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Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g., mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS—FOLLOWS CONTENTS

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., is authorized by law to sell copies of Government publications and to allow a discount of 25 percent to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter (the 25-percent discount to dealers does not apply to the Congressional record, Federal register, Supreme Court reports, Catalog of copyright entries, and Climatological data for United States, which may, however, be sold by dealers at a price in advance of that charged by this Office).

Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 458, 75-3.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

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Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington,

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No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Newfoundland (including Labrador), Panama, or Venezuela. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

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The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check List of United States Public Documents, 1789-1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a : So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23^a : So 96⁴ in a library.

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

NEW PERIODICALS

The Director of the Bureau of the Budget has recently approved the publication in printed form of several periodicals which have been previously issued in processed form or printed outside the Government with non-Government funds. One such publication, *The Woman Worker*, has been received for the March 1938 Monthly Catalog. The others will be noted as the first printed numbers come from the press. *The Woman Worker*, *Women's Bureau News Letter*, begins with v. 18, no. 1, and is dated January 1938. The first 17 volumes were processed, the initial numbers being designated *The News Letter* and continued under the title *Activities Affecting Gainfully Employed Women*. The volume and number have not appeared on all the issues. In its printed form it will be issued every 2 months, averaging not more than 16 pages per issue. Through *The Woman Worker*, the Women's Bureau will assist State authorities, officials of labor organizations and women's organizations, and others planning policies and developing programs to advance the welfare of women workers. The Bureau reports and popular material contained in its pages will serve also an important need in their wide use for workers' education, for high schools and colleges, and for grade schools as well. Every effort will be made to bring together in convenient and readable form such current information as will be useful to labor unions, women's clubs, State and local labor department officials, and others interested in keeping informed on the rapidly changing status of the woman wage earner. *The Woman Worker* is obtainable from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., at 25c. per year, subscription rate, and 5c. single copy. The foreign subscription is 35c.

ARTICLES BY GOVERNMENT WORKERS APPEARING IN OUTSIDE PUBLICATIONS

The results of the valuable scientific work and research of Government workers would, many times, not be recorded in printed or even processed form, due to the lack of funds for their issuance under Government auspices, were it not for the fact that non-Government publishers are glad to have such authoritative articles for inclusion in their periodicals. Librarians and others interested may be glad to know that the National Bureau of Standards includes in its monthly *Technical News Bulletin* a list of such articles entitled *Recent Bureau Articles Appearing in Outside Publications*. The Agriculture Department issues a similar list in its processed publication *Agricultural Library Notes*, also a monthly publication. This latter list is given under the heading *Publications by U. S. Department of Agriculture Workers Appearing Outside the Department*. The Geological Survey and the Mines Bureau and other Government offices often cite such articles in their publications but they are not distinctly listed as such.

NOTE.—The 1937 issue of the Foreign commerce yearbook continues the series of annual compilations of foreign economic statistics inaugurated in 1922 and subsequently expanded and systematized. In its present form the purpose of the Yearbook is to provide in a single volume all the important basic statistical material essential for a comprehension of current economic developments in foreign countries. NOTE.—Many of the divisions of the Foreign and Domestic Commerce Bureau issue monthly statistical statements in processed form showing the exports or imports (and in some cases reexports) of various commodities. For convenience the statements issued by a division have been grouped in numerical order under the name of the issuing division. Except for the statements issued under the group number 1700, which contain only summary monthly statistics, the statements show the exports or imports of commodities in complete detail by countries, and in certain instances by customs districts as well. MARITIME COMMISSION

NOTE.—An agency to be known as the United States Maritime Commission was established under the provisions of H. R. 8555, 74th Congress (Public 835, approved June 29, 1936), to further the development and maintenance of an adequate and well-balanced American merchant marine, to promote the commerce of the United States, and to aid in the national defense. The same act dissolved the United States Shipping Board Merchant Fleet Corporation, directing that all records, etc., be taken over by the commission, and transferred all the functions, powers, and duties vested in the former United States Shipping Board (later the Shipping Board Bureau under the Commerce Department) to the United States Maritime Commission. It also transferred to and vested in the commission all the powers and duties now vested by law in the Postmaster General with respect to existing ocean-mail contracts.

Four of the publications listed below were prepared by the Maritime Commission, but since they belong to a volume of reports begun by the Shipping Board prior to the transfer of its functions to the Department of Commerce, the old classification, SB 1.10/a:, is retained in order that they may be filed with the other reports included in the volume.

The serial publications of the Smithsonian Institution are as follows: 1. Smithsonian contributions to knowledge; 2. Smithsonian miscellaneous collections; 3. Smithsonian annual reports. No *sets* of these are for sale or distribution, as most of the volumes are out of print. Special publications are also issued from time to time. The papers issued in the series of Contributions to knowledge and Miscellaneous collections are not public documents, but are printed in limited editions at the expense of the Smithsonian Fund. They are distributed without charge to public libraries, educational establishments, and learned societies in this country and abroad; and are supplied to other institutions, and to individuals at the prices indicated. Remittances should be made payable to the 'Smithsonian Institution.' A discount of 20 percent is allowed to bookdealers. The Smithsonian report volumes and the papers reprinted in separate form therefrom, are distributed *gratuitously* by the Institution to libraries and individuals throughout the world. Very few of the Report volumes are now available at the Institution, but many of those of which the Smithsonian edition is exhausted can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. The Institution maintains mailing-lists of public libraries and other educational establishments, but no *general mailing-list of individuals*. A library making application to be listed for Smithsonian publications should state the number of volumes which it contains and the date of its establishment, and have the endorsement of a Member of Congress." Although the annual reports are the only Smithsonian publications that are regularly issued as public documents, the others are usually regarded as such and have free transmission by mail, therefore they are listed in the Monthly catalog.

STATE DEPARTMENT

The list below frequently includes certain relevant publications issued by other agencies of the Government under requisition of the Department of State and certain relevant congressional documents.
