NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a * price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith, etc.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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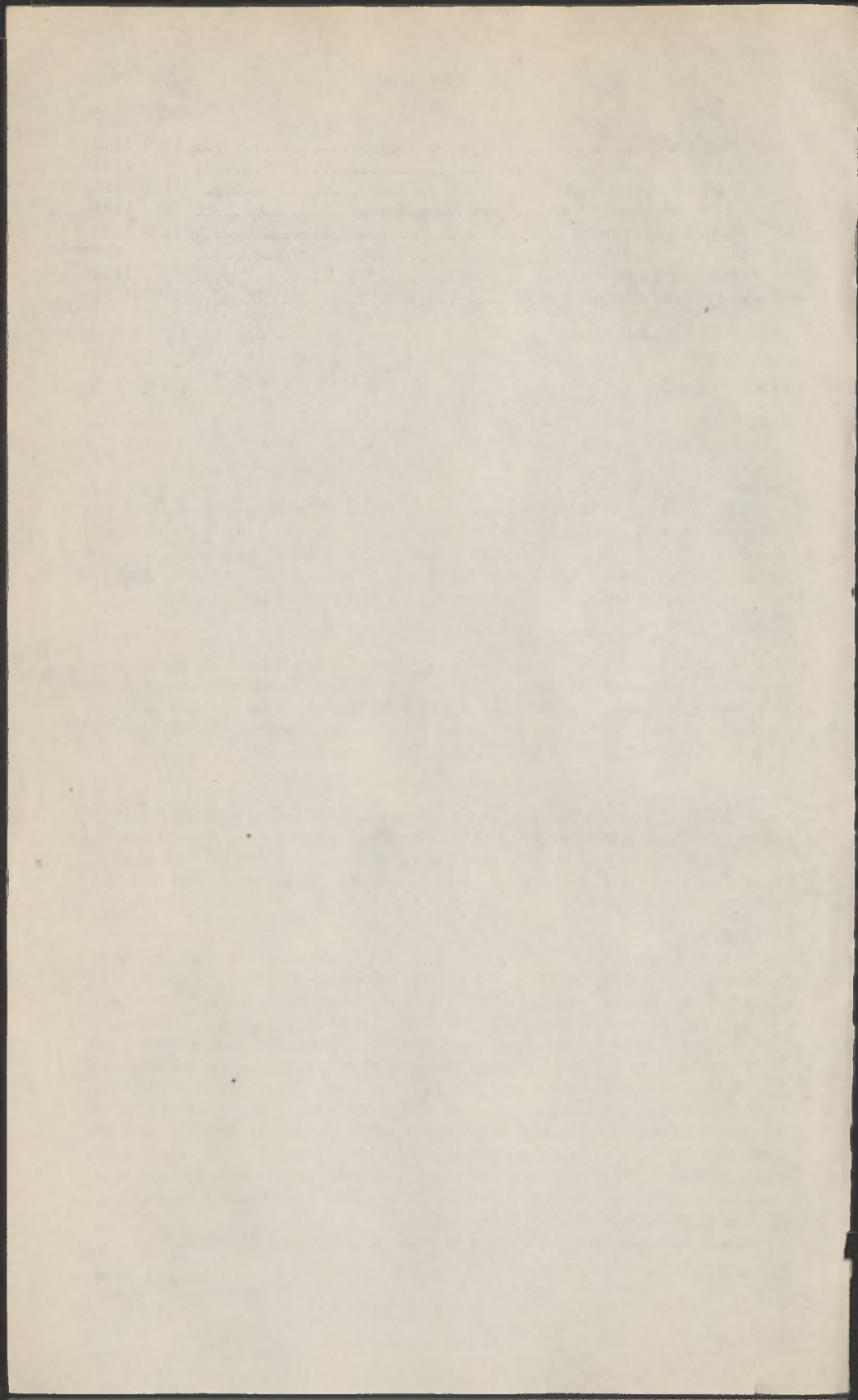
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The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

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A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

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Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

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LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, *not* to the Superintendent of Documents.

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION SESQUICENTENNIAL

The United States Constitution Sesquicentennial Commission was established by Public Resolution 53 of the 74th Congress, approved August 23, 1935. This resolution provided for the preparation and completion of plans for a comprehensive observance of the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the formation of the Constitution of the United States, and established a Commission composed of 18 commissioners to plan for an adequate celebration of the sesquicentennial anniversary. The Commission held its first meeting on August 26, 1935, at which the President of the United States was elected chairman of the Commission and Representative Sol Bloom was appointed director general.

In a report of the Commission presented to Congress in June 1936, it was urged that every home and individual in the Nation be asked to participate, all over the United States, its Territories, and insular possessions, in the celebration of the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the formation of the Constitution, commencing on September 17, 1937, and continuing through April 30, 1939, which will be the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the inauguration of President Washington. On July 4, 1937, the President of the United States issued a proclamation designating the period from September 17, 1937, to April 30, 1939, as one of commemoration of the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the signing and ratification of the Constitution and of the inauguration of the first President under that Constitution.

The Commission has been most active in formulating and promoting programs and various forms of celebration. Perhaps the most outstanding of its permanent contributions are the volume entitled "The Story of the Constitution"; the exact replica of the shrine of the Constitution of the United States, the original of which is in the Library of Congress, this latter constructed of formica which gives the impression of massive marble, and to be made available to but one store in each city, after which it could be presented to the local public library or one of the schools; also for presentation by patriotic persons to schools, public buildings, libraries, and other institutions, a standard shrine of the Constitution with swinging frames containing facsimiles of the Constitution, the Declaration of Independence, and photographs of the signers of the Constitution. The celebration will begin September 17 of this year and its continuance should make the Nation thoroughly acquainted with and proud of its most outstanding document.

NATIONAL CANCER INSTITUTE

A National Cancer Institute, to be a division under the Public Health Service, was established by the provisions of S. 2067, 75th Congress (Public no. 244, approved August 5, 1937), for the purpose of conducting researches, investigations, experiments, and studies relating to the cause, diagnosis, and treatment of cancer; assisting and fostering similar research activities by other agencies, public and private; and promoting the coordination of all such researches and activities and the useful application of their results, with a view to the development and prompt widespread use of the most effective methods of prevention,

diagnosis, and treatment of cancer. The same act created the National Advisory Cancer Council to consist of six members to be appointed by the Surgeon General of the Public Health Service with the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury, and of the Surgeon General, ex officio, who shall be chairman of the council. The six appointed members are to be selected from leading medical or scientific authorities who are outstanding in the study, diagnosis, or treatment of cancer in the United States. This council is to cooperate with the Surgeon General of the Public Health Service through the National Cancer Institute in furthering the provisions of the National Cancer Institute Act, which act is to take effect 30 days after the date of its enactment.

LAWS

Heretofore, at the end of each session of Congress they have been published in a paper edition popularly known as Session or Pamphlet laws; subsequently the Session laws for the whole Congress were printed in a permanent bound edition entitled *Statutes at large*.

Beginning with the 75th Congress in accordance with provisions of S. 3440, 74th Congress (Public 724, approved June 20, 1936), the Session or Pamphlet laws will be discontinued and the *Statutes at large* heretofore published at the end of a Congress will be issued at the end of each session of Congress.

Each act of Congress in slip form now bears the chapter number of the *Statutes at large* in which it will appear later, as well as the session of Congress to which it belongs, but this information does not appear in the entries listed below.

Topographic maps

NOTE.—The Geological Survey is making a series of topographic maps that will eventually cover the whole United States, also Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. The individual maps are projected to represent quadrangle areas rather than political divisions, and each map is designated by the name of some prominent town or natural feature in the area mapped. The scales most commonly used are 1:31,680, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding approximately to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered differs with the latitude, but the average area is 53, 230, or 920 square miles respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches, and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. About 47 percent of the continental area of the country, excluding Alaska, has been mapped, every State being represented. MARITIME COMMISSION

NOTE.—An agency to be known as the United States Maritime Commission was established under the provisions of H. R. 8553, 74th Congress (Public 835, approved June 29, 1936), to further the development and maintenance of an adequate and well-balanced American merchant marine, to promote the commerce of the United States, and to aid in the national defense. The same act dissolved the United States Shipping Board Merchant Fleet Corporation, directing that all records, etc., be taken over by the Commission, and transferred all the functions, powers, and duties vested in the former United States Shipping Board (later the Shipping Board Bureau under the Commerce Department) to the United States Maritime Commission. It also transferred to and vested in the Commission all the powers and duties now vested by law in the Postmaster General with respect to existing ocean-mail contracts.

One of the publications listed below was prepared by the Maritime Commission, but since it belongs to a volume of reports begun by the Shipping Board prior to the transfer of its functions to the Department of Commerce, the old classification, SB 1.10/a:, is retained in order that it may be filed with the other reports included in the volume.

TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. The serial publications of the Smithsonian Institution are as follows: 1, Smithsonian contributions to knowledge; 2, Smithsonian miscellaneous collections; 3, Smithsonian annual reports. No *sets* of these are for sale or distribution, as most of the volumes are out of print. Special publications are also issued from time to time. The papers issued in the series of Contributions to knowledge and Miscellaneous collections are not public documents, but are printed in limited editions at the expense of the Smithsonian Fund. They are distributed without charge to public libraries, educational establishments, and learned societies in this country and abroad; and are supplied to other institutions, and to individuals at the prices indicated. Remittances should be made payable to the 'Smithsonian Institution.' A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratuitously* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. The Institution maintains mailing-lists of public libraries and other educational establishments, but no *general mailing-list of individuals*. A library making application to be listed for Smithsonian publications should state the number of volumes which it contains and the date of its establishment, and have the endorsement of a Member of Congress."

Although the annual reports are the only Smithsonian publications that are regularly issued as public documents, the others are usually regarded as such and have free transmission by mail, therefore they are listed in the Monthly catalog.

STATE DEPARTMENT

NOTE.—With the publication of the first number of the printed Press releases on Oct. 5, 1929, the Department of State inaugurated a new publication program. The daily mimeographed releases are made available to the public weekly in printed form; also, all publications (except laws and treaties) are numbered consecutively in the order in which they are sent to press. Publications of a similar character are brought within well-defined series, and each series publication bears a series number in addition to its publication number. The diplomatic correspondence of the United States is published in the volumes entitled *Foreign relations of the United States*. Laws are issued in separate series and are numbered within each series in the order in which they are signed. Treaties are issued in a separate series and are numbered in the order in which they are proclaimed. Treaties are also published in the compilation *Treaties and other international acts of the United States of America*, which contains literal copies of the documents, followed by notes of a textual and procedural character. Indexes to the Press releases are supplied semiannually, as of December 31 and June 30. The Department of State includes in the Press releases series, each quarter, a complete list of its publications for the preceding quarter.

The list below frequently includes certain relevant publications issued by other agencies of the Government under requisition of the Department of State and certain relevant congressional documents.

Under the practice of the State Department prior to the inauguration of the Executive agreement series (no. 102 and 103 of which are listed below) the material would have been published in the Treaty series.
