Proceedings, is one of the May publications. It is more fully illustrated than usual.

Labor Bureau Bulletin 80 has an 85-page paper on Woman and child wage-earners in Great Britain.

A report for which there has been considerable inquiry and which is the result of extensive and prolonged investigation is the Report of the commissioner of corporations on the tobacco industry. Part 1, entitled Position of the tobacco combination in the industry, is entered in this catalogue. It is a volume of 489 pages, and gives a history of the "combination"—which is sometimes spoken of as the "trust."

Public Roads Office Bulletin 35, written by Assistant Road Director Cushman and embodying the results of his extensive experimenting, is entitled Preservation of iron and steel.

The 8th decennial revision of the Pharmacopœia of the United States, issued 1905, was the occasion for a vast number of comments and criticisms from medical journals and interested persons in this and other countries. These very numerous comments, up to the close of the year 1905, have been collected and summarized by the Pharmacology Division of the Hygienic Laboratory of the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service and published as Bulletin 49 of the Laboratory under the title Digest of comments on the Pharmacopœia of the United States. It is a book of 295 pages, and gives to those interested a variety of suggestions and opinions of more or less value.

GEOGRAPHIC BOARD

The United States Board on Geographic Names was appointed by President Harrison, Sept. 4, 1890, with ten members, representing the State Department, the Coast Survey, the Light-House Board, the Engineer Corps, the Hydrographic Office, the Post-Office Department, the Smithsonian Institution, and the Geological Survey. It was provided that the members, all of whom were already in the Government service, should not receive any additional compensation for their service on the Board, and their term of service was not limited in time. The Board is still in existence, and its decisions as to the orthography of geographical names are the accepted standard in all branches of the United States service. By Executive order, dated Aug. 10, 1906, the name of the Board was changed to United States Geographic Board.

GREENHOW'S HISTORY OF THE NORTHWEST COAST

Congress bought 1500 copies of Greenhow's History of Oregon, California, and other Territories of the Northwest Coast, in 1845. It is a work of high authority, an expansion of his Memoir on the Northwest Coast, which was published as a numbered Congressional document in 1840 (26th Cong. 1st sess., S. doc. 174). The larger history was not issued as a numbered document. Greenhow

was noted for scholarship and for the possession of an extraordinary memory. He was a Virginian, born in 1800, and served as translator in the State Department, 1828-50. He died in California, 1854.

JOURNALS OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

In a special message dated Dec. 16, 1821, President Monroe stated that in pursuance of a resolution of March 27, 1818, "1000 copies of the journals and acts of the Convention which formed the Constitution have been printed and placed at the disposal of Congress." This publication is not found among the numbered Congressional documents. It was published in Boston, 1819, by T. B. Wait, in one volume, octavo, under this title: "Journal, acts, and proceedings of the Convention assembled at Philadelphia, Monday, May 14, and dissolved Monday, Sept. 17, 1787, which formed the Constitution of the United States." It is supposed to have been edited by John Quincy Adams, then Secretary of State.
