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Report by the Chairman of the Public Documents Committee of the American Library Association concerning the cataloging and indexing programs of the Division of Public Documents

Editor's note—Mr. Jerome K. Wilcox, Chairman of the Public Documents Committee of the American Library Association, was invited to make a study of the cataloging and indexing functions of the Division of Public Documents. Mr. Wilcox has compiled many checklists and guides to Federal and State publications, and has closely followed the activities of the Division of Public Documents for many years. He has written a number of articles for Library journals criticizing various features of the programs and many of the most constructive changes made in recent years have resulted from his suggestions. Because of the wide-spread interest of librarians and scholars in Mr. Wilcox's survey, his report is reprinted here. All of Mr. Wilcox's recommendations, except those involving additional appropriations or authorization, have been put into effect.

MY DEAR MR. GIEGENGACK: At the joint request of the Public Printer and of the Superintendent of Documents, I have spent the period from July 7 to August 2, inclusive, at the Division of Public Documents in Washington, D. C., making a survey of the services offered by this Division which are of special interest to libraries. During this period, I have reviewed all of the activities of the Library section and particularly those activities which go into the production of the various indexes and catalogs of Government publications. At the outset, it is well to state that the Biennial Document Catalog, now discontinued by action of the Joint Committee on Printing in March 1947, had no equivalent in the document bibliography field. Furthermore, no other government in the world has ever produced a catalog of its official publications of as high a caliber as was the former Document Catalog. Unfortunately, however, the issuance of this catalog has always been so far behind, in terms of publications included, that it has been essentially a historical bibliography at its time of issuance. Furthermore, it substantially duplicated 50 percent or more of the contents of the Monthly Catalog. The major difference between the Monthly Catalog and the Document Catalog was that the Monthly Catalog was arranged by department and agency under department, with an annual subject index, whereas the Document Catalog has always been in dictionary catalog form, that is, author, title, and subject all in one alphabet. Changes or improvements in either of the bibliographical tools have been rather infrequent. No criticism, however, could ever be made of the thoroughness of the treatment of each title. In fact, if any criticism were to be made here, it would be to question the painstaking details. A few recent changes in the Monthly Catalog should be mentioned here:

1. The inclusion of item numbers denoting depository distribution.
2. The cumulative semiannual listing of current periodicals.
3. The speeding up of time of issue, so that the catalog is issued at the end of the month for which it is dated.
4. The inclusion, beginning with the May 1947 issue, of noncurrent and declassified publications formerly held for the Document Catalog.

My survey during the month, as I have stated, was principally concerned with the processes that went into the production of the Monthly Catalog. For some

years, there have been questions in my mind as to the necessity for all of the details given in the Monthly Catalog. It was, therefore, in this category that the attack was first made. As a result of this detailed treatment, there have been delays in the issuance of the Monthly Catalog and the former Document Catalog. The problem as I saw it, therefore, was to find what rearrangements might be made in the Monthly Catalog and what entries might be shortened in order to reduce the time spent in its production without impairing its importance. Appended hereto you will find a copy of "Recommended changes in the format of the Monthly Catalog," with appendices of examples. These recommendations are made with two questions in mind: First, what are the chief approaches of the users; and, second, what simplifications in entries might be made in order to speed up publication? Users of the Monthly Catalog generally approach the contents with the name of an issuing agency or with certain subject matter in mind. It has, therefore, been recommended that the main body of the Monthly Catalog, which is now arranged first by department, then bureaus under department, be changed to a straight alphabetical list by inverting the name of issuing agencies. If this change were made, it would no longer be necessary for the user to determine the department of which the particular bureau in which he is interested is part. This change is particularly important now, during the present period of frequent Government reorganization.

With regard to the subject approach, it has been recommended that the subject index to each monthly issue contain a complete subject approach covering every publication. At the present time, the monthly index is principally a subject catch title index. The recommendation for the complete subject approach also specifies that references in the index refer to item or entry numbers rather than to page, as has been the practice up to now. One of the greatest values of the Monthly Catalog to libraries is its use as a checklist. The present arrangement of the catalog, with publications listed under issuing agencies by the so-called subject subheads, has militated against such use. The subject subhead actually lost its importance with the addition of the Monthly Index, beginning July 1945. It has, therefore, been recommended that listing under issuing agencies by subheads be discontinued and that henceforth all publications under issuing agencies be listed alphabetically by title or series, all in one alphabet. Where series are listed, the first entry should be a collective one, followed by notations of the numbers of that series included during the month. This should be followed by a listing by contents, giving numbers of the series, followed by titles of each. Considerable simplification in the entry of congressional publications has been recommended, as well as a number of simplified treatments, principally of preprints of opinions and decisions of administrative bodies and various law courts. These appear in detail in the appended recommended changes in the format of the Monthly Catalog.

Recommended changes in the handling of the Monthly Index should decrease the time consumed in preparing this index and will make possible issuance of the annual index with the December issue of the catalog. It is also possible that in the near future the Numerical List and Schedule of Volumes will no longer have to be published, as all of its features will eventually be part of the Monthly Catalog. The first volume (1941-42) of the Supplements to the Monthly Catalog is nearing completion. Probably two more will be necessary, 1943-44 and 1945-April 1947. The first issue will be arranged alphabetically by issuing agency, and the index will refer to entry number, not page. The remaining issues should take cognizance of all of the changes made in the Monthly Catalog, beginning with the September 1947 issue. These supplements to the Monthly Catalog will list only those publications which were not in the Monthly Catalog for the same period. It may take users some time to adjust

themselves to the new form of the Monthly Catalog and supplementary volumes. Any slight temporary inconvenience seems outweighed by the fact that the change eliminates 50 percent or more duplication by discontinuance of the Document Catalog. Furthermore, after all the supplements have been issued, the entire efforts of the Library section can be spent on one catalog, the Monthly Catalog.

The Superintendent of Documents accepted the attached recommendations, and the September 1947 issue of the Monthly Catalog will reflect these changes. The Library section began making these changes, beginning July 21. The final 2 weeks were spent in working direct with the various units and setting up the new procedures.

The over-all picture, as I see it, is the issuance of one comprehensive catalog on a periodic basis. I firmly believe that the material which was received in the Library section, not current and therefore held formerly for the Biennial Document Catalog, should be incorporated month by month, as received, in the Monthly Catalog. Furthermore, as I have already indicated, the Numerical List and Schedule of Volumes can be absorbed in the Monthly Catalog. The former depository invoice has already been so absorbed. With the further changes in the Monthly Catalog, beginning with the September 1947 issue, a certain amount of the work load of the Library section should be reduced so that greater effort can be exercised in the securing and listing of the processed publications and other non-G. P. O. imprints. Incidentally, this more complete and comprehensive inclusion should be of benefit to the agencies themselves, in informing them of certain studies which have been made by other agencies and which they might, themselves, have been contemplating. This might presumably eliminate duplication of effort. Furthermore, all publications, whether G. P. O. in origin or processed by the agencies, should be made known to the public so that they may benefit by the work and research from the largest source of information in the world, the United States Government. Therefore, systematic effort must be exercised by the Library section in the procurement and listing in the Monthly Catalog of processed documents and other non-G. P. O. imprints of all agencies, in order to make the Monthly Catalog a complete, comprehensive catalog of all Government publications.

No study was made of the classification scheme originated by and used in the Library section. This should be a subject of investigation and study in the near future. Such a study should be preceded by a questionnaire sent to all depository libraries, inquiring whether they use the scheme and what changes in the scheme they would suggest.

Up to this point, the recommendations have been concerned with changes in or organizations of the current program in the Library section. This section, or the Superintendent of Documents' office itself, should seriously consider in the near future the undertaking of the following four projects:

1. Issuance of a complete new edition of the so-called checklist.
2. A field survey of depository libraries.
3. Inclusion in the Monthly Catalog of the publications of field agencies.
4. Setting up an expeditor project similar to the one now operating at the Library of Congress at the expense of about 50 university and college libraries.

For some time there has been a consistent demand for either a complete new edition of the checklist or for bringing down-to-date the checklist of 1909. The need for this publication is principally as follows:

1. As a record of Government organization and reorganization;
2. As an outline of the Superintendent of Documents classification scheme used by many libraries;
3. As a checklist, principally for serial publications.

This undertaking would be costly, and I should, therefore, recommend that a form letter be drafted and sent to all libraries, inquiring whether they would be willing to subsidize such a publication and to what extent, or whether they would pay a flat rate per copy, whether they be depository libraries or not.

For many years there has been real need for a field survey of all Federal depository libraries. Such a survey should undoubtedly be initiated by sending to each of the depository libraries a carefully worked out questionnaire. The chief object of the survey should be to find out whether this substantial gift of public documents to libraries has been properly housed, has been kept in a systematic arrangement, and has been made generally available to the public without charge. It should further look into the question of whether these libraries actually need all the publications they have elected to receive. Such a field survey, undoubtedly, might result in a rewriting of the depository library statute. This office, by law, should make such checks periodically, but sufficient funds have never been provided for that purpose.

Except for a limited number of bibliographies, mostly done outside of the Government and covering one agency, there never has been any effort to list or index systematically the publications, whether printed or processed, of the field agencies of the Federal Government. In many instances (e. g. the Soil Conservation Service), the publications of field agencies are of as great importance as are those from the national office. It is highly desirable that such a list or index be prepared on a national basis, preferably through the medium of the Monthly Catalog.

On an experimental basis, some 50 libraries are now contributing \$100 to \$500 per year for a man known as a Document Expeditor whose chief function is to make contact with all Federal agencies to see that the libraries participating are placed on mailing lists for all publications. He is further charged with the responsibility of seeing that all cooperating libraries receive copies of declassified publications and publications which they are not able to secure direct, or otherwise. The Library of Congress, up to now, has provided space for the Document Expeditor and is receiving his services in payment. This type of function might very well be exercised by the Superintendent of Documents Office, probably also on some annual subscription or subsidy basis. On the other hand, it might be part of an energetic program to secure for the Library of the Superintendent of Documents' office all of these publications for proper classification and listing in the Monthly Catalog and at the same time to arrange for other interested libraries to receive the same material.

PREVIEWS

On a trial basis the Monthly Catalog will list a few publications which our catalogers have had an opportunity to review in advance of publication. Advance orders may be placed for these publications. Orders will be scheduled and copies mailed as soon as stocks are received. Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate, measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith. Processed publications are not obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents and requests for them, if they are available, should be addressed to the issuing office.

Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

General Information

The Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter.

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The sales stock includes approximately 65,000 different titles. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

LIST OF SELECTED PUBLICATIONS

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a semimonthly List of selected United States Government publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

CONGRESSIONAL BILLS, DOCUMENTS, AND REPORTS

More than 12,000 different bills are usually introduced during a session of Congress, and there are additional prints on many during the progress of the legislation. With the exception of a very few—such as revenue bills—the demand is an unknown quantity and on most of them we receive no orders, which makes it impossible to print a sales supply. It may be that a copy could be obtained from your Congressman.

A difficult problem is also presented in providing a supply of congressional documents and reports because there are usually more than 6,000 of this class of publications issued during a Congress and only a few of them are called for. We will attempt to print for sale, a few of the more important ones, but if not priced the only possible source would be from your Congressman.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use and is not obtainable. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. rp. 2, 80-1.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C., by coupon, postal money order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

Foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted. Do not send postage stamps.

For the convenience of the general public, coupons in the denomination of 5c that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States and possessions, or to Canada, Cuba, Mexico, Newfoundland (including Labrador), and certain Central and South American countries. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check list of United States public documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior or inferior number (the numbers immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers as superiors or inferiors in the Monthly catalog.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for many publications. These are given at the left with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards and requests for

information about them should be addressed to the Card Division, Library of Congress, *not* to the Superintendent of Documents. Checks or money orders should be made payable to The Librarian of Congress, and forwarded directly to The Librarian of Congress, Washington 25, D. C.

MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalog is sold on subscription, price \$2.25 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$2.85 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEXES (ANNUAL AND MONTHLY)

An Index to the Monthly catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the number as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

A monthly index of the principal subjects is to be found at the end of each issue of the Monthly catalog.

STATE DEPARTMENT

NOTE.—All publications of the Department (except laws, treaties, through Treaty series 994, and translations) have since Oct. 1, 1929, been numbered consecutively in the order in which they were sent to press. Publications of a similar character are brought within well-defined series, and each series publication bears a series number in addition to its publication number. The diplomatic correspondence of the United States is published in the volumes entitled *Foreign relations of the United States*. Laws are first published in slip form in separate series (public and private) and are numbered within each series in the order in which they become law; they are later published in bound form in the United States Statutes at large. The Department of State publications entitled Treaty series and Executive agreement series have been discontinued. The Treaties and other international acts series has been inaugurated to make available in a single series the texts of treaties and other instruments (such as constitutions and charters of international organizations, declarations, agreements effected by exchanges of diplomatic notes, et cetera) establishing or defining relations between the United States of America and other countries. The texts printed in the present series, as in the Treaty series and Executive agreement series, are authentic and, in appropriate cases, are certified as such by the Department of State. The Treaties and other international acts series begins with the number 1501, the combined numbers in the Treaty series and Executive agreement series having reached 1500, the last number in the Treaty series being 994 and the last number in the Executive agreement series being 506. Spanish, Portuguese, and French translations, prepared by the Department's Central Translating Division, have their own publication numbers, running consecutively from 1. The Department of State Bulletin published weekly and indexed semiannually as of the dates of the last issues in June and December, contains the texts of the daily mimeographed press releases, information regarding treaties, and other material on the Department's work. The Bulletin contains each quarter a complete list of the Department's publications for the preceding quarter.
