## Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 81st Congress, 2d session, is to be understood.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for. Only one copy can be sold to the same person, excepting Members of Congress, or to libraries or schools.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals, **nor can they be forwarded in advance of payment.**

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (\*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions and, unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents give the name of the issuing Department, Bureau, or Division, and title. If publication is numbered give number also. Do not order by Library of Congress card number.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which several hundred thousand are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that most of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

Lists on various subjects will be issued from time to time for free distribution. No general price-list of public documents is at present available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

### MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indexes. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

## LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and  $\frac{1}{2}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress. Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

## CUMULATIVE INDEX

Beginning with July, 1909, the Index to the Monthly catalogue is issued separately each quarter and cumulates for half-yearly periods. That is, the September number of the Index indexes the Monthly catalogue for July, August, and September, the December number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for July to December, the March number will be an index to the Monthly catalogue for January to March, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1910. Persons desiring to bind the catalogue at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate numbers can not be supplied.

## HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (\*) should be made to the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, by postal money order, express order, or New York draft. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Canadian postal notes will be accepted only when the name of the issuing office is plainly stamped on the face of the note. If postage stamps are pasted on, the note will be returned.

*Postage stamps, foreign money, uncertified checks, defaced or smooth coins will positively not be accepted.*

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in the United States, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

## NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

### NOTE OF EXPLANATION TO THE LIBRARIANS OF DESIGNATED DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES

Several inquiries have been received from libraries concerning the new methods of issue of the public documents which formerly composed the familiar "sheep set."

The changes from the old methods to the new have been so radical that they must have been confusing to many librarians, and an explanation—as full and clear an explanation as can be made within reasonable bounds—is due them.

If this explanation disagrees in some points with former explanations, so much the worse for the former explanations. In this matter, as in legislation, the latest law governs. This is not only the latest explanation, but, it is sincerely hoped and believed, the last and final explanation of a matter that has raised many knotty questions for this Office as well as for the libraries with which it deals.

The changes which have virtually abolished the "sheep set" have been caused by the action of Congress in enacting Joint resolution 3, 60th Congress, 1st session, which was approved January 15, 1908, and is to be found in 35 Stat. L., part 1, page 565. This is the full text of the resolution:

[No. 3.] Joint Resolution Amending an Act relative to the public printing and binding, approved March first, nineteen hundred and seven.

*Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That publications ordered printed by Congress, or either House thereof, shall be in four series, namely: One series of reports made by the committees of the Senate, to be known as Senate reports; one series of reports made by the committees of the House of Representatives, to be known as House reports; one series of documents other than reports of committees, the orders for printing which originate in the Senate, to be known as Senate documents, and one series of documents other than committee reports, the orders for printing which originate in the House of Representatives, to be known as House documents. The publications in each series shall be consecutively numbered, the numbers in each series continuing in unbroken sequence throughout the entire term of a Congress, but the foregoing provisions shall not apply to the documents printed for the use of the Senate in executive session: Provided, That of the "usual number," the copies which are intended for distribution to State and Territorial libraries and other designated depositories of all annual or serial publications originating in or prepared by an Executive Department, bureau, office, commission, or board shall not be numbered in the document or report series of either House of Congress, but shall be designated by title and bound as hereinafter provided, and the departmental

edition, if any, shall be printed concurrently with the "usual number." And provided further, That hearings of committees may be printed as Congressional documents only when specifically ordered by Congress or either House thereof.

Sec. 2. That in the binding of Congressional documents and reports for distribution by the superintendent of documents to State and Territorial libraries and other designated depositories, every publication of sufficient size on any one subject shall hereafter be bound separately and receive the title suggested by the subject of the volume, and the others shall be distributed in unbound form as soon as printed. The Public Printer shall supply the superintendent of documents sufficient copies of those publications distributed in unbound form, to be bound and distributed to the State and Territorial libraries and other designated depositories for their permanent files. The library edition, as well as all other bound sets of Congressional numbered documents and reports, shall be arranged in volumes and bound in the manner directed by the Joint Committee on Printing.

Sec. 3. That section two of an Act to amend an Act providing for the public printing and binding, and so forth, approved March first, nineteen hundred and seven, is hereby repealed.

Approved, January 15, 1908.

The matter repealed by section 2 is not consequential for the purposes of this explanation. The proviso attached to section 1 is the vital matter so far as the libraries are interested. It will be seen that this provision definitely removes the annual reports, periodicals, and serially numbered publications of the Executive Departments, bureaus, and commissions from the numbered set of Congressional documents. This set has been known for many years to librarians as the "sheep set," from the fact of its being bound in full law sheep. As the major part of the "sheep set" has always consisted of the publications of the Executive Departments, transnogrified by the addition of Congressional document numbers, the removal of these virtually abolishes the "sheep set." It has always been the bugbear of librarians, from the fact that it has strung together by its set of continuous numbers the reports of all Departments, the periodicals, scientific papers, bulletins, and other incongruous publications, in one very large and very discordant collection, in which the publications of each Department and bureau were scattered promiscuously instead of being collected in one place as they should be in any orderly library. Though such a set is necessarily repugnant to the training and the ideas of all librarians, it has been so long forced upon them, compelling them to become conversant with it, that apparently some of them are now not only reconciled to it, but feel that they can hardly do without it.

This cannot possibly be the ultimate attitude of any considerable number of librarians, for in past years they have been unanimous in support of every movement looking to the elimination of the "sheep set" and the substitution of copies of the Department reports and bulletins in the same forms and at the same time as Department editions.

The ideal of the Public Documents Office has been always "one edition of one book" as the only plan of publication that would certainly give immediate and absolute identification and save the uncertainty, annoyance, and waste of time caused by issuing the same

public document in several different forms. This ideal has not yet been fully achieved, but a long step has been made toward it by the passage of Joint resolution 3 above quoted.

That its benefits have not been more immediately and more fully apparent is due to several reasons. Yet the sending of many of the annual reports of 1909 at earlier dates than ever before is evidence that some good has been already accomplished.

Many of the annual reports and serials of 1907 and 1908, it is true, have not yet been sent to the depositories. They have been delayed by circumstances beyond the control of this Office. The Joint Congressional Committee on Printing, which in the absence of statutory provision is the paramount authority, decided to abandon the costly and shortlived sheepskin binding, and to adopt the best substitute that could be had at moderate cost. Just what was the best moderate-priced binding material being an undetermined question, the Committee asked the Bureau of Standards for a report on the subject. This scientific Bureau, which does not make reports at haphazard, entered upon a series of tests in which many months were consumed. As a result of the tests, the Bureau of Standards formulated a set of specifications for a buckram cloth which were so severe that at the first attempt no bids were secured. Finally, however, the Government Printing Office and the manufacturers got together, and No. 666 buckram was secured. The tests indicate that this is the best moderate-priced binding material yet produced, and in appearance also it easily outclasses the sheepskin. The time taken to secure this new buckram extended over many months, and while in the meantime the binders were not doing anything for the libraries, the printers were doing a good deal, and unbound documents were piling up rapidly. After they have piled up it is not easy to catch up with them and also keep up with current work. The libraries do not need to be told this, for they have had practical experience of the effects of the delay. The Superintendent of Documents is glad now to be able to assure all interested librarians that the worst of the delay is over and that the bindery is now pushing out the scheduled volumes very rapidly. Positive assurances have been given that all the documents and reports of both sessions of the 60th Congress and the documents of the 1st session of the 61st Congress shall be completed in time to have them in the hands of the librarians by July 1, 1910. This will surely be very satisfactory to all concerned.

Evidently the continuous serial numbers which in the past have been assigned to the volumes of numbered Congressional documents and reports making up the "sheep set" cannot be put upon books which have been taken out of the "sheep set" and have no Congressional document numbers. The very object of discontinuing the placing of Congressional document numbers on the annual reports, periodicals, and numbered sets issued by the Executive Departments is to release these important documents from the bondage of the "sheep set" and enable librarians to classify them properly under their subjects.

With these documents taken out of the set of serial numbers, and only the strictly Congressional publications remaining to be numbered, a set of serial numbers, if continued, would show more gaps than numbers and be a puzzle rather than an assistance to librarians.

This statement implies, of course, that the reports and periodicals formerly included in the "sheep set" would still be constructively included, and serial numbers be allotted to them, though the volumes are not there to be numbered.

Why not omit the annual reports and periodicals from the serial numbering and number only the volumes of strictly Congressional documents, making the numbers continuous with the former set of serial numbers? is a question that will naturally occur to librarians at this point. The chief reason is that the House and Senate libraries insist upon having the old "sheep set," in all its features, still issued for their use. The Library of Congress, for its own purposes, and for the Smithsonian exchanges with foreign countries, puts forward the same requirements, the only exception being that the Library of Congress and the House Library accept buckram instead of sheepskin as binding material. The House and Senate libraries do not wish the serial numbers to be stamped on their copies.

The terms of Joint resolution 3 do not enable the Superintendent of Documents to resist these requirements, though they make it necessary for him to continue the compilation and publication of schedules (including serial numbers) in the same form as before. Thus the "sheep set" is virtually continued in the work of this Office, though it is no longer forced upon the depository libraries. The information contained in the schedules and serial numbers is, however, thus made available for the use of those depositories, if any, which may wish to continue arranging their documents on the "sheep set" plan. There can hardly be many such depositories, however, for the advantage of receiving the Department documents in the Department editions instead of in the Congressional editions is so apparent that it must sooner or later be universally accepted. It is not doubted, in fact, that even those official libraries which now insist on having the old "sheep set" intact will in the fullness of time see its disadvantages and adopt the Department editions instead.

In making the transition from the old "sheep set" to the new method of issuing the annuals and serials of the Departments, bureaus, commissions, and boards by this Office there have been some changes of plan, some varying interpretations of the law, and, no doubt, some variations in supplying titles to the binders. Precedents are, however, being established, and will be uniformly followed hereafter.

The matter was by no means so simple as it might appear. Almost every document has had little problems of its own. At first Joint resolution 3 was interpreted somewhat too literally, and it was not till after quite a bit of consideration the conclusion was reached

that annual reports which have had no Departmental or bureau editions, but have been always printed as documents only, should still be left as documents instead of being printed without document numbers as the letter of the law would seem to require. As the document prints will still be issued by Congress, to make a print for the libraries without document number would be to make an entirely new edition not before known. To do this would be contradictory to the spirit of the new legislation and to the whole policy of the Public Documents Office, which has ever sought to reduce the number of differing editions of the same document. The annuals which have been printed as Congressional documents only are not numerous or especially important, and to let them remain documents will not perceptibly affect the purpose of the law to give the libraries annual reports, periodicals, and serials in their own proper forms, not obscured and hidden as Congressional documents.

It was not the plan of the Public Documents Office to bind the library copies of the annual reports and serials in a distinctive buckram. The use of this binding goes too far toward making a new edition. The plan of this Office has been to send to the libraries the publications of the various Departments and bureaus exactly as the Departments and bureaus issue them. This plan would be most economical, most prompt, and least confusing. The chronic complaint of the difficulty in using and understanding public documents arises, more than anything else, from the multiplicity of forms, numbers, and titles in which and under which the same document is issued. To reduce these duplications to their lowest possible terms is the constant aim and effort of this Office.

To make present conditions and purposes as to the late unlamented "sheep set" more clear, concrete instances will serve better than abstract exposition. If librarians will take down their copies of the Schedule of volumes of the reports and documents of the 60th Congress, 1st session, and check them by the statements in this paragraph, they will be no longer at a loss to understand the effect of Joint resolution 3, as interpreted by the Documents Office.

The volumes of Senate and House reports of the 60th Congress, 1st session, have been bound in correct form and the volumes of public reports have been sent to the libraries. No change is contemplated for these series.

Senate documents vols. 6, 11, 17, 18, 25, and 26, printed in the schedule in light-face figures, should have been printed in black-face figures, and would be so printed if the schedule were now being made up. Black-face figures mean that the volumes shall have title-pages and back titles bearing Congressional document numbers. Vol. 6 is made up of annual reports which have had no nondocument edition, or of which such editions were small and comparatively unimportant. These have been sent to the libraries unbound and without the Congressional document numbers. They will be reprinted and bound with document numbers and sent to the libraries in this permanent form. Vol. 11, made up of special unnumbered reports to the Manufactures Bureau, is not held to be properly in-

cluded under the term "annuals and serials." Vol. 17, Inland Waterways Commission report, scheduled as an annual report, has probably been taken out of that class by action of Congress which makes the status of the Commission doubtful. Vol. 18, Schoolhouse Commission, D. C., report, is not an annual or serial, the Commission not being permanent and having discharged its function by the publication of this one report. Vol. 25 is of the same status as Vol. 6, already explained. Vol. 26, National Society of Daughters of American Revolution, 10th report, has no Departmental or nondocument edition.

Of the House documents scheduled for the 60th Congress, 1st session, vols. 21, 53, 79, 95, 101, 103, and 104, printed in light-face figures, should be considered by librarians to belong in the black-face figure class, and in these cases, and those of the similar volumes of Senate documents, it would be well to indicate the changes in the copies of the schedules which have been received by the libraries, both the separate print and the print in the back of the Document index for the 60th Congress, 1st session. Vol. 21, National Soldiers' Home report for 1907, has only a partial nondocument edition, and that differing considerably from the numbered document edition. Vol. 53, Summary and Report of commissioner of corporations on cotton exchanges, pts. 1-3, is not considered to be either an annual or a serial. Vol. 79, Estimates of appropriations and other documents from the Treasury Department, has no unnumbered nondocument edition as a volume, nor have three of the four documents of which it is composed such editions. Vol. 95, House manual, is of late years issued only in a numbered document print. Vol. 101, Estimates for salaries, etc., is neither an annual nor a serial. Vols. 103 and 104 are parallel with vol. 6, Senate documents, already explained. These schedule corrections may be easily made by any librarian who wishes to make them.

The matter is not quite so easy in the case of volumes which have been bound in accordance with the first form of scheduling and have been already sent to the depository libraries. These are four in number, vols. 17, Senate documents, and 21, 25, and 26, House documents. The worst one of these is vol. 17, Senate documents, Inland Waterways Commission report, which has an error not chargeable to the Documents Office, namely, that of putting a "plain title" or nondocument cover on a book carrying title-pages having Congressional document numbers. The other three, namely, House documents vols. 21, 25, and 26, have no Congressional document numbers either on title-pages or back titles, and are so far consistent, though they should be numbered as Congressional documents.

It should not be difficult for librarians, either by notes on their shelf-list cards or by pasted labels on their books, or both, to adapt these four books to the changes in the schedule here suggested. The books noted as incorrectly scheduled, which have not yet been bound, will be bound in agreement with the changed forms noted in this explanation.

## DOCUMENTS OF THE MONTH

H. doc. 615, 61st Cong. 2d sess., is Secretary Dickinson's report on conditions in Porto Rico, resulting from his recent visit to that island. A voluminous bill, amending existing laws relating to Porto Rico, accompanies the report.

Bulletin 59 of the Hygienic Laboratory has the title *The oxidases and other oxygen-catalysts concerned in biological oxidations.*

The Animal Industry Bureau has issued the first number of a *Directory of its personnel and stations* and has discontinued the separate publication of the *Directory of the meat inspection service*, which is now included in the *Bureau Directory.*

Water-supply paper 238 of the Geological Survey has an important subject, *The public utility of water powers and their governmental regulation.* The joint authors are René Tavernier, chief engineer of the department of public works of France, and Marshall O. Leighton, chief hydrographer of the Geological Survey. It shows the practice of foreign countries, the Federal and State laws of this country, and so forth.

A still further development of education in agriculture is the formation of boys' and girls' agricultural clubs, described in *Farmers' bulletin 385.* This bulletin and *Experiment Stations Office Circular 60, The teaching of agriculture in the rural common schools*, are a pair of textbooks that should commend themselves to those who can profit by them. "As the twig is bent the tree's inclined."

*Experiment Stations Office Bulletin 222, Irrigation in Texas*, shows what has been done, what may be done, what should be done, and is illustrated by a map.

A document that will probably be read with interest alike by those who agree with it and those who do not has been printed by the House Committee on Agriculture. It is entitled *The influence of forests on climate and on floods.* It controverts almost every position taken by the advocates of forest conservation. It not only traverses the arguments of the conservationists, but denies even the postulates on which these arguments are based, and seeks to overturn doctrines long almost universally accepted as axiomatic. The author is Prof. Willis L. Moore, chief of the Weather Bureau, a fact which gives the publication a weight it could hardly have if published anonymously.

*Plant Industry Bureau Bulletin 169* has for subject *Variiegated alfalfa*—meaning various varieties of this highly esteemed forage plant which have been produced by crossbreeding. Some of these hybrids are more resistant to the effects of cold climates and otherwise more valuable than the parent stocks. It is a large bulletin and describes a great number of breeding experiments.

*Packing for export*, compiled and illustrated by the *Manufactures Bureau* and published as S. doc. 325, 61st Cong. 2d sess., will be very useful to those who have the wisdom to read it and profit by it. The examples it gives of losses by poor packing done in this

country, contrasted with the excellent packing done by foreign exporters—especially Germans—are object lessons of the most convincing kind. The bureau edition of this publication appeared in the Monthly catalogue for December, 1909.

H. rp. 432, 61st Cong. 2d sess., catalogued this month under the heading Judiciary Committee, House, discusses in majority and minority reports the interesting questions raised by the contest started in the courts by a disappointed bidder on a paper contract let by the Joint Committee on Printing. Is the function of this Congressional committee executive or legislative? are the members bound to obey the summons of the courts in such a case? are the prominent points.

Librarians will be interested in a new publication of the Catalog Division of the Library of Congress relating to the classification of books in that great library. It gives an outline scheme of classes, but is offered only as preliminary, and is dated Dec. 1909.

The long expected bulletin on the manufacture of denatured alcohol has now been issued as no. 130 of the Chemistry Bureau. Price 20c.

Parts 4 and 5 of the Report of the commissioner of corporations on cotton exchanges have been issued in 1 vol., completing the work. The new volume is sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 50c. Parts 1-3 were published in 1908.

The United States Geological Survey is now making an octavo edition (called the field edition) of its extensive series of folios of the Geologic atlas of the United States. The text is an octavo page and the maps are folded in a pocket. For some uses the smaller edition will be preferred to the "library edition."

It appears by a list transmitted by the State Department to the Foreign Relations Committee that about 220 diplomas, decorations, medals, and other gifts which foreign governments have tried to bestow upon various United States officials now remain in the hands of the chief clerk of the State Department, awaiting the permission of Congress for their acceptance by those to whom they have been tendered. This is because of a provision of the Constitution that officials may not receive gifts from foreign powers without the consent of Congress. About a hundred years ago an amendment making this prohibition apply to all citizens escaped ratification by a very small margin.

A memorandum concerning the elements of a lottery, by Assistant Attorney-General Goodwin, has been published by the Post-Office Department. This is a question to which postal officials must give much attention, for they are not permitted to carry postal matter for lotteries.

There is a new military publication, listed as Instruction circular 1, Division of Militia Affairs, and entitled Manual for privates of infantry of the organized militia of the United States. A very large circulation is predicted for this manual. It is sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 20c.

There is a newly revised edition, dated 1909, of the account of the battle of Shiloh and the organizations engaged therein, issued by the Shiloh National Military Park Commission. Sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 45c. The first edition was issued in 1902.

The first statistical publication of the 13th census is Bulletin 98 of the permanent Census Bureau. It gives descriptions of the supervisors' districts into which the United States has been divided for the purpose of making this year's census. They number 330, exclusive of Alaska and Hawaii, where the census will be taken by special agents.

Promising root crops for the South is the title of Plant Industry Bureau Bulletin 164. The roots recommended are yautias, taros, and dasheens, which are said to have, when growing, the general appearance of the decorative plant known as "elephants' ears." It will take a little time to get used to these names.

Chemistry Bureau Bulletin 107, methods of analysis, etc., has been again reprinted. Though it has been on the market for several years the demand for it continues unabated. In paper covers, 20c.

The monthly Bulletin of the American Republics Bureau has come to be about the most handsomely printed and profusely illustrated of American periodicals.

A very recent report (S. doc. 376, 61st Cong., 2d sess.) shows that the receipts of the Reclamation Service have been \$58,582,140 and its expenditures \$50,688,083, while enough work has already been allotted to bring the total outlay up to \$60,407,000. This is going into irrigation on a grand scale. Nobody, however, seems to think it too grand, for the benefits are too obvious to be questioned. Document 376 gives the cost in detail of each separate irrigation project.

The Navy Department has published a statistical account of the voyage of the fleet of battleships around the world in 1908, showing the arrival and departure of each ship at and from each port, the amount of coal consumed, and other official records which many will no doubt wish to preserve.

Vol. 1, Hearings in the controversy, Pinchot v. Ballinger, filling nearly 800 pages, and a part of vol. 2 have been printed and are entered in their appropriate place in this number of the Monthly catalogue. These are but the beginnings of a record that bids fair to fill many volumes.

Mineral resources, 1908, Part 1, Metallic products, in cloth, is now available for sale by the Superintendent of Documents at 80c.

Professor Irving Fisher's notable report entitled The national vitality, its wastes and conservation, has now been separately published as a public document and can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents at 15c. a copy.

#### NEW WEATHER PUBLICATIONS

The Weather Bureau has announced a new series of publications, under the title Climatological service of the Weather Bureau, which the Superintendent of Documents is prepared to supply to subscribers. The country has been divided into 12 large weather

districts, and for each of these a summary will be published in the Monthly weather review. These will be prepared by the district editors, one who is familiar with the country having been appointed for each district. These 12 monthly weather summaries will also be printed separately, and in this form will be mailed to buyers or subscribers by the Superintendent of Documents at 5c. a copy or 50c. a year.

In the January Monthly catalogue mention was made of the change of price of the Monthly weather review, which has lately been much enlarged.

#### PUBLIC DOCUMENTS AND THE REVIEWERS

In these days even literary reviewers find interesting material in United States public documents. The London (Eng.) Bookseller, Jan. 21, 1910, has an extended review of Mr. Sonneck's Report on the Star-spangled banner, Hail Columbia, America, and Yankee Doodle, from which the following excerpts are taken:

A volume dealing with such a subject necessarily has a primary interest for American readers, but the songs and melodies are, of course, so well known on this side the Atlantic that many English readers and music lovers will like to know something of the information that is here set forth. As regards "The Star-Spangled Banner," the actual circumstances under which it was written have never been controverted, as they practically rest upon information supplied by Mr. Francis Scott Key himself to Chief Justice Taney, who passed them on to Mr. Henry U. D. Jones, when in 1856 he published an edition of Mr. Scott Key's Poems. How it came about, however, that the verses were wedded to the convivial music of the song "Anacreon in Heaven" is not quite so easily settled, but the particulars here collected of that once well-known song will be very interesting to all concerned in the history of English songs. "Hail, Columbia," was, it seems, written in 1798, at the time of the French wars, and it is worth noting that both the words and the music were actually American. The author was one Joseph Hopkinson, who finds his chief title to immortality in its authorship. It was written for the benefit of a young singer, Gilbert Fox, and was adapted at his request to the music of "The President's March." It was immediately successful, and quickly became a national song. The author of the music, "The President's March," was for some time uncertain, but the present report makes it more than probable that the tradition which declares it was composed by one Philip Phile before 1793 is correct. The last song of the four, the popular "Yankee Doodle," provides the most interesting investigation of all. At the same time it leaves it still undiscovered exactly what was the origin of the song, and who was the author of the melody. The meaning of the word "Yankee" is exhaustively discussed, and many competing derivations examined, without any very satisfactory result. After rejecting various suggestions and theories, the report views with some favour the idea that the tune was known as a Lancashire hornpipe as early as 1658. The verses sung to the tune are many and various, and were very often interpolated, the dates being consequently quite uncertain, except that the verses "Father and I went down to camp" may be fixed with some accuracy as between the years 1810 and 1813. The author of the music still remains unknown, unless as the report remarks, it be deemed a positive result to have eliminated definitely almost every theory thus far advanced, and thus to have paved the way for an eventual solution of the puzzle. A list of works on the subject and several facsimile plates are added.

Mr. Sonneck's entertaining work, published by the Library of Congress, is sold, in cloth, by the Superintendent of Documents, at 85c.

The American historical review for January, 1910, reviews A century of population growth, from the first census of the United States to the twelfth, 1790-1900, recently issued by the Census Bureau. From this review we reproduce the following:

Six years ago the records relating to the earlier censuses of the United States were transferred by the Department of the Interior to the custody of the Director of the Census. This excellent and handsome volume sums up the statistical results which can still be derived by a modern expert from the old materials. One cannot in brief space summarize or review a quarto volume of varied statistics, but the historical student interested in the United States of about 1790 will find in it a great deal to interest and instruct him. From the schedules of the First Census and other contemporary materials a "Statistical Abstract" of the United States in 1790 has been obtained, covering area, population white and negro, families, names, nationality, migration, transportation, slavery, occupations, etc., with many ingenious tables and diagrams, and a number of excellent reproductions of maps of the period in question. Besides discussions and tabulations relating to 1790, the volume contains many which review subsequent development in various lines of comparison, while forty pages give the results of those provincial and state censuses which were taken before 1790, material everyone will be glad to have in compact and combined form.

This historically valuable compilation is sold by the Superintendent of Documents, in cloth, at \$1.10.

The Detroit news, Feb. 6, 1910, publishes a brief review of Fisheries Bureau document 648, which is a separate from Fisheries Bureau Bulletin, v. 28. Though the bulletin as a whole will be for the year 1908, this separate was issued in 1910. Its title is International regulations of the fisheries on the high seas. It was read before the Fourth International Fishery Congress, held in Washington Sept. 1908, by the author, Charles Hugh Stevenson, and received the award of \$200 offered by the Smithsonian Institution for the best treatise on this subject. We quote from the review in the News:

The term "high seas" implies all the waters of the ocean, and all connecting arms and bays, exterior to low-water mark; but in international law and in the sense employed here, the term is not so broad, and it signifies only so much of the ocean as is outside the territorial jurisdiction of maritime states, and is what might be called the extraterritorial seas. The statistics given in the article show that the author knows whereof he speaks. It covers the fishery subject thoroughly.

Copies of this prize-essay document can be bought from the Superintendent of Documents at 15c. each, in paper covers.

The Detroit news also comments as follows on Ethnology Bureau Bulletin 38, Unwritten literature of Hawaii: the sacred songs of the hula; by Nathaniel B. Emerson:

For a complete collection of Hawaiian songs and poetic pieces that have done service from time immemorial as the stock supply of the Hula, this book, which represents years of effort, will meet with the approval of its readers. The sacred songs have been translated into English, with notes and an account of the Hula. The book contains many photographic reproductions of flowers and people.

This bulletin is sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 25c. in paper, 50c. in cloth.

The American historical review for January, 1910, reviews a recent publication of the Library of Congress in the following eulogistic terms:

Mr. Philip Lee Phillips, chief of the division of maps and charts in the Library of Congress, has compiled a remarkable annotated List of Geographical Atlases in the Library of Congress. In the first volume, of over 1200 pages, the atlases are described and analyzed with unusual wealth of bibliographical detail. Atlases of special subjects, colonial, commercial, ecclesiastical, historical, etc., are included. Maps relating to America, plans of cities throughout the world, and material of specific interest not usually found in atlases, are brought to the special attention of the student. In the second volume an author-list of abridged titles, with dates of birth and death, precedes the index, which contains over 40,000 references. Under "Publishers" is "an alphabetical list of all the atlas publishers referred to in the body of the work." In the case of the atlases of Ptolemy, Ortelius, Mercator, and some others, not only the editions in the Library of Congress but all other known editions are noted. Of much value to the historian are the full analyses of such collections of reproductions of old maps as the works of Santarem, Jomard, Fischer, and others, and of the atlases accompanying boundary disputes.

This important work, in 2 vols., is sold by the Superintendent of Documents, in cloth, at \$2.35 for the set.

The February number of the Yale review, published at Yale University, has notes on three recent United States public documents, from which we quote:

Transportation by Water in the United States. Report of the Commissioner of Corporations. Washington: Government Printing Office, 1909. Two parts. An exhaustive investigation of water transportation in the United States is being made under the direction of the Federal Commissioner of Corporations, and already two volumes of the study have been published. The first deals with such broad questions as the physical character of the coastwise and inland waterways; the types of traffic-carriers and their equipment, and the financial and legal questions involved in their operation. The second volume contains a discussion of water-borne traffic with reference to its general nature, and to its past and present importance upon the various waterways of the country. Other sections of the study yet to be published will deal with such further problems as terminals, freight rates, and the relations of the railways to the waterways.

Tlingit Myths and Texts. Recorded by John R. Swanton. Bureau of American Ethnology Bulletin 39. Washington: Government Printing Office, 1909. We have here another of the regular series of records made under governmental auspices, covering the actual myths as rendered into English, and also as reproduced phonetically. In the absence of phonographic records, the method used represents probably the best, though a laborious way of preserving the Indian dialects for the study of future specialists in languages. This, and the collecting of folklore before it is too late, are enterprises that cannot be sufficiently praised.

Taxation of Corporations. Part I.—New England. Bureau of Corporations. Washington: Government Printing Office, 1909. This report is a digest and discussion of the systems of taxing, manufacturing, mercantile, transportation, and transmission corporations and the securities issued by them, in the six New England States. It consists of a general introductory discussion, followed by separate chapters on each of the States. The account for each State contains (1) a general view of the tax system of the State, (2) a detailed digest of the constitution and statutes, (3) an account of the


financial returns of taxes for a few recent years, and (4) comments by taxing officials and other authorities on the working of the state tax system. The report is a decidedly valuable contribution. It shows evidence of careful work in investigating statutes and financial statistics, and also a sound knowledge and understanding of the principles of public finance. It should prove of practical value to everyone interested in the subject. The Bureau of Corporations intends to print similar reports on the other States in future volumes, an undertaking which is deserving of hearty support.

All three of the documents so favorably commented on by the Yale review are sold by the Superintendent of Documents. Transportation by water, Part 1, in paper, 65c.; Part 2, in paper, 50c.; Tlingit myths, in paper, 35c., in cloth, 50c.; Taxation of corporations, Part 1, paper, 20c.

The February number of the American political science review, published at Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, carries a sharp criticism of Professor Thorpe's 7-volume compilation of Federal and State constitutions, colonial charters, and other organic laws of the States, Territories, and colonies now or heretofore forming the United States of America. The reviewer charges various sins both of commission and of omission, but says that Professor Thorpe has "followed Poore's plan of giving a constitution and then following it with amendments in chronological order," and that "this arrangement is the most satisfactory, especially when notes are given to each text indicating where amendments have been made," and that "the collection must be used by students, because the more recent State constitutions are not easily available elsewhere," closing with the remark that "it is perhaps sufficient to suggest that the work is untrustworthy and should be used with care."

It goes without saying that all reference books "should be used with care." In this case the lapses pointed out by the reviewer seem to fall far short of justifying a sweeping condemnation. The reviewer himself goes a long step toward offsetting them by saying that "in addition to printing State constitutions and amendments subsequent to Poore's collection, Dr. Thorpe has also introduced much new matter relating to early colonial history, and has published the Albany plan of union (1754) together with some other documents of importance."

It is of course to be regretted that even minor faults are found in the Thorpe collection, but the student who undertakes to wait for the publication of such a work devoid of errors will find it a tiresome wait. Whatever pinholes reviewers may detect in the new set of charters and constitutions, the fact is incontestable that it is the latest and thus far the best compilation of its kind. This compilation is sold by the Superintendent of Documents, in a good cloth binding, at \$5.25 for the set of 7 volumes.

Three scales are used, 1:62,500, 1:125,000, and 1:250,000. These correspond, approximately, to 1 mile, 2 miles, and 4 miles to 1 linear inch on the map. The size, unless otherwise given is about 17.5 inches in height by 11.5 to 16 inches in width, exclusive of the margin, the width varying with the latitude. A description of the topographic map is printed on the reverse of each sheet.

More than one-third of the area of the country, excluding outlying possessions, has been mapped, every State being represented. Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia are completely mapped.
