Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 62d Congress, 3d session, is to be understood.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals, **nor can they be forwarded in advance of payment.**

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions and, unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents give the name of the issuing Department, Bureau, or Division, and title. If publication is numbered give number also. Do not order by Library of Congress card number.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to over a million, of which several hundred thousand are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that many of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

No general price-list of public documents is available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indices. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the

number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and 10c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. **Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress.** Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

CUMULATIVE INDEX

Beginning with July, 1912, the Index to the Monthly catalogue will be issued semiannually instead of quarterly, as heretofore, and will cumulate for the twelve months ending June, 1913. That is, the December number will be an Index to the Monthly catalogue for July to December, 1912, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1913. Persons desiring to bind the catalogue at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate numbers can not be supplied.

HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, by postal money order, express order, or New York draft. Currency may be sent at sender's risk.

Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins will positively not be accepted.

To facilitate the payment of the cost of documents, the Superintendent of Documents will hereafter accept coupons issued by him instead of cash. Coupons of the value of 5 cents each are sold in sets of 20 for \$1.00. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

When Congress placed in the Panama Canal act of Aug. 24, 1912, a provision amending sec. 4132, Revised statutes, by providing that "materials" for "construction or repair" of "vessels," and "articles" for their "outfit and equipment," may be imported free of duty under regulations to be prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury, it became necessary to supply exact definitions for such general terms as "vessels," "materials," "articles," and "outfit and equipment." Such definitions having been framed, it was necessary to name certain other "materials" and "articles" which might not enter free. Then followed provisions for procedure to ensure that the imported "materials" should actually be used in "construction and repair" and not merely kept in stock for sale; and similar safeguards as to "articles" for "outfit and equipment." All of these and other necessary specifications are found in Treasury decision 32956, bearing date Nov. 25, 1912. These regulations, and sec. 5 of the Panama Canal act (Public 337, 62d Congress), by which they are authorized, supersede the provisions of sections 19 and 20 of the Payne-Aldrich act of Aug. 5, 1909.

Labor Bureau Bulletin 106, part 2, is also Retail prices and cost of living series no. 2, part 2, and its special individual title is Retail prices, 1890 to June, 1912, part 2. It is a pamphlet of more than 200 pages, containing actual statistics gathered from 39 of the principal industrial cities of this country, giving the cost by months of 18 staple articles of food and per cent. of increase or decrease in cost, with various comparisons. A valuable reference book for economists. 15 cents.

Medical handbook for the use of the Revenue-Cutter Service, issued by the Treasury Department, has been prepared primarily for use on vessels to which no surgeon is regularly attached. It is explained, however, at the beginning, that written directions can only imperfectly supply the place of the physician and surgeon, and it is advised that in all cases of serious sickness or injury medical assistance should be obtained as soon as possible. There can be no doubt, however, that the plain and easy instructions given, accompanied as they are by equally plain drawings, will be found useful, even at times to the saving of life. Cloth, 30 cents.

Treasury decision 32975, dated Nov. 30, 1912, calls attention to the law which prohibits the importation of white phosphorus matches after Jan. 1, 1913, and their exportation after Jan. 1, 1914.

Most of us say parcels post, but the official name, as fixed by the Post Office Department, is parcel post, without an "s" on the end of the first word. The Post Office Department has issued Parcel post regulations, a pamphlet for the information of the postal service and the public, to be obtained only from the Department.

Technologic paper 11, Standards Bureau, is Comparison of five methods used to measure hardness. Price, 5 cents.

The official reports of the First national mine-safety demonstration, at Pittsburgh, Oct. 30 and 31, 1911, with chapter on explosion at the experimental mine, Oct. 30, 1911, being Bulletin 44, Mines Bureau, has been reprinted in a 2d edition. Price, 15 cents.

House document 1158, 62d Congress, 3d session, is the Annual report of the National Forest Reservation Commission for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1912. This is the commission which has \$2,000,000 a year for five years for the creation of forest reserves in the Appalachian and White mountains for the protection of the headwaters of navigable streams. The commission reports that thus far it has bought 257,288 acres at an average price of \$5.95 an acre, the lowest price paid having been \$1.16 and the highest \$15. The intention is to acquire some 5,000,000 or 6,000,000 acres in all.

Entomology Bureau Bulletin 97 is to be issued as a whole, having been previously issued in seven parts under as many titles. The general title for the bulletin as a whole is *Papers on deciduous fruit insects and insecticides*. Title-page, contents, index, and lists of illustrations, errata, and addenda have been provided for the completed bulletin and have also been separately printed for the use of those who have the separate parts.

Opinions of the Solicitor for the Commerce and Labor Department dealing with workmen's compensation under the act of Congress granting to certain employees of the United States the right to receive from it compensation for injuries sustained in the course of their employment, approved May 30, 1908, from Aug. 1908 to Aug. 1912, is the comprehensive title of a clothbound volume of 646 pages recently published. It shows that more action has been taken under this new law for the compensation of Government employees for injuries sustained in the line of duty than is generally known. From Aug. 1, 1908, when the law first became effective, to Dec. 1, 1911, compensation was paid in 5,564 cases of injury, 165 of which were fatal. To the dependents of the men killed \$112,879.02 was paid, and to those who survived their injuries was paid \$704,814.60. Certain limitations in the act have prevented compensation in many cases. Supplementary legislation extending the scope of the act has been recommended by the Secretary of Commerce and Labor. This was listed in the Monthly catalogue for November, 1912, page 224.

Senate document 958, 62d Congress, 3d session, listed with the publications of the Senate in this catalogue, is with little doubt the most severe and sweeping indictment of the alcohol habit ever officially published by the Government. The author is Col. L. M. Maus of the Medical Corps of the Army and his paper was first delivered as an address at the meeting of the Association of Military Surgeons in Washington, Oct. 2, 1912, and was later published in the *Journal of the Military Service Institution*. Its subsequent publication as a Senate document apparently gives it a double official sanction. Col. Maus maintains that the most modern investigations and conclusions demonstrate that alcohol in all quantities and at all times is a poison and only a poison. He avers: "After a careful study of alcohol as a beverage and as a medicine, I have been unable to discover one single beneficial or useful purpose it serves in the human economy." He advocates the prohibition of the use of alcohol in any form in the Army, the Navy, and the Revenue-Cutter Service. 5 cents.

Some types of children's garden work is the title, and Miss Susan B. Sipe is the author, of Bulletin 252, Experiment Stations Office. If those interested in the training of children want an admirable textbook, here it is. Its text is illustrated by pictures and by outlines of courses in nature study and in agriculture. Price, 15 cents.

Soils Bureau Bulletin 85, *A study of the soils of the United States*, is not offered as an exhaustive exposition, but as a contribution to the treatment of a large and difficult subject. The soil, from which man's sustenance is wholly drawn, is only a thin veneer over the rock formations which compose the substance of the globe to whose surface we cling as it flies through space at

inconceivable speed. In the words of the bulletin, "The soil may therefore be considered as the superficial, unconsolidated mantle of disintegrated and more or less decomposed rock material, which, acted upon by organic agencies and mixed with varying amounts of organic matter, may furnish conditions necessary for the growth of plants. In this medium profound physical, chemical, and biological changes are constantly taking place." Price, 25 cents.

Plant Industry Bureau Circular 103, Ramie, treats this notable fiber plant with more friendliness than it received 15 or 20 years ago when Mr. S. H. Slaughter was giving up his life to the promotion of his favorite fiber. Price, 5 cents.

Special consular reports 54 discusses Foreign trade in canned goods. It is a compilation of reports from several American consuls abroad. Though the United States is probably the greatest producer of canned food, the foreign trade is not all that could be desired. The high price of the American goods is the reason assigned. Price, 15 cents.

Profitable and fruitless lines of endeavor in public health work, by E. O. Jordan, professor of bacteriology in the University of Chicago, is reprinted in the Smithsonian Institution's Annual report for 1911 and also in a pamphlet.

Table of commodities in the Decisions of the Interstate Commerce Commission, 1906-12, vols. 12-23, has been prepared by the commission's Division of Indexes and published at 15 cents.

Farmers' bulletin 516, The production of maple sirup and sugar, published by the Chemistry Bureau, is a most complete treatise on this subject. It supersedes Farmers' bulletin 252 and Forest Service Bulletin 59. It shows that New York State is the largest producer of this incomparable sweet, Ohio the 2d, Vermont 3d, Pennsylvania 4th, Michigan 5th, Indiana 6th, and New Hampshire 7th. The maple production of all the other States may be represented by zero. The aggregate production amounts to about \$5,000,000 a year. The price of Bulletin 516 is the same as that of all the other Farmers' bulletins, namely, 5 cents.

Public health bulletin 58, Open air schools for the prevention and cure of tuberculosis among children, supplies this summing-up: "In the outdoor school is found one of the cheapest, simplest, and most efficient remedies for the cure and prevention of tuberculosis among children. It is beyond the stage of experiment and is recognized as one of the standard remedies." Several plates and diagrams are shown. Price, 15 cents.

An advance circular of the Chemistry Bureau, numbered 108, gives the recommendations of referees and the committees appointed at the 1912 Convention of the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists. Like all the circulars of the bureaus of the Agriculture Department, no. 108 is sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 5 cents.

Vol. 13 of the 19-volume Report on the condition of women and child wage-earners in the United States, in course of publication by the Labor Bureau, has just been issued. The specific title of this volume is Infant mortality and its relation to the employment of mothers. It will doubtless be considered one of the most important and suggestive investigations in the series. 15 cents.

Appendix 34 to the Annual report of the Attorney General to Congress is a list of the cases which had been brought before the Commerce Court prior to Nov. 1, 1912, showing the present status of such cases. This appendix has also been printed in a separate pamphlet.

Taxation of corporations, part 4. Western Central States, has been issued by the Commissioner of Corporations, in a pamphlet sold by the Superintendent

of Documents at 15 cents. The systems of taxation of the States of Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas, and Missouri are described.

OVER A MILLION SOLD

The 18th Annual report of the Superintendent of Documents shows that his sales of documents for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1912, passed the million mark for the first time, the exact figures being 1,039,214 and the cash total \$109,581.21. To the old question, "Who will buy public documents?" the correct answer seems to be, "Everybody." No statement is given in the report as to the buyers, but it may be said in general terms that not only are they found in every part of this country, but also in Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, South America, and the isles of the sea.

PARCEL POST GUIDE

The Guide is a quarto pamphlet of 395 pages for use in connection with the parcel post map. The map is of little or no use without the Guide, and the Guide is of little or no use without the map. There are 3500 variations of the map, but only one Guide, and that one will fit any one of the 3500 maps.

The Guide is simply an alphabetical list of the 3500 units of area, tabulated in such a way that by using the map and the Guide in conjunction any one may readily ascertain the cost of postage on packages of any weight (within the limit) to and from any points.

Maps and Guides are sold by the Post Office Department at 20 cents for the map, 55 cents for the Guide, 75 cents for both.

MAP PRICES INCREASED

The United States Geological Survey has announced, taking effect Jan. 1, 1913, an increase of 100 per cent. in the prices of most of the items in its map list. The topographic sheets, formerly sold by the Survey at 5 cents for single copies and \$3.00 a hundred, are now 10 cents for single numbers and \$6.00 a hundred. The new rate obtains for nearly the whole list, the doubling up being general. Even at that, the new rates are far below commercial prices for maps of similar quality.

The most notable exception to the general scale of increase is the folios (atlases) of the Geologic atlas of the United States, which are sold by the Superintendent of Documents as well as by the Geological Survey. The rates for these folios, now numbering nearly 200, remain unchanged. The prices for the library edition of these small atlases, 18 by 22 inches, is 25 cents except for a few numbers of exceptional size, which are 50 cents each. There is also a so-called field edition of Folio 164 and the later numbers so put up as to be more convenient of carriage. In this edition each folio costs 25 cents more than in the library edition.

OFFICIAL GAZETTE

Though the demand for the weekly numbers of the Official gazette of the United States Patent Office continually increases, the demand for bound volumes of that periodical remains so light that it is thought not worth while longer to issue a bound edition. It has therefore been discontinued. The last of the monthly bound volumes is for November, 1912. Title-pages, indexes, and other "apparatus," enabling subscribers to have their sets of numbers properly bound, will be supplied as heretofore.

A NOTABLE TERM OF PUBLIC SERVICE

The 16th annual report of James Wilson, Secretary of Agriculture, was published during December. It is remarkable for the record of unparalleled agricultural growth and prosperity which it brings and still more remarkable because of the fact that it is the report that marks the close of the longest term of Cabinet service in American history.

Mr. Wilson was called to the Cabinet by President McKinley at the beginning of his first term, Mar. 4, 1897, and by successive reappointments by Presidents McKinley, Roosevelt, and Taft has remained in continuous service to the present time, and if he remains to Mar. 4 next will complete 16 full years of Cabinet service. The next longest unbroken term of the head of an executive department is that of Albert Gallatin, a naturalized citizen, born in Switzerland, who served as Secretary of the Treasury under Presidents Jefferson and Madison, May 14, 1801, to April 17, 1813—almost 12 years.

Secretary Wilson's 16th report shows that wonderful progress has been made in agricultural production during his prolonged term of office. The year 1912 has been the most productive in the history of American agriculture. The grand total of values of agricultural production for the year is estimated at \$9,532,000,000. It is more than twice the value of the production of 1899 as shown by the returns of the 12th census. During the last 16 years the aggregate value of agricultural products is given as exceeding the almost inconceivable sum of 105 billions.

The growth of the Department over which Secretary Wilson has so long and so successfully presided is almost as remarkable as the growth of agricultural production under the stimulus of the Department's publications by which knowledge of the results of its researches has been spread broadcast over the land. In the words of the Secretary himself: "Sixteen years have been of interest in the history of this Department. Bureaus have been created and expanded. Lines of research, investigation, and demonstration have been multiplied. Congress has piled duty on duty from year to year. The corps of experts needed in the increasing amount and variety of service has grown greatly. The Department has become a great agricultural university for postgraduate work." At the beginning of the 16 years term the number of workers in the Department was 2,444. July 1, 1912, the number had increased to 13,858. For the fiscal year 1898 the appropriations for the maintenance of the Department amounted to \$3,272,902. For the fiscal year 1913 they are \$24,743,044.

SOMETHING NEW UNDER THE SUN

For several years the Monthly catalogue force has been pondering over public documents, considering their somewhat numerous peculiarities and wonderful diversities, until it has seemed that all possible shifts and combinations had passed in kaleidoscopic procession through these pages. Such seeming was too hasty. Something new has appeared. It is the plan of publication of the Abstract of the thirteenth census. Heretofore it has been the most usual practice of the various census directors to issue a so-called Compendium, which has been a rather full summary of the census statistics (once it was in three volumes), and also an Abstract, which was a much smaller summary. This Abstract has usually been the publication most numerous printed for popular distribution. The issue of both a Compendium and an Abstract in addition to the final volumes in which the same statistics were given in more elaborated and complete form has always seemed like unnecessary duplication, and it is not now to be the programme. The Compendium is not to be

issued, but the Abstract is made much larger than usual; as large, in fact, as the customary Compendium, and filling 564 large quarto pages, thus serving as Compendium and Abstract in one. Probably this plan will be generally voted an improvement, as doing away with an unnecessary duplication.

This, however, while a new departure, is not the remarkable new method that is likely to arrest attention and cause wondering comment. The really new and before unthought of plan is that adopted for the publication of the Abstract. It is, to be sure, to be issued, as heretofore, simply as an Abstract, but this is but one of its numerous forms. It is to have 52 other editions, all alike in the first 564 pages, which will contain the Abstract itself, but all different in the fact that each of the 52 editions will have a Supplement of its own, differing from all of the other 51 supplements. Of course the statistics of all the States will be given in the Abstract. But the statistics of each State are separately and more fully given in a Supplement, and each of these Supplements is to be made a part of a special edition of the Abstract. That is to say, there will be distinct editions of the Abstract for each of the 48 States and for Alaska, District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Porto Rico, 52 different kinds of Abstract, all alike except as to their Supplements, which will all be different. The first edition issued is that for the State of Maine, which has 643 pages, 564 being Abstract and the remainder the Maine Supplement. The paging is made continuous, including the Abstract and the Supplement in one numerical arrangement.

Thus the number of copies of the Abstract printed will be very large and of each of the Supplements comparatively small. Provision has, however, been made for supplying the State supplements as separate pamphlet publications. It is probable that many persons who do not care for the Abstract may wish the Supplements relating to their own States, and that there will be a considerable demand for pamphlet editions. The Final reports and the Abstract without a Supplement will be sent to the depository libraries.

The Abstract is to be considered one of the set of final volumes, and there will be 11 other final volumes, vols. 1-4 carrying the population statistics, vols. 5-7 the agricultural statistics, vols. 8-10 the statistics of manufactures, and vol. 11 those of mines and quarries. Of these, only vol. 9, reports on manufactures by States, with statistics of principal cities, has thus far been issued. It is a ponderous quarto tome of 1404 pages. The statistics are those of the production of manufactures for the calendar year 1909, as gathered by the census enumerators during 1910.
