NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

In response to the circulars requesting information and offering to receive duplicate and useless public documents or to supply any Government publications which are available, we have received a great number of replies, which as yet we have been unable to tabulate, owing to the fact that the convening of a new Congress is at hand and our work increased in consequence.

To all those who have returned their question circulars and requested documents or information not yet supplied, we would say that as soon as possible their wants will be carefully considered. To the libraries there is but one Documents Office; to the Documents Office there are many libraries.

Attention is again called to the "Important information" which always appears on the last page of the cover of each issue of the Monthly catalogue. If the information therein contained were read and digested, there would be fewer delays in supplying publications or information.

"Library wants" blanks will be supplied upon application. It would be well for every library which has occasion to make requests of this Office to have a supply of these blanks at hand, as in the future no requests for books will be considered unless made upon the proper forms. This is part of a scheme of cooperation which will eventually evolve a more harmonious condition of affairs than has existed heretofore. It will save a lot of unnecessary and thoroughly exasperating correspondence if all libraries will comply with the regulations outlined in the notes in last month's Catalogue.

The United States public document of greatest popular interest among those issued during November is probably the report of a group of experts on the San Francisco earthquake and fire of April, 1906, and their effects on structures and structural materials. Reinforced concrete is the material which best resisted the rocking action of the quake, and old brick walls, buttressed, or braced with band iron, came out much better than many new structures. "Weak and flimsy framing, insufficient bracing, and poor mortar," says the report, "were the cause of most of the failures in San

Francisco." The experts go into full detail in reporting upon the great disaster, and their facts and deductions must be of value to builders of structures upon which large sums are laid out with the purpose of securing permanence. Not even science can foresee what spot on the earth's surface will feel the next quake, and it is the part of wisdom to build in preparation for the worst.

The San Francisco report is printed as Bulletin 324 of the Geological Survey, and is illustrated by more than 50 photographic views and a map. The Survey makes a strong showing in this month's Catalogue, with six Water-supply papers and three Bulletins (about 1,700 pages of text), to say nothing of four atlases, several separates, and a hundred or more plates and maps.

The census of population of Oklahoma and Indian territories (now united in the State of Oklahoma) is printed as Bulletin 89 of the Census Bureau. This census was taken in record time last summer, and shows the official population of the new State to be 1,414,177.

Plant Industry Bulletin 111, part 3, furnishes a convincing argument for laws to prevent the importation of adulterated seeds. Legislation against adulterated seed is general throughout Europe, and, "as a natural result," says the Bulletin, "the United States has become the dumping ground for the poor seed of Canada and Europe." By plates showing high-grade and low-grade seeds magnified to nine times the natural size, the distinction between clean and adulterated seed is strikingly demonstrated. The farmer who pays for clover and alfalfa seed and unwittingly sows his land to noxious weeds would seem to be a proper subject for legislative protection.

For some years past the agricultural experiment stations have been supplying farmers with free lectures giving the scientific view of various farm problems. Now another step forward has been taken by fitting out the lecturer on tobacco growing with a set of 46 camera slides to illustrate his comments. A pamphlet from the Office of Experiment Stations gives a syllabus of the lecture and a list of the subjects of the slides.

Circular 115, Forest Service, is a second progress report on an important subject, the strength of structural timber, the result of four years' testing work in the laboratories of the Service.

A much-needed and welcome document (Publications Division Bulletin 8) is an index to the first 250 Farmers' bulletins of the Agriculture Department. The Farmers' bulletins are now so numerous and cover such a wide range of subjects that every library, as well as every progressive farmer, should have a full set of them, and they are difficult of complete use without an index.

Bulletin 30 of the Biological Survey is the first part of "Birds of California in relation to the fruit industry." It has a pretty colored frontispiece, showing the California bush-tit and its nest, and has also several other bird portraits. The conclusion of the biologists is that, with very few exceptions, the birds do more good by destroying noxious insects than they do harm by eating fruit.

Ticks (chiggers) may seem to the average reader a small subject for a formal public document, but it is estimated that they cost the Southern States no less than a hundred million dollars a year by their depredations upon cattle. The discovery of a remedy for this pest has long been an object of scientific research. The present opinion seems to be that the only sure remedy is the complete extermination of the cattle tick, and that this is possible. The latest experiments looking to this end are described and illustrated in Entomology Bulletin 72, now first published.

Barnacles in the public service are not unheard of, and now we have a document devoted exclusively to them. The particular barnacles treated of are found in the show-cases of the National Museum, and the series name and number of the pamphlet in which the illustrations and descriptions are found is National Museum Bulletin 60.

The Military Information Division of the War Department has epitomized the history of the Russo-Japanese War in a single volume, and not a large one at that. By means of 167 pages of text, an index, and a bunch of maps this great history is put into a nutshell, so to speak.

The second edition of the American Ephemeris and Nautical Almanac for 1908 is among the month's issues.

While November saw no monumental work come forth from the Government presses, there is much of interest and value to be found in the official publications of the month. And this is true of every month, the year round, and year after year.

As it is a current prediction that a bill for the creation of a National Board of Health will be introduced at the first session of the Sixtieth Congress, it may be of present interest to recall how the former National Board of Health was made to die a lingering death by slow starvation. The Board was created by an act approved March 3, 1879 (45th Cong., 3d sess., chap. 202), providing for the appointment by the President of seven members and the detail of one member each from the Army, the Navy, the Marine-Hospital Service, and the Justice Department. The duties assigned to it were to obtain information as to all matters affecting the public health, to advise the departments of the general Government and the Executives of the States on such matters, and to report a plan for a national public health organization. The act also requested and directed the National Academy of Sciences to cooperate with the Board. The new Board was organized April 2, 1879. By act of June 2, 1879 (46th Cong., 1st sess., chap. 11), an act of the preceding year which had established a national quarantine system under direction of the Marine-Hospital Service was repealed and the powers and duties which had been conferred by it were transferred to the National Board of Health, for whose work half a million dollars were appropriated, but the operation of the act was limited to a period of four years. The Board published Annual reports,

1879-85, seven in all, the first two for calendar years, the others for fiscal years. All were printed as numbered Congressional documents, and all but that for 1884 were also printed in a cloth edition without document number. In 1884 the Annual reports for 1880-83 were reprinted by order of Congress, 1,000 copies of each. The numerous appendixes to these reports were usually published also in separate pamphlets. The Board also made quarterly reports to the Secretary of the Treasury, and issued a weekly Bulletin in quarto form from July 5, 1879, to July 1, 1882. The final number was the first of volume 4. Publication was suspended at this point because the printing appropriation had given out, and it was never resumed. Sundry supplements to the Bulletin and a numbered series of circulars were also printed. The Board was composed of eminent men, but it failed to find favor with Congress and it was starved to death. For the first few years its annual appropriation was \$75,000, but by act of August 7, 1882, the Board was directed to confine its activities to cholera, smallpox, and yellow fever, and its support was limited to such part of an appropriation of \$50,000 in aid of State and local quarantine authorities as the Secretary of the Treasury might allot to it. March 3, 1883, \$10,000 was appropriated, but its expenditure was limited to the pay and personal expenses of members of the Board. March 3, 1885, there was a small appropriation for rent and employees for a term to end the same month. On the same date was granted \$5,000 for pay and expenses of members. August 4, 1886, a similar appropriation was made of \$60. March 2, 1889, the final appropriation was voted, \$1,004 for storage of books, records, and furniture to March 4, 1889, and for their transportation to the Office of the Surgeon-General of the Army, "where they shall hereafter be stored." The act of June 2, 1879, conferring extensive powers upon the Board, but limiting its operation to four years, was not repealed or renewed. The Board therefor virtually expired June 2, 1883.

The following order has been received from the Commerce and Labor Department, and, although it does not go into effect until the beginning of the new year, it has been thought well to publish it here for the information of those interested in the publications mentioned: "*Ordered*, That commencing with January 1, 1908, the Monthly notice to mariners, issued by the Coast and Geodetic Survey, be consolidated with and made a part of the Weekly notice to mariners, issued by the Light-House Board."
